- Condone**- To overlook, forgive, or disregard (an offense) without protest or censure.
- Confiscate**- To seize (private property) for the public treasury.
- Conformity**- Similarity in form or character; agreement: I acted in conformity with my principles.
- Congenital**- Of or relating to a condition that is present at birth, as a result of either heredity or environmental influences: a congenital heart defect; congenital syphilis.
- Connoisseur**- A person with expert knowledge or training, especially in the fine arts
- Consanguinity**- Relationship by blood or by a common ancestor.
- Consensus**- An opinion or position reached by a group as a whole
- Construe**- To adduce or explain the meaning of; interpret: construed my smile as assent.
- Contaminate**- To make impure or unclean by contact or mixture.
- Contentious**- Given to contention; quarrelsome, argumentative, belligerent.
- Continence**- Self-restraint; moderation.
- Contraband**- Goods prohibited by law or treaty from being imported or exported.
a. Illegal traffic in contraband; smuggling.
b. Smuggled goods.
- Contrite**- Feeling regret and sorrow for one's sins or offenses; penitent.
- Controvert**- To raise arguments against; voice opposition to.
- Contumely**- Rudeness or contempt arising from arrogance; insolence
- Conversant**- Familiar, as by study or experience: conversant with medieval history.
- Copious**- Yielding or containing plenty; affording ample supply: a copious harvest.
- Corpulent**- Excessively fat.
- Craven**- Characterized by abject fear; cowardly.
- Crux**- The basic, central, or critical point or feature: the crux of the matter; the crux of an argument.
