This month's orchid Odontoglossum Alliance

The Odontoglossum alliance is made up of hybrids between Odontoglossum and one or more of: Cochlioda, Miltonia, Brassia, Oncidium amongst others.

We grow them unheated but under cover in sphagnum moss with a little chopped polystyrene. Other mixes include coconut fibre or 3-5mm bark with perlite.

They need to be kept moist all year round and don't like high temperatures during summer however plenty of humidity will help them get through.

Small plants 1-2 years away from flowering are available at around \$15-\$20 with flowering sizes \$20 - \$30. (Orchid nurseries & shows)

General Culture for the month

The main job over the next two months is taking care of the flower spikes. Now that the worst of the cold nights appear to be over I will also be repotting those cymbidiums which have finished flowering. Those which are not needed for showing will have flower spikes removed once they're fully opened so they can be seen to as well.

Aussie natives have finished the early flowering and we are now looking after the spikes on the main season types. (Keep a close eye out for slugs, snails, and aphids.)

Buds on the spring flowering cattleyas are well on the way. Intermediate and mini types tend to put up a growth and then flower all year round so they will need to be kept growing by keeping some moisture in the mix. For those growing in bark, the odd warm day or two can dry out the mix pretty quickly.

Paphiopedilums have been down on flowering in my case possibly due to the very hot days we had in summer. Nevertheless, keep the mix moist and keep air movement going in the house to avoid fungal problems.

Most other species need the moisture to be kept in the mix unless they are known to need a winter rest.

Max has planted up his pleiones for the coming season and flower buds are beginning to develop. They are also going to be well down on flowers this year and Max believes this is also due to those few very hot days.

My softcane dendrobiums are starting to show flower buds opposite each leaf. Once I'm sure they're flowers I will start to water again. They are currently hanging on a long piece of water pipe suspended under the northern eaves of the house. Here they can get the month or so of temperatures under 10 degrees plus full sunlight without getting wet. (Both needed to initiate flowers) They have had virtually no water for the last two month with the exception of one or two plants which have had a small drink due to slight shrivelling of the lead growth.
