

MSMTA Junior Distinguished Music Achievement Award

This award for eighth grade students is designed to honor distinguished participation in MSMTA events accumulated during sixth, seventh and eighth grades.

Deadline: Documentation and application form may be sent at any time during the students eighth grade year, but no later than June 20, 2004. Plan at least one month from the time of application to receive the plaque. May 1, 2004 is the final date for submitting the number of plaques needed.

Award: An engraved plaque from MSMTA.

Requirements: An eighth grade student in the 2003-2004 school year must have earned at least 400 points from no fewer than five different categories listed on the application form during grades six through eight. To get service points, you need a signature by someone in charge of the event.

Eligibility: The MSMTA Junior DMA Award is open to students of any instrument. Events entered and/or won during, but not prior to, the 2001-2002 academic year will qualify for this award. No points earned toward the junior DMA Award can be used for the DMA Award. Students must enter a higher level for the DMA Award than the last level entered for the Junior DMA Award.

Application: Application form should be sent to the chair with photocopied documentation (i.e., critiques with the grade and signature of the judges, tests with scores, etc.) for all events. Do not send program listings. Documentation will not be returned. Mail to:

Note: DMA points are awarded for the quality of performance rather than for placement (1st, 2nd, 3rd, etc.). All critiques, competitive and noncompetitive, will include an evaluation of quality of the performance.
