| American Psychological Association (APA) (WD 74) | A popular documentation style for research papers | I use MLA documentation style |
| Modern Language Association of America (MLA) (WD 74) | Another popular documentation style for research papers | I use MLA documentation style |
| research paper (WD 74) | Document you can use to communicate the results of research findings | Writing papers for all subjects on specific topics |
| parenthetical citations (WD 76) | Author references in parentheses with the page number of referenced information; in-text citations | Citing sources in papers |
| plagiarize (WD 76) | Using someone else's work and claiming it as your own | 8 th WP, writing bibliographies and citations |
| works cited (WD 77) | Bibliographic list of sources at the end of the paper | Uniform way of presenting bibliography, used in all subjects |
| double-space (WD 78) | Amount of vertical space between each line of text and above and below paragraphs should be equal to one blank line | Used in writing all papers for school |
| line spacing (WD 78) | Amount of vertical space between lines of text in a paragraph | Usually use double-space |
| paragraph spacing (WD 78) | Amount of space above and below a paragraph | Usually use double-space |
| footer (WD 79) | Text and graphics that print at the bottom of every page | 8 th WP |
| header (WD 79) | Text and graphics that print at the top of each page in a document | 8 th WP |

| right-aligned (WD 81) | at the right margin | Name, date and period for all papers are right aligned |
| Click and Type (WD 85) | Use it to format and enter text, graphics, and other items | Used in writing |
| shortcut keys (WD 86) | Keyboard key combinations to format text as you type it | Used in writing Ex: copy, paste..etc |
| horizontal ruler (WD 87) | Displays at the top edge of the document window just below the Ribbon | Indenting |
| vertical ruler (WD 87) | Displays along left edge of Word window | Indenting |
| First Line Indent marker (WD 88) | Indent just the first line of a paragraph | Used in all writing |
| first-line indent (WD 88) | Top triangle at the 0" mark on the ruler | Indenting first line of paragraph |
| Left Indent marker (WD 88) | Allows you to change the entire left margin | Changing margin of paper |
| ruler (WD 88) | Horizontal ruler | Changing indent space |
| AutoCorrect (WD 91) | Automatically corrects typing, spelling, capitalization or grammar errors as you type them in the document | Often corrects my mistyped words |
| AutoCorrect Options button (WD 92) | Allows you to undo a correction or change how Word handles future automatic corrections of this type | Purpose mistakes |
| field (WD 96) | Placeholder for data whose contents can change | Inserting data |
| endnote (WD 99) | Explanatory note exists at end of document | 8 th WP |
| footnote (WD 99) | Explanatory note exists at bottom of page | Extra information included |
| note reference mark (WD 99) | A subscript that references footnotes or endnotes | Using footnotes and endnotes |
| note text (WD 99) | Any length and format | 8 th WP |
| automatic page breaks (WD 107) | Page breaks, when determined that the text has filled one page according to paper size, margin settings, line spacing and other settings | Typing long papers |
| background repagination (WD 107) | Refers to automatic page break tasks | 8 th WP |
| soft page breaks (WD 107) | Page breaks, when determined | Typing lengthy papers |

| bibliography (WD 111) | Alphabetical list of sources referenced in a paper | Used in research papers for all subjects |
| works cited page (WD 111) | List of sources that are referenced directly in a research paper | MLA format, all subjects |
| hard page break (WD 112) | One that you force into the document at a specific location | 8 th WP |
| manual page break (WD 112) | One that you force into the document at a specific location | 8 th WP |
| bibliographic list (WD 113) | Word formats the list of sources and alphabetizes them, saving time taking up style guidelines | 8 th WP |
| hanging indent (WD 116) | First line hangs to the left of the rest of the paragraph, type of paragraph formatting | Bibliographies |
| Hanging Indent marker (WD 116) | Bottom triangle at the 0" mark on the ruler | Hanging indentations for works cited pages |
| proofreading (WD 118) | Look for grammatical errors and spelling errors | Process when editing a paper |
| Clipboard (WD 119) | Temporary Windows storage area | Copy/paste |
| cutting (WD 119) | Removing selected item from document and then placing it on Clipboard | Rearranging information in a paper |
| drag-and-drop editing (WD 119) | Drag selected item to new location and then insert, or drop it there | Rearranging information in a paper |
| pasting (WD 119) | Process of copying an item from the Clipboard into the document at the location of the insertion point | Copy/paste in all research papers |
| Paste Options button (WD 122) | Menu appears that allows you to change format of item that was moved | 8 th WP |
| synonym (WD 124) | Word similar in meaning | English, vocabulary and typing papers |
| thesaurus (WD 124) | Book of synonyms | Typing papers, vocabulary |
| antonym (WD 125) | Opposite of a word | Changing the vocabulary of text |
