JEWISH STUDIES TO HOLD CAREER NIGHT

The Jewish Studies Student Association, the Borns Jewish Studies Program, and the Helene G. Simon Hillel Center are presenting the Jewish Studies Career Night on Tuesday 4 November at 7 PM at the Helene G. Simon Hillel Center. The keynote talk will be followed by a career fair with representatives from national Jewish organizations, including United Jewish Communities (Federations), Hillel, Jewish Community Centers, the Jewish Education Service of North America, and Baltimore Hebrew University. The keynote speakers will talk about a wide range of opportunities-graduate study and scholarships towards careers in Jewish education, communal service, the cantorate and rabbinate, and jobs in the Jewish community. Representatives will include the United Jewish Communities, the Jewish Education Service of North America, the Jewish Community Center Association, the Reconstructionist Rabbinical College, and Hillel International.

JEWISH BUSINESS ETHICS LECTURES

What are business ethics? What are Jewish business ethics? How do we connect tradition to modern-day business, and how have Jewish business ethics played a role in some of the most pivotal social justice movements of our time? These are some of the questions the Helene G. Simon Hillel Center will try to answer November 10 and November 13th, in a two-part series titled "It's Our Business!" Co-sponsored by Indiana University's Division of Labor Studies, and made possible by a generous grant from Hillel's Jacob Burns Endowment in Ethics, the program will feature a presentation November 10th at 6:30 at the keynote dinner by IU South Bend professor Paul Mishler, who will speak on the history of Jewish involvement in the labor movement. Additionally, the program will feature a thought-provoking roleplay exercise Thursday, November 13th, at 7:00, that will involve roleplay and real-life case examples to get students to examine their own understanding of Jewish business ethics.

"It's a program that we are all very excited about," said assistant director Jessie Mallor. "It's a topic that doesn't get a lot of discussion time, and it's very relevant to the way we all conduct our lives," she added, continuing, "I think all the students who participate will definitely leave with a lot of new knowledge, but also hopefully a deeper understanding of their tradition, their history, and even their own actions."

TWO NEW NOVEMBER PROGRAMS AT HILLEL

The Helene G. Simon Hillel Center will be offering two new programs this November: the first meeting of Knit One, Purl Jew, a beginning knitter's group, as well as an introduction to the Ashtanga yoga Sun Salutations. Both programs will be staffed by Jessie Mallor. Knit One, Purl Jew will be from 6:00-6:30 Thursday, November 13, and the introductory yoga class will be held November 21st, both at Hillel.

"Everyone should feel welcome to come to both of these programs. I'll teach the two basic knitting stitches, and bring the spare yarn and needles. It will be very relaxed and low-key," she said, adding, "Knitting is a great thing to do. It's very relaxing, and it's amazing to be able to do something creative with your hands. It's also definitely not just something for girls—anybody who wants to come and learn something new should drop in." She continued, "Ashtanga yoga is a great stress reliever. It's very vigorous and relaxing, all at the same time. We'll go through the basics of yogic breathing, as well as the two Sun Salutation series, and of course, everyone is welcome to attend, even if you've never done it."
