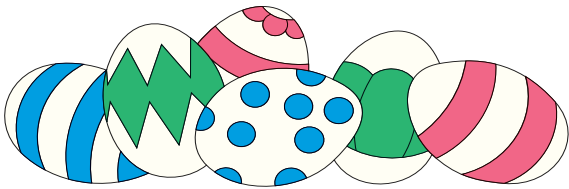


## HOLLEY STUDENTS LEARN CREATIVE WAYS TO BE LEADERS

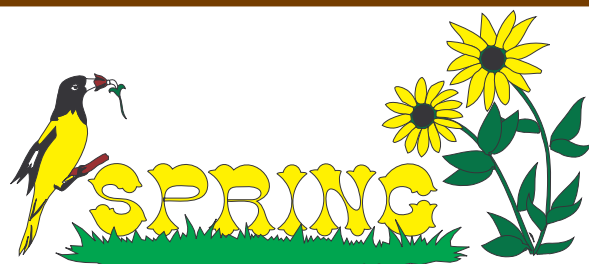
## AFTER-SCHOOL FRIENDS VISIT WITH MAN'S BEST FRIEND

# CLARENDON TOWN BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

## March 2009

The Town Board held a public hearing regarding establishment of Clarendon Water District No. 9 on Powerline Road. John Schepp of Chatfield Engineers explained the reason for this public hearing; that the parcel count has decreased from 18 to 17 since the first public hearing, increasing the annual cost per parcel in the district by approximately \$25 each. Other than that, there are no differences in the project since the last hearing held. Attorney Schubel explained that Article 12 of NYS Town Law directs that when the Town Board receives an increase in cost for the project, it needs to be re-presented to the residents within the proposed district boundaries. The map, plan and report has been amended, the Order calling for this public hearing was re-advertised and a notice of the project has been sent to the NYS Comptroller's Office via registered mail. Attorney Schubel referenced the signed petitions requesting establishment of the district as submitted on February 17, 2009 and stated that the Assessor still needs to certify the value of the properties included on the petitions, contain more than half the value of the entire district. The Town Board did adopt the Order to establish the district at the regular meeting following the public hearing, giving Jeff Smith of Municipal Solutions the green light to begin trying to obtain funding for the district. Supervisor confirmed the town's intention of needing a bond to fund the project; Attorney Schubel will prepare a bond resolution for Town Board adoption. It was confirmed that the cost presented at this Hearing will be the 'worst case scenario' for the project. Any increase will require another public hearing. It was reviewed that the Town will provide a shut-off valve at each property. If the water main is on the opposite side of the road from the home, the line will be run under the road to the property. Supervisor Moy informed that once the project moves forward, there will be a map available at the Town Hall showing the proposed location for each tap. The engineers try to place the shut off valves for each property using reasoning from a visual inspection. Residents should come in and confirm placement is where they want it, or mark the map to have its location changed. Superintendent Swanger confirmed that the water meter is usually in

the basement, or if the home is back from the road, in a meter pit. The meter reader is outside the house so readings can be done from the road. Residents should determine waterline entry into the house in a location best for their plumbing needs. It was confirmed that the loan for project construction is for 38 years.

### HIGHWAY DEPART REPORT -

*Larry Swanger, Superintendent*

Superintendent Larry Swanger reported plowing and sanding the past month, working on equipment repairs and patching pot holes in the roads. Superintendent Swanger informed that one of the headstones recently fixed from the vandalism at the Munger Road Cemetery has been snapped off again; that it looks like a new break, not where it was fixed before. Last Friday, Superintendent found a water leak in a meter pit by the creek on South Holley Road. He saw the water bubbling and stopped to check it. The leak was over the size of a pencil and it was estimated to have lost a million gallons of water. The leak did not register on the meter and never affected the residents at that property. The leak has been repaired. The Town Board authorized the sale of the rubber-tire Drott Excavator at the Palmyra Auction in May, 2009.

Superintendent Swanger reported that he has already been picking up tires that have been dumped along the road.

### PLANNING BOARD REPORT -

*David R. Griggs, Chairman*

Chairman Dave Griggs reported the Planning Board's review of the Zoning Ordinance and Regulations to keep current. This year, the Planning Board will review the subdivision regulations. The following written report was submitted: 02/24/09 regular meeting \* The Planning Board held a pre-conference for a Site Plan Review SD09-03, tax ID #121.-1-59.02 for a three lot subdivision, LaDue and South Holley Roads, Doug Sutera. A motion was made, seconded and approved to declare this an unlisted action (short for SEQRA). Kevin Johnson & Georgia Fisher will conduct SEQRA. Several items were noted that needed correction or clarification. No other action taken. \* A motion was made, seconded and approved to approve renewal of Special Use Permit #96-005, Pets Galore, Nancy Curtis-Caswell.\* A motion was made, seconded and approved to ap-

prove renewal of Special Use Permit #91-016, Hard Times Gravel, Roy Kenyon. \* A motion was made, seconded and approved to rescind Special Use Permit #02-05, GMC Industries, Gary Casale. Note: Request to rescind made by the permit holder. 03/10/09 regular meeting \* The Planning Board held a pre-conference for a Site Plan Review for building lot approval SD#09-02, Bennetts Corners Road, Duane Feor. No issues were noted and applicant was informed he could wave the pre-conference and move to final approval if he so desired. Applicant indicated in the affirmative. A motion was made, seconded and approved to amend the agenda to a formal application. A motion was made, seconded and approved to approve the application for building lot approval. \* A motion was made, seconded and approved to approve renewal of Special Use Permit #SP96-002, Thomas Estates West Manufactured Housing Community, LLC. \* The Planning Board continued a pre-conference for a Site Plan Review SE#09-03, Tax ID #121.-1-59.02 for a three lot subdivision, LaDue and South Holley Roads, Doug Sutera. A motion was made, seconded and approved to declare this a minor subdivision. A motion was made, seconded and approved to declare this a minor subdivision. A motion was made, seconded and approved to declare a negative SEQRA declaration. A motion was made, seconded and approved to approve the three lot subdivision contingent upon receipt of applicant's portion of SEQRA form.

### SUPERVISOR REPORT -

*Supervisor Moy*

Supervisor Richard Moy reported the annual financial reports for the Town have been completed. Supervisor Moy and Superintendent Swanger did attend the NYPA energy conservation program presentation in Lewiston and found it pertains to buildings at least 400,000 square feet in size. Superintendent Swanger attended a radio re-banning meeting. Nextel is paying to replace the radios currently used. Superintendent Swanger reported that the highway department has one extra portable radio that is not used. Instead of having that one replaced, Superintendent Swanger traded its value for a three year extended warrantee on the 18 radios being replaced. The Clarendon Highway Department

alone has radios valued at \$44,000. Nextel is replacing all the radios in the county. When the signal is changed, police scanners for Orleans County will no longer work.

Effective 3/12/09, Time Warner Cable is a separate entity from Time Warner. Supervisor reported a public informational meeting scheduled for March 31st, 2009 at 7:00 PM at the Brockport Central Middle School regarding the expansion of Route 531. Supervisor Moy reported meeting with a representative of the NYS DOT and was informed that Route 531 will not be extended; that the project will be closed out and a new study will be done to better accommodate traffic flow at the exits. The traffic volume needed to warrant an expressway extension is 25,000 to 30,000 cars/day. A study done shows that Clarendon has 8,500 and Brockport has 15,000.

A partial payment restitution check has been received for the Munger Road Cemetery vandalism.

### **CORRESPONDENCE—**

#### *Supervisor Moy*

The Orleans County Planning Board has sent an executed copy of the 2009 Agreement Exempting Minor Land Use Actions from County Planning Board Review, as adopted by both the Town and the County.

The Orleans County Health Department has sent a letter, reviewing purchased water supplier responsibilities pursuant to the New York State Sanitary Code.

Supervisor Moy read aloud a letter received from the Medina Journal-Register requesting assistance in news coverage by faxing meeting agendas to the paper. The Journal is down to an editorial staff of two and can no longer attend meetings and functions as frequently and is asking anyone interested in writing submissions for the paper to do so.

The New York State Office of Real Property Services has sent notice that the Residential Assessment Ratio for Clarendon is 96.72%.

Supervisor Moy read aloud a letter received from Morgan Buck, Church Street resident. Morgan is 9 years old and her letter was in opposition to the swimming pool law asking the Supervisor to veto it. Supervisor Moy did visit Morgan at her home and explained that this is a state law. Morgan will visit the Town Hall on Friday to look through the New York State

Property Code Books. Supervisor Moy was very impressed with Morgan; she is very smart!

Time Warner Cable has sent a listing of programmer agreements due to expire.

### **OLD BUSINESS—**

#### *Supervisor Moy*

Supervisor Moy reported that new boundaries have been set for the Hillside and Holy Cross Cemeteries. The line was kept as straight as possible, but there are jogs. The survey has been completed and four pins set (roadside, Fiorito site, DeFilipps site and by the Chapel). Superintendent Swanger was asked to put stakes over the pins so the boundaries are easily seen and the pins won't get lost. Survey maps have been submitted to the Town (one given to Superintendent Swanger) and the language submitted to the attorney for filing. It was confirmed that there were 59 Holy Cross grave sites on Hillside Property, value estimated at \$60,000.

Supervisor Moy reported that Nick Penna has reviewed the proposed agreement with the Town to farm on Hillside Cemetery property. The Town Board approved the agreement with changes to include allowance for three acres of fruit trees and the right to harvest a crop should the Board decide to terminate the lease agreement. The lease will remain a one year agreement.

Local Law No. 1 of 2009 has been sent for County Planning Board approval. Action tabled until the April meeting.

### **NEW BUSINESS—**

#### *Supervisor Moy*

Supervisor Moy referenced the Town's procurement policy, as adopted at the September 12, 1995 regular meeting. The policy recites requirements for goods and services not required by law to be publicly bid, as to the type of quotes, proposals, etc. are needed pursuant to the amount of money involved. Supervisor Moy informed that spending limits for all departments without Town Board approval are not included in the policy and he suggested they be determined and added. Action was tabled until the April meeting; Board members are to review the policy for amending.

Supervisor Moy informed that two bids were received this year, to mow town properties; that it was the first time since he'd been in office. Proposal to mow the pioneer cemeteries for the 2009 season was accepted from Kingdollar Lawn Care,

4997 South Holley Road at \$2300 for the 2009 season; to include Maplewood Cemetery (Route 237), Robinson Burial Ground (Route 237), Christian Graveyard (Hibbard Road) and Cook Cemetery (Munger Road). The Board accepted bids from Fred Seeman III, Boots Road, Holley, NY 14470 to mow the Town Park at \$40 per Mow and the Town Hall lawn at \$42 per mow for the 2009 season. Fred was also awarded mowing of the Upper Holley Road triangle lot at \$15 per mow and the Water Tower Site at \$20 per mow for the 2009 season. The Board also accepted a verbal proposal to care for the Town Hall Gardens from Monica Beck, Church Street; for the 2009 season. Supervisor has informed Monica that the Board will pay \$300 for the job this year, as there will be nothing to care for around the building; just around the Gazebo and the front lawn flower garden. Monica was in agreement.

The Town Board signed Agreement for highway money expenditures for general repairs; as budgeted in Account DA5110 in the amount of \$297,580 for primary work and general repairs upon 43.91 miles of town highways, including sluices, culverts and bridges having a span of less than five feet and boardwalks or the renewals thereof.

Sandy Shaw, Director of the Community Free Library in Holley informed that the Library Open House will be held on April 4th from 1:00-3:00 PM. Clarendon residents were highly commended for the work done to prepare the library for use; Clarendon Boy Scout Pack 59 painted, Wolf Pack 59 moved books and the Holley School National Honor Society students helped too. Ms. Shaw informed that all the shelving units in the library were Eagle Scout Projects; Austin Boyd in previous years and Sam DeFilipps now. Everything is in the children's room now. It is open and being used. Director Shaw informed that the annual art show has been scheduled for April 13th, 2009 and anticipates 18 pieces will be submitted for judging. (See details for the art show on front page of this Gazette.) Councilman Al Robinson will again represent Clarendon on the panel of judges.

Superintendent Swanger informed that it looks like the CHIPS funding is going to be reinstated; Assemblyman Hawley and Senator Maziarz have been working hard on the issue.
