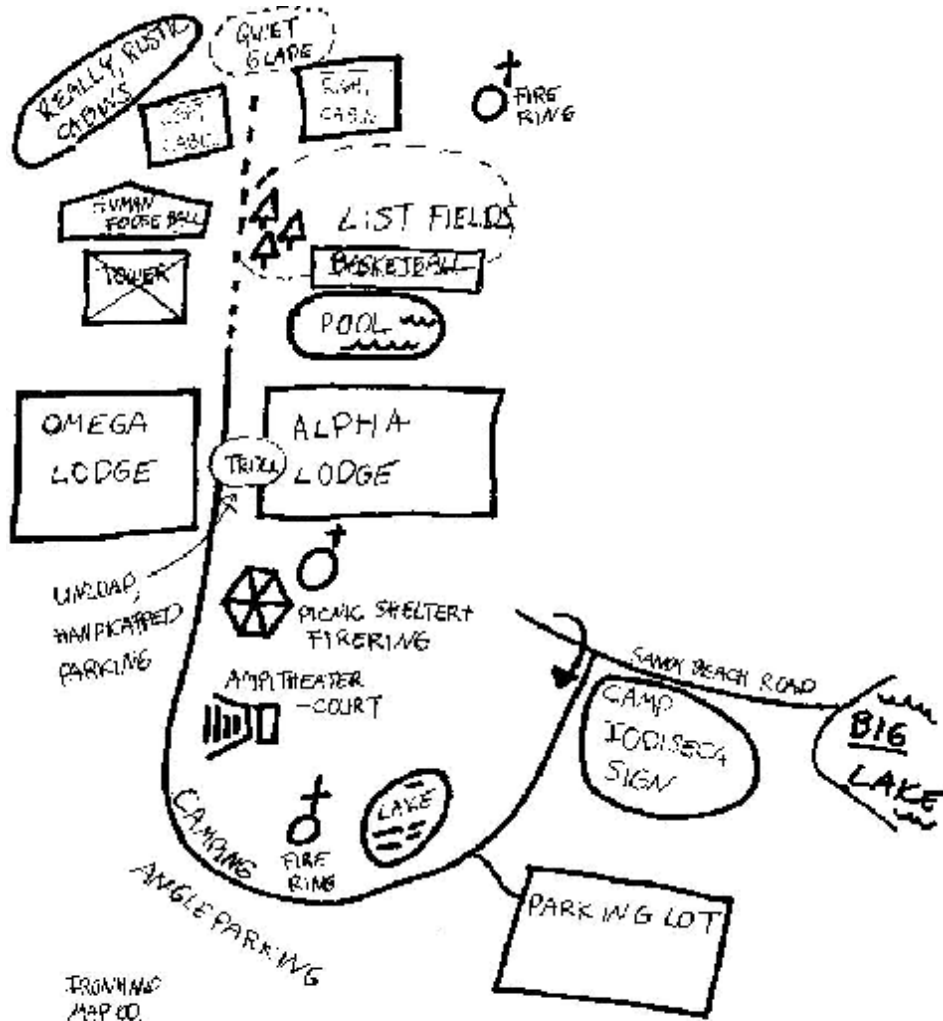

Authorizations:

Begins at 9:30 AM

Tournament of Chivalry:

Begins at 10:30 AM. This tournament of chivalry or TOC gives unbelted fighters the opportunity to fight against members of the Chivalry in a relaxed, non-competitive format. The TOC will be conducted as a bear pit but without the keeping of any points or tallies of victories. Fights are often the best of three or one all-out 'Crown level round.' The unbelted fighter and the member of the chivalry then have the chance to discuss the fights in a teaching environment.

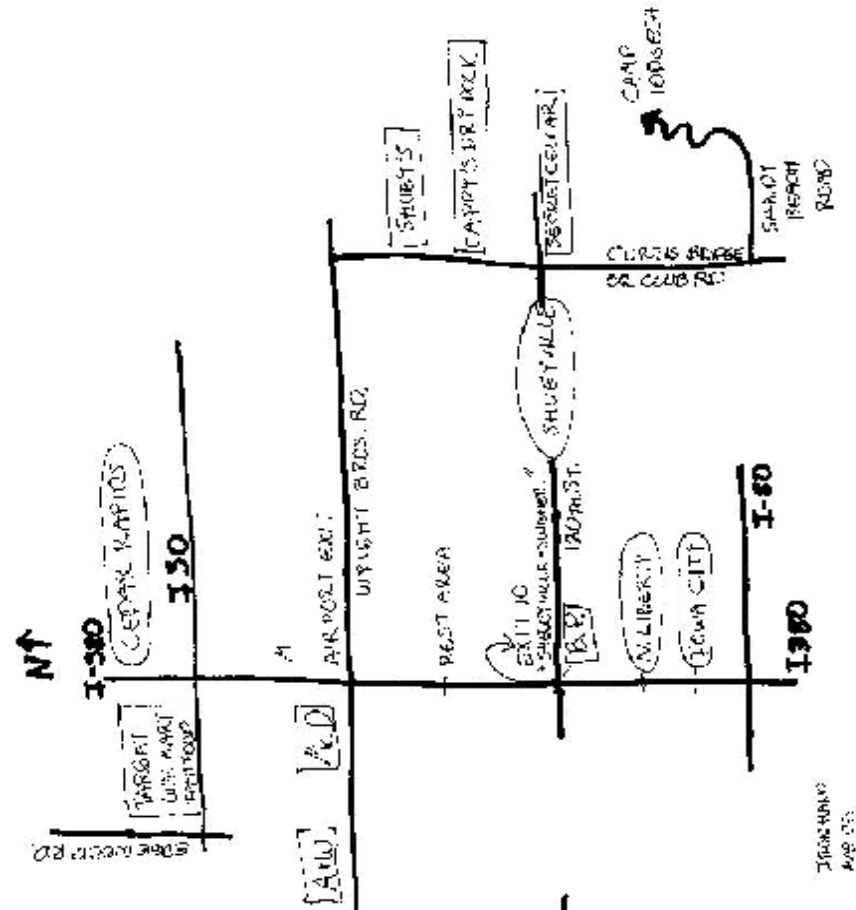
Open Tourney:

Begins at 3:30 PM or immediately after the TOC. There will be a standard tourney open to all present fighters and weapons styles. The victor of this tournament will receive a custom heraldic buckler from Grimr of the Golden Boar Armory. Format based on number of fighters and Royal preference.

Local Stores and Restaurants

Shueyville: east of Highway 380, from site o back toward I380, turn right at T intersection, continue on Curtis Bridge Road/Club Road. **Secret Cellar:** at flashing red light, liquor, soft drinks, snacks. **Cappy's Dry Dock and Shuey's:** farther along on Curtis Bridge Road, liquor and bar food

BP Station: on 120th St., gas, convenience foods, some fast food

Swisher: west of Highway 380, from site go across I380 on 120th St., main street is 1 block south.

Shelton's Grocery : small grocery. **Kava House and Kafe:** coffee, sandwiches, meals

Near Airport: return to I-380. Go north 1 exit to the Eastern Iowa Airport exit, turn left=west. A&W, gas and convenience store, MacDonald's, hotel.

North Liberty: return to I-380, go south one exit, turn west or left. Gas/convenience near highway . Sit down restaurants, grocery store in town.

Cedar Rapids: return to I-380, go north several exits. Take exit for Highway 30 west. Et off at Edgewood exit. Go north =right. Concentration of Target, Wal-Mart , fast food restaurants. Ask troll about specifics.

Artisans' Festival

Description of Classes

BARDIC (*Ms. Dorcas Whitecap, Ld. Ingeborg Ulfisdottir*) Open workshop. Do you have a song, story, poem or other bardic piece you are working on? Want advice, assistance and/or feedback? Want help documenting or making your piece more period? Want to learn some of the traditional Calontir Army songs and other post-vel favorites? We will be singing off and on all day. Teaching CD's will be available free of charge. Want to just hang out and listen to random and not so random performances? Come and pull up a chair and hang out for awhile. After all, what is bardic performance without an audience! Interested in writing poetry? Ingeborg will be teaching some basics of English, French/Italian, and Germanic poetic construction, hands on.

READ MAKING (*Katrine Josefsdottir*) Make bread from scratch to be served at breakfast. When done if you want to cook more, we will find something else to do.

CLOAK CONSTRUCTION (*Ld Cera in Fhedra*) Materials to construct cloak needed to participate in lab. Sewing machine needed. Discussions open to anyone.

WOMEN'S ITALIAN RENAISSANCE (*HL Suzanne de la Ferte*) Materials to construct garments needed to participate. Sewing machine helpful. Class open for discussion and problem solving.

SPINNING AND INKLE LOOM OPTIONS (*Ld Simone de lares, HL Brigida von Munchen*) Drop in all day workshops. See examples, get advice, work on a project. SPINNING will cover carding and drop spindle. INKLE LOOM includes rigid heddle, card weaving, double face, brocade.

HERALDRY (*MS Gawain of Miskbridge, Ld Einarr Grimsson*) Consultation table open all day. Observe or participate in the submissions process – ongoing all day.

NOT LIKE HISTORY (*Ld Angus de Botha*) In this two-hour class, the student will learn a basic overview of useful knots and knotwork. Practice materials available. To make a mat, 50 ft. of rope needed.

LEATHER (*Ld Eric Thorn*) Two classes. Limit 6 people each. No charge if you provide your own leather. Three Piece Leather Sheath: \$4.00 fee and should have knife to fit sheath. Leather Tooling: \$2.00 fee

METAL Forging (*MS Danr Ketilsmiðr*) Open workshop. Intermediate level. Demonstration and teaching of skills needed to make tools and small objects such as a blacksmith would make and sell to the general public to show skill. Objects will include a Thor's Hammer, Smith's Cross, animal head torque, leaf. Amount of time on the forge is limited based on number of students. Freewill donation appreciated for fuel and materials.

Metal Raising (*MS Grimwulf Harland*) Combination demonstration and hands-on. Amount of time for hands-on dependent on number of students. Noisy. May want ear protection.

Both these classes involve open flame. Wear appropriate clothing.

MEAD MAKING (*HL Cionadh na Cairrace mac Cosgraigh*) Discussion on making meads free and open to anyone. Preregistration necessary for the production portion *unless you are providing your own equipment and ingredients based on information published on website.*

TEXTILE TECHNOLOGY (*MS Aoibheann Pálsdottir*) Discussion and hands on. Technologies include (but not limited to) different looms (warp weighted, inkle/band, horizontal, draw loom, etc), knitting technologies (frames, needles, etc), spinning technologies (drop spindle, supported spindle, great wheel, flyer wheel, etc), Fiber prep (combs, cards, retting linen) other techniques that may be covered include naal-binding and sprang. This is an intermediate level class.

(IT'S ALL ABOUT) TOURNEYS List Table: (*HE Winnifred d'Artois*) How to set up single and double elimination tournaments, defining terms, randomizing the tree, and more. Heralding a Tourney: (*MS Dorcas Whitecap*) Honors at the beginning, presenting the fighters and tricks on pronouncing names correctly.

Lodging: we have lots of rooms in the 2 lodges and several cabins. All have bunk beds. Some have bathrooms en suite, others have restrooms nearby. Ask at troll if you have not yet reserved a room
