A HISTORY OF CHICAGO ALUMNAE PANHELLENIC (CAP)

For over 100 years, the National Panhellenic Conference (NPC) has been working to unify and organize women's Greek organizations. Bringing women together, supporting each other, and striving for excellence has been a cornerstone of NPC. The benefits of NPC are felt by all women in the Greek community - collegiate and alumnae alike. Alumnae have a special duty to help support local NPC alumnae chapters as well as promote the Greek system to potential new members as they prepare to attend college.

In 2001, Aileen Wright-Bacon (Alpha Omicron Pi) and Beth Torres (Pi Beta Phi) sat down for coffee with Peg Crawford, AOPi and NPC Area Advisor. Together, they discussed the need for an alumnae panhellenic in Chicago, IL and the steps that should be taken to establish the group. After that cup of coffee, Aileen and Beth got to work — calling and e-mailing NPC organizations and local contacts to determine if there was an interest and to find volunteers to organize the alumnae panhellenic. The interest was overwhelming and as the women met for the first time on June 13, 2001 at Fado, an Irish pub in Chicago, there was 19 of the 26 NPC organizations represented.

These great women had dinner and shared stories of alumnae and collegiate experiences. There was no shortage of conversation! As the idea of an alumnae panhellenic was discussed, the discussion turned quickly to successes and struggles that alumnae chapters were facing, goals that the women had for themselves, their alumnae chapters and their NPC organization. This group was motivated to make improvements and share ideas. At the end of the dinner, a date for an official meeting was set.

During the remainder of 2001, the group met monthly and everyone worked together to communicate with as many NPC organizations as possible. By the end of the year, the Bylaws were created, the name of Chicago Alumnae Panhellenic (CAP) was selected, a petition was submitted to NPC for membership as an alumnae panhellenic, and an Executive Board was appointed:

- Aileen Wright-Bacon, President (Alpha Omicron Pi)
- Beth Torres, Vice-President (Pi Beta Phi)
- Julie Dillon, Treasurer (Alpha Xi Delta)
- Rebecca Zanatta, Secretary (Alpha Phi)

By March 2002, CAP received its charter from NPC and began its work as an official alumnae panhellenic. The primary goals of the group were established: support local alumnae chapters, assist NPC organizations that wished to establish an alumnae chapter in Chicago. and promote the Greek experience to the community and high school students. The success of this organization has been a tribute to the hard work and dedication of every woman involved. The Chicago Alumnae Panhellenic continues to strive toward its primary goals and has set bolder, long term goals as well. The women involved make
