Also, to reach a guorum for the vote, Proxy Vote information will be sent out about a week prior to the January meeting. If you are not able to attend the meeting in person, your proxy vote will be necessary for the vote.

Chicago Alumnae Panhellenic's Pre-Recruitment: Reaching today's high school student & tomorrow's sorority leader

At CAP's establishment, long-term goals were set, including the creation of an effort to connect high school girls with the idea of Greek life. This year, the push has begun with a three-pronged attack!

Operation Guidance Counselors:

CAP has targeted fourteen high schools in Chicago to extend our message. Our goal is to create a partnership with at least ten of these schools through their counseling offices. CAP will provide each school with information on Greek life and its benefits. This partnership will include a CAP volunteer who is a resource to female students interested in learning about sororities. This operation will begin in early 2004.

Grass-roots Faculty Promotion: A sub-committee is forming to build a relationship with sorority women who are teachers and faculty members in the city of Chicago. We would like to provide these women with ways to promote Greek life in their classrooms and schools by providing them additional information on the benefits of joining a sorority and resources to share with their interested students.

In-Person Inspiration: This spring, CAP would like to visit three high schools for the in-person opportunity to share the benefits of Greek life and provide students time to meet sorority women. An interactive presentation is planned to detail the who, what, when, where and how of Sorority life.
