Dr. Ram Jeet Sharma took over as new Dean of College of Veterinary and Animal Sciences, Govind Ballabh Pant University of Agriculture and Technology, Pantnagar on August 01, 2005. Born on July 05, 1948 in District Aligarh (Uttar Pradesh), Dr. Sharma started his professional journey in 1965 as a B.V.Sc. & A.H. student of the then

College of Veterinary Medicine of this University and obtained the degree in 1969. Thereafter he was selected as Veterinary Assistant Surgeon in January 1970 but his inclination towards academics coerced him to join M.V.Sc. (Dairy Husbandry) which he obtained in 1972 and joined his Alma-matter as Assistant Extension Specialist (Animal Breeding) in the same year. He was then selected as Subject Matter Specialist (Animal Breeding) in 1974. Dr. Sharma obtained his Ph.D. degree in Animal Breeding in 1983 and was selected as Associate Professor, Animal Breeding in 1986. He joined Hill Campus, Ranichauri as Senior Research Officer (Livestock Management) in same year and College of Veterinary Sciences, Pantnagar as Professor, Livestock Production and Management in 1996.

In recognition of his academic excellence he has been conferred upon Dr. Rajendra Prasad Award twice (1985 and 1987) on his Hindi books. He successfully handled 07 externally funded and 04 university funded projects. Seven students have benefited from his able guidance. He has more than 30 research papers in national and international journals of repute, 05 books, 06 manuals, 06 booklets, 105 Hindi articles and 16 leaflet and folders to his credit besides conducting 43 training programmes.

His dynamic personality became visible when he took over as Joint Director, Instructional Dairy (IDF) and Poultry (IPF) Farms in 2002 and brought revolutionary changes in these units.

Fodder Bank established

A Fodder Bank has been established at Beni to meet-out the ever increasing demand of fodder in hill and bhabhar areas of the state during scarcity. The Bank was inaugurated by the Vice-Chancellor on Aug. 15. 2005. and was also visited by Chief Minister Sri N.D. Tiwari during his Pantnagar visit. The Bank is manufacturing and supplying Complete Feed Blocks and Urea Molasses *Mineral Blocks* at the rate of Rs. 4.16 and Rs. 27 per 2 kg respectively.

Seminar/Symposia/Workshops organized

1. A seminar on Developing Strategy for Livestock Development in Uttaranchal was organized from August 30-31, 2005 in collaboration with Watershed Management Project, Dehradun. The seminar was inaugurated and presided over by. Sri R.B.S.Rawat, Chief Project Director, Jalagam Project, Dehradun. Dr. H.C. Joshi, Member, Board of Management was guard of Honour on this occasion..

Welcoming the delegates Dr. R.J.Sharma, Dean, College of Veterinary and Animal Sciences, Pantnagar highlighted the achievements and contributions of the College towards livestock welfare, disease control, research and transfer of technology to end users. He emphasized that the Jalagam Project through Micro-watershed areas can play an important role in over all development and management of livestock. He assured the project every possible help in area of livestock development.

Dr. H.C. Joshi pointed out that number of new diseases and their outbreaks are seen and appealed the scientist to look in to the problem and find out the solutions.

Dr. P.L. Gautam, Vice-Chancellor, G.B.Pant University of Agriculture and Technology, Pantnagar, in his presidential address, briefed about the concept of Jalagam and its relationship in current situation of hills. He talked about the contribution of animal husbandry sector in the GDP, shortage of feed and fodder, day by day reducing pastures and low productivity and invited Jalagam team to discuss the issues with University scientists. He desired to formulate the long and short term programmes to over come these issues.

The workshop was attended by 50 scientists of College of Veterinary and Animal Sciences, College of Agriculture, College of Fisheries, College of Agri-Business Management, College of Technology and officers of Department of AH Uttaranchal, Uttaranchal Sheep and Wool Development Board and Watershed Management Project.

2. An interactive session on Industry-Farmer-Institution Interaction was organized at College of Veterinary and Animal Sciences with American Soybean Association and M/s S.P. Solvent Rudrapur on Dec. 22, 2005. The Workshop was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Vice-chancellor Dr. P. L. Gautam. The distinguished invitees on the occasion included Dr. Ramesh Thaper, Advisor, S. P. Solvent, Sri Bansidhar Bhagat, Ex- Minister of Animal

Husbandry, Uttaranchal and Smt. Manju Sanguri, Dy. Chairman Animal Welfare Board, Uttaranchal. Dr. Tilak Dhiman, Associate Professor, Department of Animal Dairy & Veterinary Sciences, Utha State University, America was the expert speaker. Dr. Dhiman elaborated about quality feeding and management of dairy animals in context of changing market scenario. He urged the scientists to educate the farmers about improved feeding and reducing unit cost of production. Dr. Gautam in his concluding remarks said that time has come to compete with quality and quantity of production. He apprised that country is going to have a contract with US Government to work in 5 areas of agricultural production, in which processing is one and asked Dr. Dhiman to establish a model project on dairy animal feeding at Pantnagar. He emphasized on need of quality nutrition particularly in Indian animals. Dean of the College, Dr. R. J. Sharma in his address narrated that though dairy farming is not a profitable venture but through better management it can be enhanced to a great extent. The faculty members of the College and progressive farmers also put their views on dairy farming and its profitability.

Animal Welfare Camps and Gosthis

Thirteen animal welfare camps and Pashupalak Goshthis were organized at different places in Uttaranchal in collaboration with KVK, Kashipur and Watershed Management, Dehradun. Animals suffering from various reproductive disorders and other disease ailments were treated in these camps. The livestock farmers were briefed by the scientists of the University about care and management of animals, disease control, internal and external parasites of dairy animals and animal reproduction.
