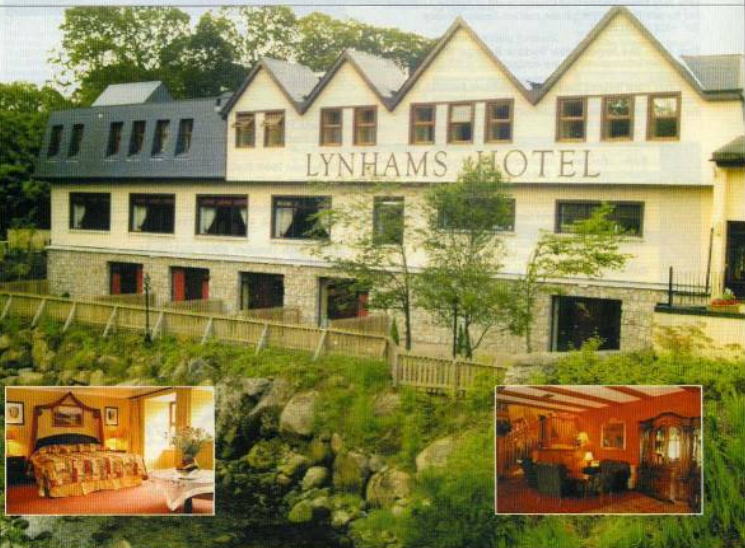

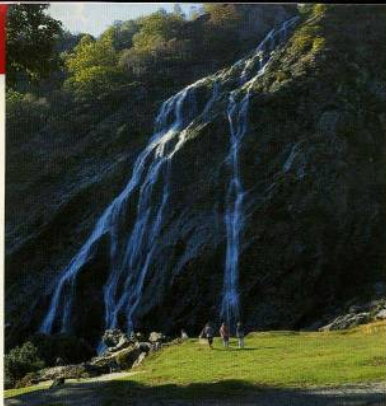

ARKLOW

Arklow is a beautiful, picturesque coastal town situated along the east coast, just 72 km south of Dublin city. It is a vibrant coastal town, built very much upon its traditions of ship building and fishing, both of which were once the main-stays of its industry. Arklow, and its hinterland, is an excellent base from which to tour Co. Wicklow, with some of Ireland's most beautiful beaches, including Brittas Bay and Clogga, located nearby. There are also a host of beautiful attractions nearby, including Avondale House and Forest Park, and the magnificent Glendalough, situated in the Wicklow Mountains National Park.

ASHFORD / RATHNEW

Ashford is a small, picturesque village situated in a wooded valley just 42km north of Wicklow Town on the Vartry river. It is most notable for the magnificent Mount Usher Gardens, one of the most famed gardens in the British Isles. The 20 acre garden contains over 5000 different trees and shrubs, while the Vartry river passes through the garden and is spanned by several bridges.

AUGHRIM

Aughrim 14km from Arklow, this picturesque little village is situated amongst woodlands and rolling hills. It has won numerous Co. Wicklow Tidyest towns awards since 1996.

AVOCA

Avoca village is spectacular in its beauty and is one of the most famous places to visit within County Wicklow. Passing through the Vale of Avoca, one can instantly see the unmistakable signs of a great mining tradition, with the remnants of old chimneys and engine houses scattered around. Copper and sulphur were mined here since the Bronze Age. Unfortunately, by the 1860s all such activity had ceased. The village has, more recently, become famous as the filming location of the very popular "Ballykissangel" TV series, which was broadcast around the world. Other attractions that are of interest are the Moltee Stone, Moore's Bar (called after the great poet, Thomas Moore, who was inspired by this village), Avoca Handweavers, craft shops, traditional music, trout fishing and the beautiful "Meeting of The Waters".

BALLYKNOCKAN

Ballyknockan is a remote village which overlooks the beautiful Blessington Lakes. Within and surrounding the village are some spectacular walks overlooking the Poulaphuca Reservoir. This village is famous for its stone quarry and has provided granite for many of Dublin's best-known buildings, including the GPO (scene of the 1916 Rising), the RDS, the Four Courts and O'Connell Bridge.

BALINGLASS

Balinglass is a delightful heritage town situated in the very heart of West Wicklow. This little town is a historian's delight with its 12th century Cistercian Abbey surrounded by Stone Age monuments, including the remains of a passage grave and three burial chambers, all of which have been excavated.

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The picturesque village of Enniskerry.

BLESSINGTON

This small, quiet town is situated just 24km from Dublin city and is the gateway to the Poulaphuca Lakes, which were created in the 1840s for the purpose of generating electricity for the area. These lakes have transformed the area in terms of scenic beauty and the area is now open to a host of water sports including canoeing, boating and sailing. Blessington is also synonymous with one of the world's finest art collections, the Beit Collection, which adorn the walls of the fabulous Russborough House.

BRAY

Bray is known as the "gateway to the garden of Ireland" and is the longest established seaside town in Ireland. It lies just 19km south of Dublin and can be reached by DART, train, bus or the N11 road. It has a beautiful, safe beach of over 1.6km long, fronted by a spacious esplanade. The town is dominated by Bray Head, whilst the scenic Cliff Walk offers a feast of views to the walker. Bray is home to the National Sea Life Centre, which takes you on a magical journey into a world beneath the ocean. It is steeped in film history and such blockbusters as Michael Collins, Far and Away, The Commitments and the Oscar winning My Left Foot, were all partially shot here. The exact filming locations of these films can be seen on the Film Trail.

CARNEW

Carnew is a market town, situated in the extreme south of the county, close to the Wexford border. It is also home to Carnew castle which was built in 1616. Carnew Enterprise Centre is located at the west end of the town. Carnew is the starting point for local walks and is only five minutes from Coolattin's magnificent 18-hole golf course and woodland horse riding.

DONARD

Donard is a pretty village situated to the east of the N81, at the northern end of the Glen of Imaal. The village is surrounded by mountains and hills and wears a quaint, old-time look. The Glen of Imaal is very much associated with Michael Dwyer, who participated in the 1798 United Irishmen's rebellion. The area houses the Dwyer McAllister cottage, the house from which he fled from British troops in 1799. This is fully restored and is now open as a museum.

DUNLAVIN

Dunlavin is a small, peaceful village situated 5km west of the main N81 road and is very close to the Kildare county border. Its crowning glory is the Courthouse in the centre of the village. It is also home to a wonderful golf course called Rathallagh.

ENNISKERRY

This is an extremely picturesque village situated just 5km west of Bray. This village was originally built in order to accommodate workers at the nearby Powerscourt Estate and is an excellent base from which to explore the surrounding countryside. Enniskerry features plenty of beautiful teaspoons as well as picturesque, postcard style buildings along with a charming village triangle. Lying in a beautiful glen of the Cookstown or Glencullin River, the wooded country around Enniskerry offers some fine forest walks. Golf courses in the area include the Powerscourt Golf Club and the Kilternan Golf and Country Club.

GLENCREE

Glencree is situated 10km west of Enniskerry in a beautiful, scenic part of Co. Wicklow. This valley is preserved as a royal park and offers beautiful walks through forests of spruce. At the head of the valley are extensive buildings called St Kevin's. These buildings are now used as a reconciliation centre aimed at promoting understanding amongst people of different persuasions. Nearby, there is a German war cemetery which was established for Germans who were shipwrecked, or who crashed on Irish soil, during the world wars.

GLENDALOUGH / LARAGH

Glendalough, once the monastic capital of Europe, is now one of Ireland's most visited sites, attracting up to 500,000 people annually. It has earned County Wicklow the title "The Garden of Ireland", with its historical and archaeological heritage combined with its primitive beauty. The ruins of the seven churches and the 6th century round tower owe their origins to St Kevin, a hermit who founded this monastic city and who lived in a cave overlooking its upper lake. This area boasts wonderful scenic mountain walks, woodland trails and lakeside rambles. As a result, it has become very popular with hill walkers and families enjoying a day out. Glendalough is now serviced with a visitor's centre, which runs guided tours, exhibitions and audiovisual shows.

Laragh is one of the busiest villages in Ireland, as it is on the road to Glendalough. It is in the heart of the Wicklow Mountains National Park. It services visitors to Glendalough, with its choice of coffee shops, restaurants, interesting gift shops and range of accommodation options. Lynham's Pub, situated in the village itself, was used by Italian Director Sergio Leone, famous for his Western, "The Good, The Bad and The Ugly", in his film, "A Fistful of Dynamite". Clara Lara Funpark is located nearby.

GREYSTONES / DELGAN Y

Greystones is situated 29km from Dublin, between the Sugarloaf Mountain and the Irish Sea. It is on the DART line, which means easy access to Dublin, whilst there are ample park and ride facilities at the South beach. Greystones is twinned with Bray and there is a 6.5km walk between them offering magnificent sea views and the chance to see bird nesting sites (see www.wildireland.ie). The 15km of shingle and stone beach from Greystones to Wicklow Harbour is renowned for bathing, walking and shore angling. There are some excellent Golf Courses to choose from including Delgany, Charlesland Golf and Country Club, Glen of the Downs and Greystones Golf Club.

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HOLLYWOOD

This is the original Hollywood and bears no resemblance to America's "tinsel town". This is a close knit, farming community, which nestles in the hills of West Wicklow. Its location marks the boundary between rich farmland and the rugged beauty of the Wicklow Mountains. This village is steeped in history, and nearby is an abundance of archaeological remains such as ring forts, portal tombs and the magnificent Baltinglass Abbey. It has long associations with St Kevin of Glendalough and a 30km pilgrim path called the St Kevin's Way is an extremely popular walking route. This area was used frequently in the filming of the Michael Collins movie. Hollywood has welcomed a whole host of film stars such as Liam Neeson, Meryl Streep and Julia Roberts and the local favourite pub, the Hollywood Inn has come very interesting information on display about the local film trail.

KILCOOLE

The village of Kilcoole lies between Greystones and Newcastle and is close to the sea. It is one of the best-known villages in Ireland as it doubles as the fictional village of Glenroe in RTE's recent popular series, also entitled "Glenroe". One can now visit Glenroe Open Farm, one of the principal locations of the TV series as it was home to the main characters, Dinny, Miley and Biddy Byrne. Also in the area is the beautiful Altidore Castle in Kildare whilst the superb Kilcoole Golf Course is situated close-by.

KILMACANOGUE

Kilmacanogue is 5km from the Bray / Delgany road and is situated at a busy crossroads beneath the imposing Sugarloaf Mountain. Kilmacanogue is scented with the aroma of lavender from the fields that provide the raw material for Fragrances of Ireland, the country's sole perfume manufacturer. The world famous Avoca Handweavers Company is also based in the village.

KILTEGAN

The small village of Kiltegan lies between Balinglass and Hacketstown and just 5 km from its sister village, Rathangan. This is very friendly and welcoming village and is a previous winner of Ireland's tidy towns competition.

NEWCASTLE

Newcastle is situated on a link road that runs along the East Coast from Bray to Wicklow Town. Newcastle has a fine community centre, which provides ample space for sporting and recreational pursuits. An Information Technology centre provides training for all ages. The young population is very socially and culturally active, with many club and sporting organisations like the local Gaelic Athletic Association Club, indoor soccer, bowls, badminton, tennis and croquet. Newcastle is very close to the beach, which is excellent for angling, walking and swimming.

NEWTOWNMOUNTKENNEDY

Newtownmountkennedy is Ireland's longest place name. It is situated halfway between Bray and Wicklow and is surrounded

by the forests of Glen O'The Downs, Altidore and Kilmurray. The area is home to the world famous Druid's Glen course, whilst the newly opened Druid's Heath golf course is also nearby, beside the Marriott Hotel. This sleepy village provides excellent opportunities for walking and horse riding.

RATHDRUM

Rathdrum is a beautiful, picturesque town situated about 10km south west of Rathnew. It is pitched high on the western side of the beautiful Avonmore valley and thus, there are some spectacular views across the valley, forests and hills. Glenmalur valley is one such attraction, as it is the largest glacier valley in the British Isles. In addition Avondale House and Forest Park, once the home of one of Ireland's best-known political figures, Charles Stewart Parnell, is situated just 2km from Rathdrum. This estate is set on over 500 acres of forest and parkland, whilst the house has been restored to its original décor of 1850. Other attractions that can be found nearby are the Vale of Avoca, the beautiful monastic settlement of Glendalough, Glenmalur and the Kilmacurragh Gardens. Facilities are excellent here with golf courses, fun parks, fishing, squash, horse riding, all in the immediate locality.

Rathdrum is also the film capital of Ireland. There is an abundance of famous pubs with film connections in the town. In fact, one could go on a cinematic pub crawl because nearly every pub has been immortalised in a film of one type or another. The Michael Collins movie was just one of many shot here, whilst The Spice Girls chose the village of Rathdrum to shoot a pop video. It has also become the centre of the cartooning world through its cartoon festivals.

ROUNDWOOD / SALLYGAP / ANNAMOE

The beautiful village of Roundwood is, at 238 metres (781 feet) above sea level, the highest village in Ireland. It is also surrounded by some of the most spectacular scenery, flanked on one side by the tranquil lakes of the Vartry Reservoir and on the other, by the dramatic Wicklow Mountains and blanket bog. A popular stopping off point for weary walkers, the village features some charming pubs and restaurants as well as a country market, open every Sunday from March through to December, from 2.00pm - 5.00pm. Attractions nearby include Victoria's Way, an inspiring garden full of thought provoking hand carved granite statues. Also close by are the beautiful brown waters of Lough Tay and the dramatic cliffs of the Luggala Estate, also known as the Guinness Estate.

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REDCROSS VILLAGE / BRITTAS BAY

Redcross Village is situated 40km from South Dublin and just 10 minutes from Brittias Bay beach. This is a wonderful, old style village that is almost exactly the same now as it was 50 years ago. Facilities in the village include a post office, two shops, a pub, wine bar, bowling lawn as well as a golf course and caravan park. Brittias Bay is one of the finest beaches in the country, with its sand dunes now a designated area of scientific interest.

SHILLELAGH

Shillelagh is largely a 17th century, planned estate village with attractive terrace stone houses and a handsome courthouse with a clock tower. It is beautifully situated on the banks of the Shillelagh River, below the Wicklow Mountains. It was here that that most famous of Irish "weapons", the Shillelagh, got its name. Even today, visitors from all over the world purchase these traditional blackthorn sticks as souvenirs.

STRATFORD-ON-SLANEY

Stratford on Slaney is a small village of 200 inhabitants, nestled beautifully in the Wicklow hills, high above the river Slaney. The village takes its name from the 18th century Stratford family who built it to house workers in a nearby textile printing mill. Stratford is quite unusual in that it is devoid of monuments or statues but it has retained its simplicity and beauty throughout the years. In the village you will find one pub, a post office, a general store, two churches and a three-teacher primary school. It has been one of the tidiest towns in the County over the past twenty years.

TINAHELY

Tinahely is a market town and is situated in an area of unspoilt beauty, on the banks of the Derry River between Aughrim and Shillelagh. It is only a short distance from Croghan Mountain, Croghan Valley and the Wicklow Gap South. The town was completely destroyed during the 1798 rebellion but was subsequently rebuilt over the next few years. The old Court House occupies the centre of the square and is currently a centre for arts, culture and heritage.

WICKLOW TOWN

Wicklow Town is the capital town of County Wicklow. It is a seaside town that stands on the lower slopes of Ballygulle Hill, approximately 26km from Bray. The town is famed for its fine harbour, which is home to a well-founded sailing / yacht club. The town has a beautiful 19km pebble beach, which offers the delights of undisturbed and peaceful walking, beach combing, bird watching and swimming. There is also the magnificent, five-mile long natural promenade of the

Murrrough, whilst Wicklow's Historic Gaol is a must see tourist site. The Gaol has also been used in the filming of TV series, *Ballykissangel*. Another impressive site is Wicklow's Black Castle. Now a ruin, this was built in about 1180 to guard the Southern end of the Pale. There is an abundance of good restaurants, B&Bs, lively pubs and attractive shops in this thriving town. There are a number of summer festivals, including music festivals and the regatta festival. For the golf lover, there are very fine courses here too, including Blairnoe Golf Club and Wicklow Golf Club. Wicklow Town has a train station which is located on the Dublin/Rosslare line.

WOODENBRIDGE

The Woodenbridge area was, for many centuries, associated with gold mining and prospecting. Just a few miles southwest is Croghan Kinsella, a mountain at the head of the Gold Mines River where, in 1796, the finding of a nugget there led to a gold rush. However, work ceased at the mine during the 1798 rebellion. Woodenbridge is also home to one of Ireland's oldest Hotels, The Woodenbridge Hotel, established in 1608. It was here that Michael Collins, hero of the War of Independence, engaged in secret meetings with British Intelligence in February 1922. Woodenbridge is a great location for angling, golfing, shooting, pony trekking and picturesque walks.

Ballinglass Abbey,

Ballinglass Abbey is situated on the east bank of the River Slaney on the north side of the heritage town of Ballinglass. Dermot McMurrough, King of Leinster, founded the Abbey in 1146 for the Cistercian Order of monks. In 1228 it is recorded that there were 36 monks and 50 lay brothers living there. Like many other similar foundations of its period the monks were accused of sheltering Irish Rebels and with the suppression of all religious foundations by King Henry VIII in the mid 16th century, it ceased to function as a religious institution. The Abbey is now in ruins but fragments of the church and traces of the cloister survive. The surviving nave, doorways and tombs make it a very worthwhile visit.

Black Castle, Wicklow Town. The Black Castle ruin stands on a rocky promontory over the sea, at the eastern side of the town. It dates back to 834.

Blessington Lakes, Blessington

Serenely set in the foothills of the Wicklow Mountains, the Blessington Lakes cover 500 acres of tranquil clean water. The lakes were formed 50 years ago by the building of the Poulla- phuca Dam and hydroelectric power station. Today these lakes form a dual purpose of providing power and water supply to the Dublin area. Many amenities can be enjoyed in the Lakes area.

Clogga Beach is situated about 6.5km (4 miles) South of Arklow Town. No public transport to the beach.

The cottage is situated in the Glen of Imaal on the Knockanarrigan/Hathdangan Road. The cottage is a fine example of a vernacular thatched cottage built with local stone and whitewashed inside and out. It was from this cottage that Michael Dwyer escaped from British troops in 1799. The cottage was burned by the British during the battle but was repaired and continued to be inhabited until the turn of the century when it became unoccupied and fell into ruin. It was restored to its original form as a monument in 1946 and again extensively repaired and re-roofed in 1992. Open daily from mid-June to mid-September, from 2.00pm to 6.00pm.

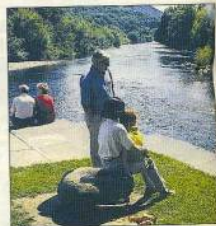

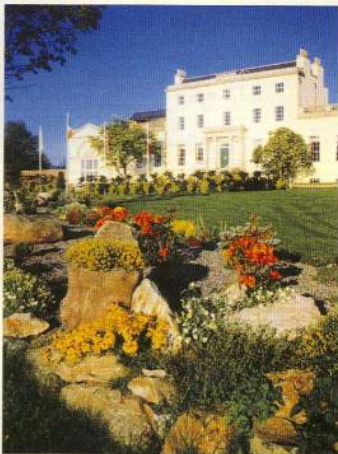

Sea Fishing Information

Generally the Wicklow beaches are best fished after good strong easterly wind. Long casts are not necessary after stormy conditions in contrast to summer requirements. Success in summer can be best achieved with casts of around 100m. There are a wide range of species on these beaches with the most common ones being bass, codfish, codling, dabs dogfish and whiting. Fishing from the pier can also produce an array of species including pollack, coalfish, dogfish, ray, rockling and flatfish. Boats can be launched easily at Wicklow Harbour and there is excellent inshore fishing from Greystones to Wicklow head. Boat anglers can hope to encounter ray, tope, spurdog, codling and plaice.

Silver Strand

Silver Strand is located approximately 3.5 miles south of Wicklow Head. There is good beach fishing in Spring and Autumn

for bass, flounder, dogfish and plaice. Spurdog can be taken on the night tides. The rocks between Brittas Bay and the Silver Strand are known locally as Jacks Hole. This area can fish well in the autumn and produces catches of bass, flounder, plaice and pollack.

Brittas Bay

Brittas Bay is located approximately 2.5 miles north of Mizzen Head. It is a popular night fishing venue and regularly produces good catches of bass and dogfish in Summer and codling and whiting in Winter. The area fishes well during a strong easterly wind which produces excellent surf conditions.

Ennereilly Strand

This strand is located south of Brittas, Co. Wicklow. This is an ideal beach fishing location for bass, flounder, codling, whiting, plaice and dogfish. Many anglers

prefer the night tides and this area is generally regarded as a top Winter match venue.

Arklow

Fishing over sand the South Beach at Arklow can produce good catches of small bass, codling, dabs, sole and flounder. Small boats fishing over the inshore banks regularly produce other species such as dogfish, ray and tope. This area can experience unusual tidal conditions make sure you check locally before fishing.

Clogga (Nun's) Beach

Clogga beach is located approximately 2 miles north of Kilmichael and is accessed by way of a small road off the N11. Float fishing from the rocks using a waggler rig and sand eel can produce bass. Mackerel can also be taken occasionally during the summer months. Ground fishing can produce quality bass, big flounder, dabs and dogfish.

The Wicklow Way

The Wicklow Way is a long distance walking route, which runs from Marlay Park in County Dublin, through County Wicklow, to finish at Clonegal, County Carlow. The Wicklow Way is 132km (82miles) in length and follows a North - South

line over the eastern flank of the Wicklow Mountains, with much of the route over 500m. It can be comfortably walked in five or six days or in shorter sections if desired.

Variety is the great characteristic of this route, which starts in County Dublin, climbs into the Dublin Mountains and switches from Glen to Glen in the high Wicklow Mountains.

Some parts are boggy whilst others are on hard road and tracks. It is clearly way-marked with wooden poles topped by yellow arrows at all junctions. Viewpoints on the way give glorious views; across Dublin to the Mourne Mountains; across the Irish Sea to Snowdonia in Wales; Glendalough; Glenmalur down onto Lough Dan and finally, Powerscourt.

Saint Kevins' Way

After three years of effort by a hard-working committee, the traditional pilgrim's path, St Kevin's Way, was launched as a way-marked route in September 2001. One of the longer pilgrimage roads, it brought pilgrims eastwards over the Wicklow Gap to the way-marked route stretches for 39km, from Hollywood in West Wicklow to Glendalough. A guidebook, entitled "St Kevin's Way Route Guide" is published by the Heritage Council and is available for €6.26 + pp, from Wicklow County Tourism.

Outdoor Life:

Everywhere in Wicklow County there is

water, open countryside and fresh air. Over one third of the 48km (30miles) county coastline is fringed in soft golden sand. The famous River Liffey rises in Wicklow, as does the river Slaney, which flows south to Wexford via Baltinglass. Other rivers like the Dargle, the Vartry and Greenree adorn some of the historic estates and gardens on their passage to the sea. Lough Tay and Lough Dan are linked by the Cloghoge river in a beautiful Valley near Roundwood, whilst the Avoca, Ow, Derry and Aughrim rivers adorn the southern valleys. The confluence of the Avonmore and Avonbeg rivers, near Avoca, is so beautiful that famous poet Thomas Moore immortalised them in song.
