

Riding Around the Bay Area Roads



Reynold (off of Hicks Road – Camden Side)

As you ride up and down Hicks Rd from Camden, you'll see a bunch of side streets. Did you ever wonder where they went? I did! So, I decided to explore them all. Coming down from Hicks' summit toward Camden, the first road you'll see is called Reynolds. Slow down, take a left hand turn onto the road and begin your ascent. The scenery will be very similar to Hicks and the road is in slightly better condition. It must be because of the lower traffic. The road is actually quite steep but it's very short. It dead ends at an open space preserve boundary. Not quite the terrain you want to take your road bike on...



When I said it's a short road, I meant it! It's about 1.16 miles long but in that short distance you will climb from 439 feet to 1078 feet, giving you an ascent of 639 feet and an average grade of 10.43%! The gradient is somewhat consistent which makes it somewhat easier to ride.
