The second quarter produced a fumble by Rainier with Vernonia recovering and later scoring on a 20 yard pitch out around left end. The halftime score was 7-6.

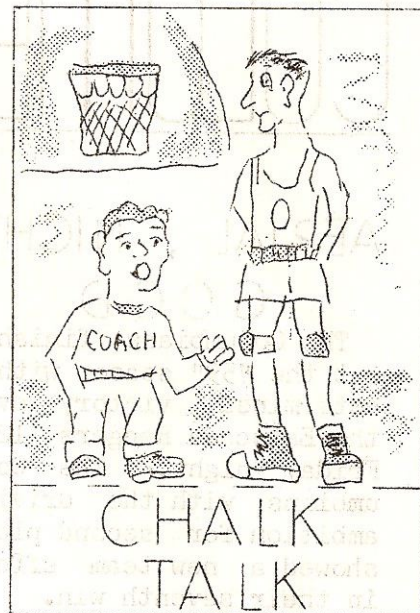
Rollin scored in the third quarter after picking up a fumble and running all the way for a touchdown.
