**Tournament Name:** *CCGA Inaugural Golf Tournament* – (updated 13 April 2006)

**Important:** This update alters the scoring system for the tournament, subject to a vote at the 9.04.06 General Club Meeting. Stroke Play still holds, using the Stableford Point system.

- THEME:** *Let's get the ball rolling!*
- DATES:** Saturday, 1 April to Wednesday, 31 May 2006, 60 days.

- PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS:** Participation is open to all CCGA club members in good standing.  
Special CCGA sponsor exemptions can be awarded after review of formal request presented to the Tournament Committee.
- ENTRY DEADLINE:** 1 April 2006. Special late entry reviewed and approved by Tournament Committee; entrant will be notified of entry confirmation.
- AWARDS BANQUET:** **TBD.** (The CCGA hopes to prudently schedule tournament award ceremonies. This tournament's celebratory occasion may be combined with one or more other events.)
- FEES:** No tourney fee will be levied upon CCGA members. Players are responsible for all fees associated with playing and for individual refreshments before, during, and after the round.
- PLAY FORMAT:** *Partner Stroke Play – 18 Holes, Stableford Scoring System*  
This tournament requires each participant play one round with at least one other CCGA member, who will subsequently attest that participant's scorecard. Each participant will submit only one scorecard for the *tournament round, played at any time during the tournament dates.*  
Scores will be posted for all club members to view as they are submitted to the Tournament Committee. This posting will be termed the Leader Board.
- ENTRY PROCESS:** When possible, tournament entry should always be completed using the CCGA Tournament Entry Form. However, when necessary, entry can be in person, by email, by phone, or by any other communication media that is understandable to the average person. Entry should be submitted directly to the tournament chairperson *no later than the start date of the tournament.*  
Once entered, the participant's name will be entered on the Leader Board, which will be published and updated on the Yahoo Group Files page or club website, once operational.  
Once participants are entered on the Leader Board, other participants

can contact them directly to schedule a round as required by the tournament Play Format. All participants are responsible for engaging one another for scheduling an agreeable time to play and for obtaining tee times at the golf course. *The Tournament Committee does not provide any scheduling of player rounds.*

Note: owing to various reasons, some participants may play two or more rounds with different tournament participants during the tournament period. However, only the first scorecard submitted in accordance with the rules will be posted to the Leader Board.

**TEAM OR FLIGHT FORMATION:**

Only the Leader Board flight will be tabulated. No teams will be formed for this tournament.

**Men's Flight:** highest points earned.

**Women's Flight:** highest points earned.

**RULES OUTLINE:**

Standard Rules of Golf apply.

**(INCLUDE SCORING GUIDELINES AND ANY SPECIAL VARIATION OF THE RULES OF GOLF)**

Each individual will coordinate a single round of 18 holes at the designated golf course with at least one other club member. It is not necessary that the playing partner be entered in this tournament event. The round can be played at any time during the tournament period. Once the round is completed, the entrant's scorecard must be attested by the playing partner, then forwarded to the Tournament Chairperson. See Score Posting Process below.

Men will play from the generally accepted Men's front course tees.

Women will play from the generally accepted Women's tees (typically red in color).

**Stableford Scoring:**

According to Rule 32-1(b.), the scoring in Stableford competitions is made by points awarded in relation to a *fixed score* at each hole. For this tournament, the fixed score is **par**. Score each hole—as handicapped—as follows:

<u>Hole Played in:</u>	<u>Points</u>
Two or more strokes over par .....	0
One stroke over par .....	1
Par .....	2
One stroke under par .....	3
Two strokes under par .....	4
Three strokes under par .....	5
Four strokes under par .....	6

Stroke Play rules of golf apply; therefore, each hole must be played and stroke-scored according normal handicap procedures before Stableford points are tallied.

*Example:* Player A has a *Course Handicap* of 16. That player's *gross score* of 5 on a par 4 hole, which is allocated as the 15<sup>th</sup> *handicap-stroke hole*, results in a *net score* of 4 (par). Player A receives two (2) points for the hole.

**RULE DISPUTES:**

All rule disputes should be managed by the players to the best of their abilities during the round, using the Rules of Golf, 2004-2007 edition, published by the Royal and Ancient.

However, if a dispute exists after the round is completed regarding a specific rule's interpretation, each player will attest the other's scorecard using the individual player's written score for the hole and round, rather

than the partner's desired score.

In addition, the playing partner will note the offending hole and score he or she believes to be correct. The card should be presented to the Golf / Tournament Committee for review and decision, with the Committee Chair having overall decision responsibility. A review by the committee and a response will be provided as quickly as reasonable. The Tournament Committee will utilize the *2006-2007 USGA Decisions on The Rules of Golf* as a major source for making its final ruling.

## **HANDICAP CONTEXT:**

Player's handicap index must be presented at time of tourney entry, which will be the handicap of record until tournament completion. The player's course handicap, *which must be noted on his or her scorecard*, will be applied to the gross score presented.

## **SCORE POSTING PROCESS:**

Attested hardcopy scorecards should be presented to the Tournament Chairperson as soon as reasonable following the round's play.

When hardcopy of the attested scorecard is not reasonable, a scanned copy of the scorecard can be emailed to the Tournament Chairperson.

When a scanned copy of the scorecard is not possible, email the scorecards to the Tournament Chairperson. **Important:** *Each player's attesting partner must send the scorecards to the Tournament Chairperson. Email scores belonging to the individual sent by that individual will be considered invalid.*

**Essential:** Regardless of the form of the scorecard, a hole-by-hole scoring is required, with both gross and net scores reflected. Without this detail, the scorecard will be considered invalid.

## **SCORING FOR INDIVIDUAL HANDICAP UPDATE PURPOSES:**

All complete 18-hole scores should be returned to the Tournament Chairperson for handicap update purposes.

## **AWARDS:**

Awards will be issued for the following categories:

- Highest Stableford Points – Men's Flight
- Highest Stableford Points – Women's Flight
