Hillel will be holding meals on erev Rosh HaShana and erev Yom Kippur at both McNutt and Hillel. Reservations need to be made for these meals. Hillel will be holding services at the St. Paul Catholic Center and at Hillel.

The Chabad House, located at 518 East 7th Street, will be holding services Friday and Saturday nights and Saturday and Sunday mornings for Rosh HaShana as well as meals after each service. Yom Kippur times are to be announced.

## THE YOM KIPPUR WAR - 30 YEARS GONE BY...

On October 6, 1973, while Jews around the world were celebrating Yom Kippur, the Egyptian and Syrian armies initiated surprise attacks on Israeli forces stationed in the Suez Canal and Golan Heights respectively. These operations launched what would later become known as the Yom Kippur War. The Israeli military was caught completely off-guard and took a severe beating during the first days of the fourth major Arab-Israeli battle. The Jewish State, only 25 years old at the time, was once again in danger of being wiped off the map by its Arab neighbors.

Israel's closest ally, the United States, came to its rescue after the Soviet Union began resupplying Egypt and Syria. President Richard Nixon pushed for crucial shipments of weapons and supplies to Israel and, despite an Arab oil embargo and the refusals of various American allies to help with the resupply effort, the tables soon turned for the Arab aggressors. Israel regained control of the Sinai Peninsula and Golan Heights, and U.S. Secretary of State Henry Kissinger brokered disengagement agreements on both fronts in 1974.

The lack of preparedness by the Israel Defense Forces and high Israeli casualties were a major blow to the Jewish State's population, as well as the Israeli government. On April 10, 1974, Prime Minister Golda Meir resigned. The late Yitzhak Rabin succeeded her, becoming the first "sabrah" (native-born Israeli) to assume the post.
