Eric: We noted that you guys are recording your Debut Album recently, would you let us know what do you wanna show us in this upcoming album? **You can expect to see a higher production quality, more energy and proficiency.**

Kaizer - "A real kick in the teeth is what we want"

Eric: What do you think about Ontario Black Metal Scene?

We think it's a real solid scene with a great variety of genres not just your regular black metal it's a really unique scene.

Eric: What do you think about your friends - "Deathmarch"?

They're great guys, they've been so helpful with us and we've helped them out. We're happy to share the stage with them when we do they're great guys we've known them for a while, it's kind of a mutual relationship

Eric: A lot of people said that "WOLVEN ANCESTRY" is the best Canadian Black Metal Band, what do you think about it? Do you agree with it?

That's a real controversial question wow... but you can't really say they're the best because it's all opinion based. They are one of the elite in the black metal scene for sure, definitely out on the top though but you can't really say they're the "best"

Eric: Beside Canadian Metal Scene, what do you think about European Black Metal Scene? For example Norway etc...

Kaizer – It had its explosion in the 90's.

Swedish is probably the best in our opinion.

Tom - Yah Swedish for sure but also middle European is going good and Poland.

Eric: Last question. What do you think about "Canadian Metal Support - CMS"?

It's an outstanding idea. It's amazing that someone so far from Canada can still have such an impact and support for Canadian Metal. He's definitely overlooked and should be given more support for what he's doing.

Eric: What can we expect to see from Panzerfaust in the next year ?

Kaizer - Blood, War, Death and some new songs.
