- 4) What are three of the latest design techniques used in the most recent redesign effort?**

- 5) Describe at least one benefit and one detractor that you will personally experience with redesigned bills.**

- 6) The last paragraph in column two has the word “evolution” in it. Using the context clues (words around the word) what does *evolution* mean?**

- 7) How often are bills redesigned, and what was the most recent bill to be redesigned?**

- 8) How much of the United States’ currency resides outside of the country? What might be the reasons for so much of our currency being in foreign countries?**

- 9) Who is the director of the Bureau of Engraving and Printing?**

- 10) What is the percentage of counterfeit bills in domestic circulation? Assuming that there is approximately \$299 billion in domestic circulation, create an estimate as to how much of that is counterfeit.**
