

Bearers of the Flame

Bearers of the flame is our own program developed for children ages 9th through 12th grade. As we're a new organization this program will continue to grow as we grow. Currently it is designed to introduce children to spirituality following the basic tenants that their parents are provided with by being members of the Cove of Light.

9th through 10th grade-This is for children in 9th through 10th grade in which activities are appropriately chosen for this age group developmentally. Teachers/Workers in this area will focus all activities, readings, and learning around the Cove's missions. At this level young adults are moving from their mundane world into how that world moves and interacts with their spiritual world. Young adults will begin to learn about individual paths as they express interest. They will continue to work in service projects that give back to their community. They will take a more active role in bettering their society around them by looking at ways to get involved in projects that do so. They will learn basic tools of pagan faiths and their elemental correspondences. They will begin to track their own spiritual walks in their mirror journals* of which their parents will be helping and guiding them with. They will continue their work with nature such as learning about herbs. These concepts will come through activities such as circle time, songs, readings, and art/play activities.

11th-12th grade- This is for children in 11th through 12th grade in which activities are appropriately chosen for this age group developmentally. Teachers/Workers in this area will focus all activities, readings, and learning around the Cove's missions. At this level young adults are moving out of young adulthood into the actual adult world approaching as they graduate from high school. They will now take an active role in deciding what their path spiritually will be. They will study that path in depth along side of their parents. They will begin to observe rituals done at Sabbats with their parents. They will continue their activity within the community but also begin to take on a more active role as they prepare to become of voting age. They will be encouraged to get involved in their community by knowing about how their community works. They are still doing service projects but these will now start to focus more on their adult profession. They will now expand from basic tools and rituals into more in depth the basics of paganism, their chosen walk, and how these interact with the mundane world around them. These concepts will come through activities such as circle time, songs, readings, and art/play activities.
