MO FOSTER **LIVE AT BLUES WEST 14**



Having kicked off with progressive iazz/rock

group Affinity in the mid-1960s – a group that effortlessly stand the test of time as shown by their currently available Origins album - Mo is now a highly respected bass player, producer, composer and author. On stage, he has worked with Jeff Beck, Phil Collins, Van Morrison, Dusty Springfield and George Martin, while his session credits include Gerry Rafferty, Ringo Starr,

Gil Evans, Gary Moore, Scott Walker and Peter Green amongst numerous very notable others. His numerous film sessions include For Your Eves Only. Octopussy and Revenge Of The Pink Panther, and this CD, recorded live in West London, displays a rare breadth and imagination in both the choice of material and the skill in which it is delivered. Cleverly piecing together a series of live performances, the atmospheric jazz fills the air and carries you away to a better place, thanks to the free-spirited performances of the brilliant Ralph Salmins, Gary Husband, Ray Russell and Ian Bellamy. Produced expertly by Nigel Stonier, and with support from Arts Council England, the core pairing of vocalist Sarah Springett and guitarist David Booth are joined by percussionist Simon Edgoose who adds punch to their acoustic, edgy reflections upon life and love. Start Again,

in particular, points a commercial way ahead for the Essex-based trio with Sarah's vocals proving especially appealing. Able to smoothly move from stripped-down fare (Hungry Someday) to a fuller anthemic style (Find What Lies), mainstream radio awaits. Extremely promising.

Tim Renwick Privateer

Sensational session guitarist turns his hand to songwriting

Tim is a consummate guitarist who has played with an incredible array of artists since making his initial mark with David Bowie circa Space Oddity, including Sutherland Bros & Quiver, Al Stewart, Lazy Racer, Elton John, Procul Harum, Mike Oldfield, Roger Waters, Eric Clapton and Pink Floyd. He has now written, recorded and produced a 13-track set of instrumentals, which vary from the melodic harmonic rock of Gridlock, to a classic and uplifting blues of *Blue Monday* with Alan Glen's superb harmonica to the fore. and the emotive acoustic-based Polly's Song. Also featuring a crack session team of Guy Pratt (bass) and Henry Spinetti (drums), the years of experience pour out to offer a work of depth and clarity with Tim's versatility and six-string mastery to the fore. *Musician* caught up with Tim as he worked on promotion for the album...

What is your earliest musical memory?

Going to concerts with my father, who played the double bass with Cambridge Symphony Orchestra. I played the clarinet then, switching to guitar at 14.

What was the first record you bought?

Jivin' The Vibes with Lionel Hampton and his band. That man knew how to swing!

Who would you most like to collaborate with now? I've been very lucky to have had the chance to play with many of my guitar heroes, David Gilmour, Eric Clapton, Jeff Beck etc. I actually find it easier to create by myself as otherwise I tend to adopt a supportive role. It's my natural default approach. having been a sideman for so long.

What advice do you have other musicians?

Try to keep an open mind as much as possible. There are good and bad examples of most musical styles, and you can draw on the positive elements and make your own use of them. With regards to session work — never turn anything down!


How the has the MU helped you?

In my days as a fairly active session musician, they have been helpful in getting my fee paid on more than one occasion.

Your best experience to date as a live performer? Band Aid with Eric Clapton in 1985 was a wonderful experience. Pink Floyd on the Live 8 Hyde Park concert 20 years' later was the cherry on my cake.

Your favourite recording to date?

Probably the title track from Year Of The Cat with Al



Stewart. I've been involved in seven albums for Al. He is very indulgent with guest guitarists, it's great.

What are your plans for the next 12 months?

I have a batch of media music to write and record. I've recently acquired a Pro Tools computer setup, which I aim to learn to use. A friend described this as "being dragged kicking and screaming into the '90s". www.timrenwick.com

blinding mix of originals and standards in his inimitable manner and with a freshness that belies his status as a pathfinder for UK country/rock and roll aficionados since the 1970s. Totally at home with the Everlys' Brand New Heartache and the speed trickery of *Pulling* It Off. Albert exhibits why he has been an in-demand player for so many major names. In fact, all of the Heroes show a potency and understanding of what it takes to make the best of British stand up with pride against their US counterparts. Gerry Hogan (steel), Pete Wingfield (keys), Brian Hodgson (bass) and Peter Baron (drums) blend to mould a fluid and dexterous force. Great stuff.

Bright and vibrant during her take on Van Heusen/ Mercer's I Thought About You and yet intimate and seductive on Legrand's The Summer Knows, Andi is clearly adroit at offering a range of jazz moods. Probably in her best light, however, during Dearie's Shadowing You when the gently uptempo swing lends itself perfectly to her high tones. Delectable from start to finish.

KENT SINFONIA LOST ENGLAND



Established in 1962 by Béla de Csilléry, the Sinfonia

achieved professional status in 1995 and is recognised for its exemplary aims of striving to make live classical music accessible to all, especially where there are no regular venues. The chamber orchestra consists of up to 40 musicians - all connected to Kent – and is recognised for the admirable work it undertakes with its partners in education. This album throws light on two composers whose talents

were lost as a result of conflict: George Butterworth (died, the Somme 1916) and Walter Leigh (died, near Tobruk 1942). The two shared a lightness of touch and the sympathetic promptings of conductor Malcolm Riley bring out the best in the works of both, also in the accomplished performers of the Sinfonia.
