### Entry Information

1. Sweeps/Non-regular/Unofficial Obedience Class (must be entered in regular class or for Exhibition only)
2. If entering the same dog in conformation, obedience, sweeps or exhibition only please use a separate entry form for each class.
3. Attention U.S. Exhibitors: A Personal cheque will be accepted, however, it must be payable in US funds and for the full entry amount. Personally discounted cheques will not be accepted. Do not mark cheque "payable in Canadian" or "funds at par". Your co-operation is appreciated.
4. An INCOMPLETE ENTRY FORM WILL BE RETURNED. Please ensure that your postal code is included.
5. Exhibitors must abide by the errors made when making the entry, regardless how or who made the entry.
6. An entry will not be accepted unless accompanied by the required fees. Tendering of NSF cheques in payment of fees shall be considered non-payment of fees and is punishable by disciplinary action.  
ALL NSF CHEQUES WILL BE CHARGED A **\$25.00 SERVICE CHARGE**.
7. The CSSA Specialty reserves the right to reject any entry subject to CKC rules.
8. Only dogs, which are eligible for registration or are registered by the CKC may be entered in these Show & Trials.
9. Overpayment of entry fees up to a maximum of \$5.00 will be considered a donation to CSSA Trophy Fund.
10. The Exhibitor is responsible for knowing and complying with the Dog Show Rules of the CKC.

**CHAPTER 19, SECTION 7:** It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.

**Chapter 20, Section 1** A dog awarded WINNERS at a championship show held under these Dog Show Rules shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the determination of the number of championship points to be credited to the dog awarded WINNERS shall be provided here-under.

Section 2. The Schedule to be employed in the determination of points allocated a dog awarded a dog awarded "winners" shall be as follows:

Dogs Competing*	1	2	3-5	6-9	10-12	13 or more
Points Allocated	0	1	2	3	4	5

\*includes dog awarded "winners"

To determine the number of championship points earned by a dog awarded WINNERS, total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed, or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above.

#### **Conformation-- Move Up**

Chapter 13, Section 13.8 of the Dog Show Rules has been amended to allow a dog which is individually registered in the records of the Canadian Kennel Club, and has completed the requirements for a Championship after the closing date for entries for a show, may be transferred from one of the Regular Classes to "Specials Only", providing the request for a transfer is submitted to the Show Secretary IN WRITING at least one hour prior to the opening of the show, by the owner or handler.

#### **Obedience Trial – Move Up**

A dog that is individually registered in the records of the CKC and has fulfilled the requirements for a title, in accordance with Section 9.4.2 and 10.4.2 of the Obedience Rules, may be moved to the next level of Obedience competition providing the transfer was submitted to the Trial secretary, IN WRITING by the owner or handler, one hour prior to the opening of the first trial, trial schedule permitting.

#### **BITCHES COMING INTO SEASON ~ REFUND INFORMATION**

Entry Fees will be refunded for bitches that come into season after the closing date of the trials. To obtain this refund a letter from a Veterinarian must be presented to the Trial Secretary one hour prior to the commencement of the trials.

#### **Event Registration Number (ERN)**

Effective January 1, 1992, all dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and which enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events will no longer require a CKC registration number but will require an Event Registration Number (ERN). The ERN must be applied for within 30 days of the first day of entering a CKC event. Fee is 53.50 per dog. For further information contact:

**UNOFFICIAL CLASSES**

**Veterans Class-** is open to all dogs who have attained an obedience title and are 7 years of age prior to the closing of entries, and may not be entered in any Regular class. The exercises shall be the same as Novice.

**Brace Class-** is open to any two dogs of either sex which have attained no less than a CD degree in Canada. It is not necessary that the same person own both dogs, nor that they be of the same sex. The exercises shall be the same as those in Novice.

**Team Class-** is open to any four dogs of either sex which have attained no less than a CD degree in Canada, not necessarily owned by the same person. Five dogs may be entered, 1 to be considered as an alternate. However the same 4 dogs must compete in all exercises.

**Graduate Novice Class-** The Graduate Novice Class is open to any dog of either sex that has not gained a qualifying score toward the C.D.X. title in Canada, but which has obtained the title of C.D. in Canada prior to the closing date of the trial in which it is to be entered. Exhibitors may enter more than 1 dog in this class but must have a separate handler for each dog in the Long Sit and Long Down exercises when they are judged in the same group. The Graduate Novice exercises will be performed and judged as in the official Novice Class, except that the Heel Free with the Figure 8, Drop on Recall, Long Sit and Long Down exercises will be performed and judged as in the Official Open Class.

**Graduate Open Class-** The Graduate Open Class is open to any dog of either sex that has not gained a qualifying score toward the U.D. title in Canada, but which has obtained the title of C.D.X. in Canada prior to the closing date of the trial in which it is to be entered. Exhibitors may enter more than 1 dog in this class but must have a separate handler for each dog in the Long Sit exercise when they are judged in the same group.

**Versatility Class-** The Versatility Class is open to any dog of either sex that has not gained a qualifying score toward the C.D.X. title in Canada and at least 1 leg on the Utility title or that has obtained the title of U.D. in Canada.

**PUPPY SWEEPSTAKES- MAY 19, 2004**  
**JUDGE: MR. GRANT FANCEY**

Puppy Sweeps shall be for any dog 6 months up to but not including 18 months of age. There will be six classes in all, divided by sex.

**Junior Class** for dogs at least 6 months of age up to but not including 9 months.

**Senior Class** for dogs at least 9 months of age up to but not including 12 months.

**12-18 Open** for dogs at least 12 months of age up to but not including 18 months.

The winners of all six classes will compete for Best in Sweepstakes. A rosette will be awarded to first, second, third and fourth places in each class as well as to Best in Sweeps and Best Opposite Sex in Sweeps.

**VETERANS SWEEPSTAKES- MAY 19, 2004**  
**JUDGE: MR. GRANT FANCEY**

Veterans Sweeps shall be for any dog 7 years of age and up. There will be four classes in all, divided by sex.

**7-10 Years-** for dogs at least 7 years of age up to but not including 10 years

**10 Years & Over-** for dogs 10 years of age and over on the day of the show

Division of the prize money in Puppy and Veteran Sweepstakes will each be as follows:

25% of the total sweepstakes entry fees will be retained for administration.

15% of the total sweeps entry fees in each class will go to the Best in Sweeps.

10% of the total sweeps entry fees will go to the Best Opposite Sex in Sweeps.

50% of the entry fees for each sweeps class will be divided as follows:

**JUNIOR HANDLING- MAY 19, 2004**

Junior Handling registration will be at the Show Secretary's table in the morning, and must be done at least one hour in advance of the scheduled judging. Dogs competing in Junior Handling must be entered in one of the regular classes or in Exhibition Only. Classes to be offered: PeeWee, Junior and Senior.

**CONFORMATION JUDGING- May 20 & May 21, 2004**  
**JUDGE: MRS. CHARLOTTE MCGOWAN**

**OFFICIAL CLASSES (divided by sex)**

**Junior Puppy:** Dogs 6 months of age and under 9 months of age on the day of the show

**Senior Puppy:** Dogs 9 months of age and under 12 months of age on the day of the show

**12-18 month:** Dogs 12 months of age and under 18 months of age on the day of the show

**Canadian Bred:** Dogs born in Canada. Champions of any country are excluded

**Bred by Exhibitor:** Dogs owned and handled in the ring by the breeder. The handler must be the owner/co-owner and breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/breeder must handle the dog in this class, but need not handle the dog for further awards.

**Open:** Open to all Shetland Sheepdogs. Divided into **Open (sable), Open (Black) and Open (Blue)**.

**Veterans:** for all dogs over seven years of age as of the date of the show. The dogs will be divided into two age categories: 7 years up to but not including 10 years, and 10 years of age and older. These dogs will compete for Best of Breed. The winner of the Veterans Class will not compete for points but go directly into the Best of Breed competition. Dogs entered in this class may be spayed or neutered

**Specials Only:** dogs who are Canadian Champions only.

**Altered Classes" (dogs must be entered in an Official Sexually Altered Class)**

For all Shetland Sheepdogs over the age of six months who have been sexually altered by veterinary procedure. All CKC Dog Show Rules and Regulations shall apply to this class. Breed standards shall be followed and all

disqualifications shall apply. Judging will take place prior to the judging of Best Of Breed on the final day of the show. Judges shall disqualify any dog showing evidence of the presence of testicles or any bitch showing evidence of estrus.

**WINNERS ALTERED MALE**- any sexually altered male over six months of age may compete. Winner of all males judged together to be awarded Winners Altered Male. The second place male shall be awarded Reserve Winners Altered Male.

**WINNERS ALTERED FEMALE**- any sexually altered female over six months of age may compete. Winner of all females judged together to be awarded Winners Altered Female. The second place female shall be awarded Reserve Winners Altered Female.

**BEST ALTERED IN BREED**- the winners of each of the above two classes shall compete for Best Altered in Breed. Points will be awarded towards their Sexually Altered Canadian Championship as per Chapter 20, Section 1 of the CKC Dog Show Rules.

#### **NON-REGULAR CLASSES**

**BRACE**-Two dogs not necessarily of the same sex but must have identical ownership. Must be handled by one person on one lead. Dogs may be spayed or neutered.

**STUD DOG & Get**- Stud Dog & two or more of his get. Stud must be entered in a Regular class or Exhibition Only. Get must be entered in a Regular class. Stud Dog may be neutered.

**BROOD BITCH & Progeny**- Brood Bitch and two or more of her progeny. Brood bitch must be entered in a Regular class or Exhibition Only. Progeny must be entered in a Regular class. Brood bitch may be spayed.

**PARADE OF VETERANS**- any Shetland Sheepdog who is seven years of age or over on the date of the show may enter the Parade of Veterans. A monogrammed Rosette will be presented to each dog entered in this parade. All dogs must be entered in an Official Class or Exhibition Only.
