Robat, Morocco (AP)

About 10,000 Moroccans have suffered partial paralysis after using cooking oil adulterated with a machine oil from surplus U.S. supplies.

Detroit (AP)

General Motors Corp., whose auto building operations have been halted completely because of the steel strike, announced plans to recall about 10,000 workers in its Terstedt Division by November 23.

Houston (AP)

Fire and a series of explosions raked a tanker loaded with high octane gasoline and other fuels, injured 25 and leaving seven missing and presumed dead.

Jackson, Mississippi (AP)

The failure of a jury to do anything about a lynching of a Negro has brought an order that the federal grand jury take over the case.

San Francisco (AP)
