<b>THEME:</b>	<i>Nothing is windy about this tourney!</i>
<b>DATE(S):</b>	Saturday, 1 July thru Saturday, 30 September 2006, 90 days.
<b>VENUE:</b>	<b>TBD</b>

<b>PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS:</b>	Participation is open to all CCGA club members in good standing. Special CCGA sponsor exemptions can be awarded after review of formal request presented to the Tournament Committee.
<b>ENTRY DEADLINE:</b>	24 June 2006. Special late entry reviewed and approved by Tournament Committee; entrant will be notified of entry confirmation.
<b>AWARDS BANQUET:</b>	<b>TBD.</b> (The CCGA hopes to prudently schedule tournament award ceremonies. This tournament's celebratory occasion may be combined with one or more other events.)
<b>FEES:</b>	No tourney fee will be levied upon CCGA members. Players are responsible for all fees associated with playing and for individual refreshments before, during, and after the round.
<b>PLAY FORMAT:</b>	<b><i>Team &amp; Individual Stroke Play, Chicago Point Quota – 18 Holes</i></b>  This is a two-person team event—no gender differentiation. Play requires each participant play one round with at least one other CCGA member who will subsequently attest that participant's scorecard. It is not necessary for the playing partner and the team partner to be the same person. Each participant will submit only one scorecard for the tournament round, played at any time during the tournament period.  Team scores will be posted for all club members to view as they are submitted to the tournament chairperson. This will be termed the Leader Board.  <b>Chicago System:</b>  Each player's round will be evaluated based upon a point system, then added to that of his or her team member's. The player is given a point-quota, based on his or her Course Handicap. Points are scored: bogey-1; par-2; birdie-4; and eagle-8. The team whose combined point total for 18 holes most exceeds its point-quota (or comes closest to it if no one exceeds it), wins! Find your individual point-quota opposite your Course Handicap in the table below and add to your partner's. Any handicap over 36 is limited to quota of 3:

## ENTRY PROCESS:

When possible, tournament entry should always be completed using the CCGA Tournament Entry Form. However, when necessary, entry can be in person, by email, by phone, or by any other communication media that is understandable to the average person. Entry should be submitted directly to the tournament chairperson *no later than the start date of the tournament*.

Once entered, the participant's name will be entered on the Leader Board, which will be published and updated on the Yahoo Group Files page or club website, once operational.

Once participants are entered on the Leader Board, opponents can contact one another directly to schedule a round as required by the tournament Play Format. All participants are responsible for engaging one another for scheduling an agreeable time to play and for obtaining tee times at the golf course. *The Tournament Committee does not provide any scheduling of player rounds.*

## TEAM OR FLIGHT FORMATION:

**Two-person teams will be chosen by lottery prior to the start of the tournament.** Player gender will not be taken into consideration.

**Team Flight:** Chicago point totals scores will be tallied.

**Individual Player Flight:** Chicago point totals scores will be tallied.

## RULES OUTLINE:

### (INCLUDE SCORING GUIDELINES AND ANY SPECIAL VARIATION OF THE RULES OF GOLF)

Standard Rules of Golf apply.

Each individual will coordinate a single round of 18 holes at the designated golf course with at least one other club member. The round can be played at any time during the tournament period. Once the round is complete, the scored must be attested by playing partner and forwarded to the Tournament Chairperson. See Score Posting Process below.

Men will play from the generally accepted Men's front course tees.

Women will play from the generally accepted Women's tees (typically red in color).

## RULE DISPUTES:

All rule disputes should be managed by the players to be best of their abilities during the round, using the Rules of Golf, 2004-2007 edition, published by the Royal and Ancient.

However, if a dispute exists after the round is completed regarding a specific rule's interpretation, each player will attest the other's scorecard using the individual player's written score for the hole and round, rather than the partner's desired score.

In addition, the playing partner will note the offending hole and score he or she believes to be correct. The card should be presented to the Golf / Tournament Committee for review and decision, with the Committee Chair having overall decision responsibility. A review by the committee and a response will be provided as quickly as reasonable. The Tournament Committee will utilize the *2006-2007 USGA Decisions on*

## HANDICAP CONTEXT:

Player's handicap indexes must be presented at time of tourney entry, which will be the handicap of record until tournament completion. The player's handicap for the course will be applied on a hole-by-hole basis prior to allocation for bogey, par, birdie, and eagle points.

## SCORE POSTING PROCESS:

Attested hardcopy scorecards should be presented to the Tournament Chairperson as soon as reasonable following the round's play.

When hardcopy of the attested scorecard is not reasonable, a scanned copy of the scorecard can be emailed to the Tournament Chairperson.

When a scanned copy of the scorecard is not possible, email the scorecards to the Tournament Chairperson. **Important:** *Each player's scores sent by email must be sent by the player's CCGA member playing and attesting partner. Email scores belonging to the individual sent by that individual will be considered invalid.*

**Essential:** Regardless of the form of the scorecard, a hole-by-hole scoring is required, with both gross and net scores reflected. Without this detail, the scorecard will be considered invalid.

## SCORING FOR INDIVIDUAL HANDICAP UPDATE PURPOSES:

All complete 18-hole scores should be returned to the Tournament Chairperson for handicap update purposes.

## AWARDS:

Awards will be issued for the following categories:

- Highest Team Points (Tournament Champions)
- Highest Individual Points (Honorable Mention)
