Profile

Yak Aik Wee is a multi-disciplinary artist who graduated with Distinction from LASALLE-SIA College of the Arts, with a Music Diploma majoring in Composition. His studies there were supported by the National Arts Council (Georgette Chen Arts Scholarships).

Prior to his music studies, he served as an Artiste with the Singapore Armed Forces Music and Drama Company (SAF MDC), performing extensively locally as well as at overseas deployments like Australia, Taiwan, Indonesia, Thailand and Brunei. As actor and dancer, he has appeared in various theatre and television productions, including Toy Factory's *Guys and Dolls*, Music and Movement's and MDC's *Kampong Amber*, TCS's *Growing Up*, and Tammy L Wong Dance Company's *Child*.

His compositions have been performed publicly since his first year at LASALLE-SIA, beginning with The Philharmonic Winds' Local Composers' Concert 2001 and The Esplanade's Music Box 2001. Besides being featured at concerts, his music is also being used within other mediums of theatre, dance, film and visual art.

Recent performances of his work include original music for SPH Writer's Lab and TheatreWorks' *A Beautiful Companion*. He is currently researching on techniques to further integrate the different disciplines of music, dance and theatre. Future projects include music for *Subtext ii*, a modern-dance piece to be performed at Utterly Art Gallery in October 2006, and and a musical to be launched in 2007.

Music Performance Notes

In October 2006, The Esplanade presented 5 independent choreographers in a show for the **Little Asia Dance Exchange Network 2005**. This year's participants came from Korea, Japan, Hong Kong, Taiwan and Singapore. Aik-Wee composed the music for Singapore's representative, Joavien Ng in her piece *Victoria*. This piece went on to tour the 5 above-mentioned countries.

The One-Sided Wall, a play produced by LASALLE-SIA and Samantha Scott-Blackhall, and performed by the 3rd-year Theatre Arts students. The soundtrack for this one-hour production consisted of over 30 sound cues, and were executed from 2 CD players.

In July 2005, a 30-minute neo-classical suite was composed for *GHOST*, an interdisciplinary performance project produced by **Crow Jane aka Joavien Ng**. *GHOST* was a collaborative effort between different art forms created with Joavien Ng, Choy Ka Fai, Helmi Fita, Ebelle Chong, Neo Hong Chin and Yak Aik-Wee.

Music was composed for 3 modern dance pieces featured in *FireBall 2005*, a showcase for dance and interdisciplinary art organised by **Ecnad Project** in April 2005. Aik-Wee wrote music for choreographers Joavien Ng, Ming Poon (Europe-based) and Kon Su Sam, their pieces all of which were favourably highlighted in subsequent reviews. **Peacock & Chandrabhaga**, were commissioned by classical Indian dancer, Raka Maitra. Based on original traditional accompaniments, these two pieces were incorporated as part of her solo recital; "Mistique of India", which was performed at Montgomery Performing Arts Centre, Washington, in June 2001. Mistique of India was organised by **IDEA** – Indian Dance Educators Association.

Peacock was later released on **CNET Music**, where it garnered an "Editor's Review". This piece was also used on Here On Earth, an internet radio show based in the United States. Till date, *Peacock* has been downloaded over 7,000 times.

Nocturne premiered on 8 April 2001 at Singapore Art Museum as part of **Music Box Festival 2001**, which was organised by The Esplanade and National Arts Council. *Nocturne* was then selected from among the participants in this festival to perform at the **The President's Young Talents Exhibition** on 11 April 2001. We had the honour of performing for the President of Singapore, His Excellency, S.R Nathan on this occasion. These two performances were performed by members from The Philharmonic Winds.
