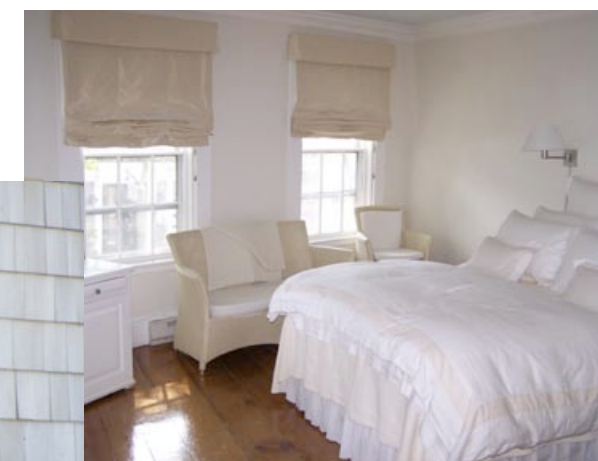
Nantucket Retreat

Living in paradise makes it hard for us to find great vacations spots. Our goal is to suggest beautiful vacations spots that can spoil you, even if you do live in Santa Barbara. One of our favorite vacation spots is on the quaint island of Nantucket.

When you land on Nantucket, you will notice cars that are rusted and parked near the private plane yard. Since Nantucket is a spring/summer season location, many people leave their cars parked for 9 months in the lot. This should not fool you. The houses that these cars take you to are warm, beautiful and very stately. The island is filled with people that enjoy yachting and living life to the fullest. Cobble stone streets and adorable one of a kind Martha's Vineyard/Nantucket stores line the quaint streets. A favorite Nantucket souvenir is a wicker basket with an elephant tusk starting at \$1000. There are several Black Dog and Vineyard Vines stores on the island. These two stores are favorites of frequent visitors of the islands. The nightlife includes people mostly in the age range of 26 to 55. People wear their Ralph Lauren and Vineyard Vines and the collar popped up is a neces-

sity. Pastel colors are very popular especially on the men. Children learn to sail as early as the age of 8. It's adorable to see the children learning on their miniature sail boats. Bed and Breakfast inns are as low as \$85 a night to the nicest Inns that are waterfront that cost \$1200 a night with cheese plates served daily. I stayed at the B&B that was in "HIP HOTELS" that was \$500 a night. Ferragamo shoe family owns the hotel so accordingly there is a Ferragamo shoe store attached to the hotel. These islands attract everyone from movie stars, sports figures, and politicians. Bill Clinton just celebrated his 60th Birthday on the Vineyard. Once you experience Nantucket, you will soon be planning your return visit.

Ways to get to Nantucket: Fly from Boston and you can take a ferry. Or you can take a small plane from Boston to Nantucket 25 to 45 minutes. If you fly it takes 15 minutes. I took a small private plane from Martha's Vineyard to Nantucket that took 15 minutes. You get a great view of both islands. The aerial pictures I took are amazing.

"Who's lying next to you?"

"This relationship seems too good to be true."

Has that thought ever crossed your mind? Maybe a friend has voiced the same concern after you have told them all about your latest love interest. If so, before you go any further, you might want to investigate your date.

Based in Santa Barbara, California Licensed Private Investigator, Carmen Naimish, says that 80 percent of the time you or your friend's suspicions will turn out to be true. And, she says that it is important to trust your instincts no matter how charming your prospective date seems to be. She advises to be aware of the "red flags." These include that uneasy feeling in the pit of your stomach, secretive behavior, or solicitations for money.

The founder of DateSmart.com and a pioneer in the dating background check industry since 1997, Naimish says you can never be too careful when dating, whether you've met someone on-line, at a neighborhood barbeque, or even if you've been

formally introduced through friends. In fact, she says she wants you to consider her as your friend. "Think of me as someone who will discreetly tap you on the shoulder and follow through with that nagging feeling, that issue you just can't quite put your finger on," she says.

"Most of us desire a loving, trusting relationship and sometimes can blind ourselves to the truth by unintentionally ignoring red flags," Naimish says. "You would want to know all the facts in making a business decision, why not with your heart? Both have consequences. I prefer my clients have pleasant ones. No surprises."

Naimish, who has clients throughout the country as well as internationally, says the majority of them are between the age of 30 and 75 and approximately 60 percent are female. Most are successful professionals and don't have time to date inappropriate people. They want to eliminate the "I-wish-I'd-known factor." Almost everyone that calls her says, "I wish I knew about you last year, or five or ten years ago." The bottom line is that if a person lies about one thing, they'll probably lie about other things. Naimish wants to cut it off at the pass, before it's too late and you've become involved with the wrong person. Case in point: Naimish has a client that always calls her before getting involved with someone. Recently the client called her regarding her new beau that claimed he was divorced. Most of his claims checked out, but Naimish couldn't find any record of divorce. When she advised the client of such, the client specifically asked the man three times about being divorced before he finally confessed that he was still married. His explanation: His wife was terminally ill and he didn't have the heart to divorce her and leave her without medical insurance. "I can't count the number of times I hear similar stories," says Naimish. "They always have some type of tragedy associated with the lie."

Naimish's motto is "If you date...investigate." Here are some of the red flags you'll find on her website DateSmart.com:

- Does it seem too good to be true?
- Is there something you can't quite put your finger on?
- Do they claim their "ex" and/or parents are deceased?
- Are they secretive or elusive regarding their past?
- Have they asked you for money or use of credit cards?
- Have they given you expensive gifts early in the relationship?

If you answered, "yes," to any of these questions contact Naimish at DateSmart.com before you go any further with this person. She will work personally and directly with you. She starts her investigation by asking you for the following information: his or her full name (a middle name or initial is helpful), date of birth (or approximate age), and their current address (or at least the city). If possible, how long they've lived at that address, as well as their previous address.

Other information she might ask for includes: marital status, if they own their home or if they rent, and whether you have met or have any knowledge of their family members. She'll want to know if there is something you are particularly concerned or curious about.

"All communications with my clients and the information I gather is kept strictly confidential," says Naimish. "The person investigated will have no knowledge that someone has conducted a background check on him or her."

Often her clients are parents or adult children who have concerns about the person their loved one is dating. A few months ago an investi-

gation lead to the discovery that a client's mother, who had met a man on-line, was actually being scammed out of money through an elaborate international scheme. Other investigations have lead to actually stopping a wedding last minute! "You just can't be too careful," says Naimish. Her best piece of advice? "Trust yourself," she says, "if you feel something is wrong, you're probably right."

Carmen Naimish is the District Governor for the Central Coast of the California Association of Licensed Investigators; a member of the World Association of Detectives and the National Council of Investigation & Security Services; she has been featured in many publications including PEOPLE, Cosmopolitan, USA Today, San Francisco Chronicle, and Detroit Free Press. She has been a guest on numerous radio talk shows and is a contributor to a variety of books on the subject of dating. She was recently a guest speaker at the Internet Dating Conference in San Francisco, California. Her fees typically start around \$500. She can be reached at 805-745-1520.

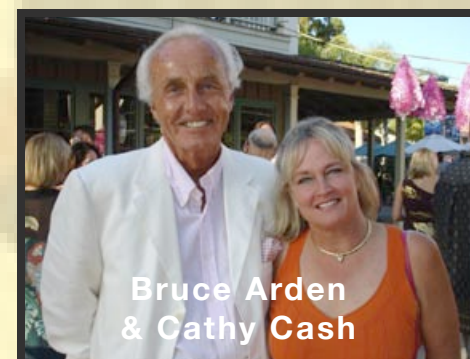
