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CanPower Skating Information

This program is designed to improve skating skills for hockey and ringette players as well as recreational skaters. Focus is on increasing speed in forward and backward skating, efficient stops, pivots, turns and transitions.

The program consists of six different levels. Within each level skaters can obtain a gold, silver or bronze standing. Once a skater shows the ability to skate at a

gold level they can then advance to the next stage. All, skaters skate a timed evaluation at the end of the fall and/or winter session

So come on out and join in the fun and improve your skating skills. All programs are designed to help everyone of any age improve there own natural abilities. Keep in mind these are not learn to skate programs. We hope to see you soon.

Canskate Information

Canskate is a learn to skate program designed for children aged 3 and up. It focuses on the elements of skating and provides a good skill development for figure skating or hockey.

Children will be taught various skills by a Certified Skate Canada coach and then receive practice time with our volunteer Program Assistants who are our more senior skaters or high school students with skating experience. The Canskate program is divided into stages 1 through 6.

Once children are proficient in all the skill elements of the stage they progress to the next stage. Badges are awarded for the completion of each stage.
