

COMMUNICABLE DISEASE

Your child has been exposed to the communicable disease highlighted below. Please note the incubation period and keep him/her home if symptoms develop.

<u>COXSACKIE VIRUS</u> (Hand, foot & mouth disease)	INCUBATION 3-6 Days	Raised rash, particularly on palms, soles and area surrounding the Mouth & inside, progresses to blisters.
<u>CHICKEN POX</u>	10-21 Days	Fever, cough, fatigue and general rash.
<u>FIFTH DISEASE</u>	4-14 Days	Bright red rash, usually beginning on face, "slapped cheek" appearance, Spreads to trunk & extremities, clears centrally looking lacey.
<u>HEAD LICE</u>	7-14 Days	Itching, white to yellow-brown nits attached to hair close to scalp
<u>HEPATITIS A</u>	2-6 Weeks	Nausea, fatigue, jaundice, abdominal pain, loss of appetite
<u>IMPETIGO</u>	4-10 Days	Flat, yellow crusty or moist patch on skin
<u>MEASLES</u>	3-14 Days	Fever, watery discharge from nose and/or eyes. Dry hacking cough, Bright red rash
<u>MENINGITIS</u>	Viral Bacterial:	2-21 Days 1-10 Days
<u>MONONUCLEOSIS</u>	30-50 Days	Fever, sore throat, swollen lymph glands, fatigue, possible abdominal pain
<u>MUMPS</u>	12-25 Days	Fever followed by painful swelling under jaw & in front of ear.
<u>PINK EYE</u>	24-72 Hours	Redness of eyes, discharge of eyes, discharge of pus from eyelids, swelling or puffiness around eyes, sensitivity to light.
<u>PINWORMS</u>	3 Wks- 3 Mths.	Itching around the rectum (worse at night)
<u>RINGWORM</u>	Scalp Skin	10-14 Days 4-10 Days
<u>RSV - Respiratory Syncytical Virus</u>	3-8 days	Mild cold like symptoms including runny nose, cough and fever. Symptoms may worsen rapidly causing labored/troubled breathing.
<u>RUBELLA</u>	14-23 Days	Fever, headache, sore throat, cough, rash.
<u>SCABIES</u>	2-6 Weeks	Patchy red rash with thread like tracks usually between fingers, on wrists, forearms, elbows, armpits, and/or waist. May have raised, fluid filled blisters intense itching especially at night.
<u>STREP THROAT</u> may turn into <u>SCARLET FEVER</u>	1-3 Days	Fever, sore throat, redness of throat Fever, sore throat, redness of throat plus rash inside of mouth (strawberries)
<u>THRUSH</u>	2-5 Days	Infection of skin, mouth or tongue that appears as white spots which can't be scraped off. May occur in folds of skin in diapered areas.
<u>WHOPPING COUGH</u>	7-21 Days	Cough worse at night which may be mild initially with characteristic 'whooping' developing in 2 weeks. Coughing spells may end with vomiting

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
