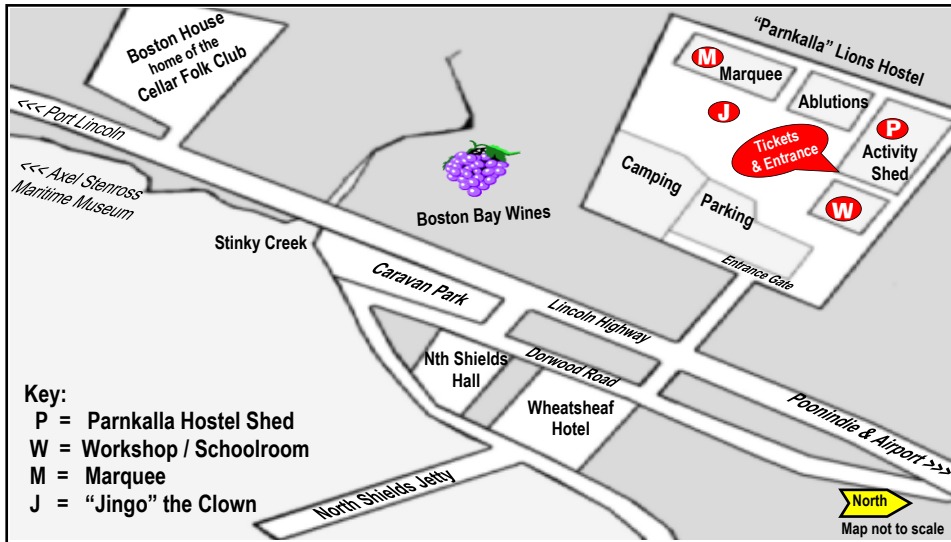

Ruth Hazelton & Kate Burke - From ACT & Melbourne - young "super-stars" of the Australian Folk Scene, already well traveled & popular visitors to the major British Folk Festivals; they have recorded 3 CDs together and despite their youth, have years of experience with a number of great groups, widely known & highly regarded in the Eastern States. Don't miss these two wonderful musicians!

("Meet Kate & Ruth" - PM Sat. + Concert spots Saturday & Sunday evenings & other spots around the festival!)

Kate's guitar workshop (Sunday 1:00 PM) will attempt to de-mystify the use of alternative guitar tunings, such as DADGAD - For the more advanced / intermediate guitarists (bring your guitars) - but of interest to everyone!

"The Ryebuck Sheilas" - From Adelaide - you saw them & loved them last year - come & see their new line-up! Back by popular Request!

("Bandamonium" Saturday 11 AM, Saturday & Sunday concert spots - plus instrument & singing workshops all over the festival - just try & stop them playing!)

"Rafferty's Rules" - one of Adelaide's most popular "Irish - based" folk bands - always in demand! Peter, Des & Pete will be leading sessions & music all around the festival. Don't miss them!

"Mindi" David Crombie - The Life & Stories of an indigenous performer. (PM Saturday) - also concert appearance Saturday. Mindi, from Cooper Pedy & Port Lincoln has won several awards for his singing & songwriting & has recently written "Black Tuesday" from his own experience on January 11.

Bill "Swampy" Marsh, popular writer of short stories & musician will show us why he & Dave are always being asked to go on treks across the length & breadth of Australia & play their music. Expect some Outback Stories!

"Jingo" the clown (from Adelaide) will entertain your kids for you, each morning (Saturday 11:00 AM & Sunday 10:30 AM) while you relax or choose another workshop. In the afternoons he will share some Clowning & Circus skills - All ages welcome!

The "Ocarina Lady" - Noeline "Bella" Bishop, from Whyalla, will demonstrate one of the simplest of South American Instruments - & might even show us how she makes them! She'll no doubt have some for sale - with free tuition thrown in!

"Blues" The marquee could become our "Blues Tent" for part of the weekend, with local enthusiasts Rohan Daw, Kevin Lymn & others - demonstrating & playing different blues styles - Come on & Get Down! (Also concert spots)

The "Poet's Breakfast" this year hosted by the local "Eyre Writers" is your chance to tell that yarn or recite that poem - No experience necessary - just come on down & give it a go! Breakfast available & lots of encouragement. Special 'Joy Broughton award'.

"Songwriter's Forum & Showcase" (Sunday AM) - at this festival we have some of South Australia's finest songwriters - come down & see how it's done - or just enjoy some truly original music.

"All At Sea" - some Sea Shanties for you to join in with ("Aaargh!") - "Nelsons Blood" & Friends.

Leigh Newton's "harmony singing" workshop (Sun PM) - come & learn something about singing harmonies & prepare some songs for the "Reflection" later today (Song-sheets provided) If you've been told that you "can't sing" - maybe this is your chance!

"The Reflection" (Sun 5:30 PM) will be our chance to reflect on the devastating bushfires which raced through this area last January & affected so many. Songs, verse & readings - All Welcome!

"Tea-time Bush Dance" (Sunday 3:00 to 4:30 PM) - your chance to "kick up your heels" - or watch others enjoying themselves. No experience needed - all dances 'called' - by some of the best instructors in the field - with some of the best musicians too! - Fun For All!

"The President's Challenge" - Who knows what it will be this year? - Find out Friday night / Sat. morning and present your efforts on Sunday from 7:00 PM - **All in fun!**

Beginners workshops - Including: Tin Whistle & Fiddle - are "hands-on" workshops - Come prepared to learn how to play some simple Irish tunes. (some whistles will be available for purchase).
