GTHHSC Monthly Networking Meeting. 12/19/06, 9:00am, Associates for Human Services

#### **Discussion Highlights:**

Advocate Newsletter – The 160 hard copy mailing list has been cut in half due to broadcasting copies in both Word and Acrobat to members with email addresses.

## Committee Reports beyond the December Advocate:

- **Taunton Emergency Task** Force Fund raiser by Senator Pacheco. Representative Fagan, Bella Roma Restaurant and the Taunton Mayors Office has brought in \$7,239 so far with another \$1000 expected. ProHome donated \$1000 and another \$1600 was received anonymously. The TETF is working with the homeless coalition on what happens to homeless individuals when the weather drops to subzero freezing. - SARTXII **Planning Meeting** – Keynote speaker is Laurie Turkovsky. Tracy Desovich will participate on the adult panel. Carol is contacting area businesses and major corporations with 50 and 100 clubs for youth prize incentives under a "From your Hearts" theme February. Student breakout groups will do a mini social norms project; adults will have a Social Norms 101.

GTHHSC Annual Meeting / CHNA Kick Off - Associates for Human Services is hosting the first of the quarterly CHNA steering committee meetings on January 16, 2007 at 10:30am. Two representatives from each committee or coalition invited to attend. This will provide a good opportunity to share and receive data to pull in more funding for the good work groups. Agenda that suggestions include a 2-3 minute overview of each coalition/committee including data, Where do we go from here?, a discussion of the agenda for the next quarterly meeting of the CHNA, a name for the CHNA, and a schedule for future quarterly meetings.

United Way Focus Groups -Several Coalition members attended community focus groups. The United Way is planning to host monthly networking meetings of funded organizations at their location, along with new steering committee and subcommittees. It was suggested that our groups collaborate in order to avoid duplication. Ron will contact Diane and Marilyn about the new CHNA structure for further discussions.

#### Pathways to Hope Radio Show

 Agencies are invited to get their word and messages out about services through Dan LeBrun's radio show. "Pathways" has been moved to a good time slot on Tuesdays from 11:00-Noon. It also is rebroadcast on Sundays. Many seniors listen, and pass the information on to their families. He hopes that by the end of January the show will be booked through June. An invitation was extended to Carol to speak about the upcoming Substance Abuse Round Table

A.H.S. Advisory meetings feature issues effecting families. On March 1 the focus will be on persons other than biological parents raising children. Many of these have trouble accessing services. Suggested groups to invite include Bristol Elder. Legal Services. Adoption Journeys, Intergeneration information **Bristol** from Community College, facilitators from Councils on Aging, PACE or Commonwealth Childcare. Department of Transitional Assistance, Department of Social Services, Adoption program, Guiding Good Choices, Rhode Island's grandparent program, elected officials and Department of Human Services.

Donation in Memory of Vince Eagles - Carol will check expenses and intake from the annual meeting to make a donation in memory of Vince Eagles. A motion was followed by the unanimous decision that we donate \$100 from the GTHHSC.

Substance Abuse Committee has increased collaboration with several funded projects: entertainment and tobacco funding requests, Getting the Word Out, Project YELL, the Community Care Services Tobacco Grant, etc.

Internet Safety Trainings – Young people put too much information on the internet that allows predators to easily contact them. Police and School departments have been trained in internet safety. A program about kids helping kids was held at the Boys and Girls club, and will be held at Taunton middle schools.

### GTHHSC Substance Abuse Committee (SAC). 12/20/06, 3:30, CCBC

#### <u>Discussion Highlights:</u> **Project YELL**:

The American Drug and Alcohol Survey (ADAS) was administered at Taunton High School this morning. Thus far, about <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of the 1869 surveys were returned. Good feedback was received from the teachers, and although teachers and students were told the survey was voluntary, all but 1 teacher administered the survey, and most students cooperated. It included 10 perception questions for the social norms campaign.

Carry Over Budget – Carol has been working on the carry over budget from the \$65,000+ remaining from last year. A letter and budget will be sent to the project officer and financial person in Washington. The letter was read and the budget explained. It will allow Project YELL to complete the goals of grant. Several changes happened during the time of defunding, such as the youth coordinator

position. The budget request for carry over is to increase the vouth coordinator's and peer leaders' hours and continue the summer work. Peer leaders will have plenty to do over the summer, such as prevention programs and the Boys and Girls clubs, and 2 youth summits (MADD Power Summit and SADD National Conference). Other uses of the carry over money will allow an increase in the youth coordinator's mileage allowance, a laptop and color printer, T-shirts for youth staff, an increase in office supplies and coalition postage, social norms consultant, graphic designer, web design, Guiding Good Choices expansion, strategic planning, work with MADD, SARTXII, staff shirts, a banner, parent program snacks, etc. All requested monies will matched from sources such as community donations to the SARTXII, school liaison time, a college intern time, etc. Further suggestions from the committee

included expanding the marketing campaign messages with additional poster printing, send committee members to the social norms conference in Cambridge, etc. as updated on the shared spreadsheet. Once complete, Deb Brown motioned to accept the letter and funding request as revised by committee. April Cabrera seconded the motion, vote was unanimous in favor.

**Substance Abuse Round Table** IX - A grant was submitted to the United Way for \$2500. They suggested we add the Attleboro and North Attleboro YMCA teen groups in the planning meeting. Kathy will follow up and invite them and gage interest. The committee is willing to rotate locations to accommodate an expanded membership. Kathy contacted the Chamber Commerce about doing presentation for prize donations for vouth attending the SARTXII. That not being

customary, she offered to share a letter from the planning group with the chamber and possibly print it in their February newsletter. Also contacted for inkind donations to the SART were businesses on the auto mile and the Bristol-Plymouth High School for printing invitations, agendas and other documents for the April 12<sup>th</sup> event.

Community Care Services Tobacco Program – DPH funded Tobacco planning grant starts 1/1/07. The agency has already held a meeting internally. The goal of the 18 month grant is to come up with a community intervention. The ADAS survey from today will provide fresh data that this project will use.

Get the Word Out Tobacco Grant – Work has begun on this \$10,000 grant. Peer leaders are doing a report card on tobacco ads in stores, which are not supposed to be near candy or toys, or be self serve. Some store managers are not complying. The report cards will be brought

to the store to show how they did on compliance to the tobacco advertising laws. Youth received information on the dangers of tobacco and how tobacco industry sponsors events for young people and make candy flavor cigarettes. Although the industry claims these are not geared to youth, these flavors have a strong appeal to youth. Peer leaders also did a survey on the frequency of signs of tobacco use between the Boys and Girls Club and the YMCA (Cigarette buts, tobacco logos on shirts, tobacco ads in gas stations.) They also had a presence in the Christmas parade. Before conducting surveys at tobacco selling businesses, the manager will be informed of what the teens are doing. This project addresses how they sell, not to whom they sell.

Get the Word Out High School Grant – SADD and other students are collecting data and will utilize teen topics for second hand smoke in smoking prevention presentations during Freshman Science

#### GTHHSC/CHNA Kick Off -

The committee selected 2 SAC representatives to attend the January Steering Committee. Committee members will rotate attendance for fresh ideas and to share the burden. Ken Mayer and Arlene Dickinson will attend the first with Jonathan as alternate.

United Way Needs Assessment Groups – Committee members attended the community focus groups to ensure that substance abuse issues were included. There are still surveys available.

#### **Discussion Highlights:**

Criminal Justice Committee - Fast track has 13 adults, no juveniles. Committee will be working on next year's goals.

Community Crisis Intervention Team has scheduled a training for May 2007; 10 have already registered. They are also working on a training for juvenile probation.

Treatment and Prevention Committee - Project Yell has been working on tobacco and alcohol prevention trainings and participated in the Christmas Parade with a 'Blow bubbles not smoke' campaign. Surveys will be distributed to THS students. Substance Abuse Roundtable planning is going well. (See SAC minutes above)

Community Crisis Spiritual Response Team - Lisa was thanked for her assistance in accessing new computers to replace those that were stolen.

**Education Committee** - Due to SNI, synergy has developed among the 3 high schools in Taunton. They share crisis plans, safety procedures and

information on student programs. They may be working together on Key Club and National Honor Society members from the 3 schools.

- A sergeant has been working with the Middle Schools.
- Neighborhood Watch meetings are very informative.

- The Youth Court Program will be starting soon. It is an alternative to suspension and will hold the youth accountable for their actions.
- The SNI Annual Meeting will be held on February 14.
- The number of participants at Neighborhood Watch meetings has increased.

- The after school transportation program to the

### Southeastern Massachusetts Voices Against Violence. 12/21/06, 5:00, MassInfotech

#### **Discussion Highlights:**

2007 National Crime Victims Rights Week is April 22-28. There will also be a focus on sexual assault awareness in Attleboro and Taunton. No dates for the Clothesline Project are confirmed as yet. New Hope will be cooperatively supported with materials and displays in their library presentations.

Workshops - The OBC grant is out, and could provide funds for workshops before April. Ideas of venues include Taunton and Norton Libraries, First Parish Church. This can be enlightening and awareness raising among the general public, letting them know about New Hope.

**Take Back the Night** will be observed at Stonehill College and other area colleges.

Dress to Impress continues to grow. Commercial clothes racks were received from Formans. Although there has been lots of clothing donated, they will go fast. Intake of items such as sizes 0-4X, men's clothing of all sizes, boxes of shoes needing polishing, pocketbooks and belts continues. A potluck brunch will be held on 12/30/06, 10:30-1:00, anyone interested volunteering their time for being on call a few hours a month, or

helping someone to pick out clothing. A steady supply of volunteers will be needed in January to help sort and size clothing. Also needed are a local cleaner and a laundry brigade to freshen up the clothing. The Bristol County Savings Bank Charitable Foundation funding will cover 7 months rent and \$400 for miscellaneous purchases and repairs.

Verizon Wireless Hopeline Cell Phones Project continues to collect donations.

Through My Eyes: Voices Against Violence deadline for submissions is 2/28/07. All ages may submit personal stories, poetry and artwork.

United Way Needs Assessment – Committee members attended focus group meetings.

National Teen Dating Violence Awareness – The 2006 tool kit has signs, how teachers can include the subject in the curriculum, and is different from the National Crime Victims Rights Week manual. A DVD is also available. Annemarie will approach the press to convince the area's major publications to do a series on teen violence at the end of January, or February 5-9. Annemarie will make an informational handout for distribution.

#### **Fund Raising**

- ➤ **Donation letters** will be set out to all committee members, requesting a \$25.00 donation.
- Town-Line Redemption account has been set up. A flyer will be sent out.

Homelessness - GATCH meetings will be held at CCBC in Taunton. The meetings are the 2nd Tuesday of each month at 1:30pm. The shelter subcommittee meetings will also be held at CCBC, 1:30 on the 1st Tuesday of each month. Ten year plan to end chronic homelessness will be discussed.

CFC-Fuel Assistance - Rental property is now counted as income. You now have to show how you are surviving and paying rent. A letter has to be notarized or come from the appropriate agency. If client is eligible for fuel assistance he can apply for citizens' energy. Letters have been sent out to clients who are already receiving fuel assistance.

#### **SouthShore Housing Family Self-Sufficiency Program**

- Families have to have a section eight voucher through SouthShore Housing
- Families are linked with services
- Education and training programs

- > 5 year contract with HUD
- Once families increase their skills and pay more money in rent, money is put in an account for the families
- ➤ 2000 vouchers through SouthShore Housing
- Meetings held in the Taunton area
- SouthShore Housing also develops affordable housing, homeownership center, first-time home ownership, housing rehab, and RAFT.

**TEMA** - There was a fire in a 3 family Bay Street home in Taunton on 12/29/06. Red Cross responded right away. Vouchers were given to the families to stay in hotels. Red Cross will help with the first and last month rent.

Holiday Donations - Julia thanked the Taunton community for generous donations during the holiday season. She suggested reexamining the emergency food services in the Taunton area.

Associates for Human Services serves families with children up to age 3. Parent support groups are also available. Openings will be coming up.

**Transitional Housing Program** 

There are currently 6 families in the program, 3 families signed leases with the Taunton Housing Authority during the month of December and 2 families should be in by the end of the month.

#### **Department of Mental Health**

Emergency services are available 24/7 in the Taunton area.

- ➤ Passes will allow children ages 8-11 from Dewert Ave. to attend the Boys and Girls Club after school. Eventually transportation will be provided from Highland Court and Paul Bunker Drive.
- Working on grants for software to improve case management.
