Desk & Derrick Questions & Answers

What is the difference between the regional clubs and the Association?

Desk and Derrick works on three levels:

LOCAL level – this is the Enid Desk & Derrick Club in which we are members. Meetings are held monthly and include an industry speaker and/or presentation, or some means of educating members in different aspects of our industry.

REGIONAL level – our region is Region VI, and includes 10 clubs from the states shown below. Region meetings are held yearly wherein members learn what is happening on a regional level, elect a Region Director for the following year, vote on regional business, discuss proposed amendments to the Association bylaws, and attend industry seminars and field trips to learn more about the energy industry on a wider basis, and make new friends and renew old acquaintances.

Regional Meetings are usually held in the Spring of each year and are presided over by the Regional Director. The location for the region meeting is usually determined by rotation among all the clubs in that region. Reports from the Association are given, and also reports from the various clubs on their accomplishments, future plans, and even problems encountered. Panel discussions, open forums, and buzz sessions, are also held which greatly help those in attendance.

ASSOCIATION level – the Association is the entire organization. The Association is administered by an elected Board consisting of: President, President Elect, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Regional Directors from each of the seven regions, and the Immediate Past President and Board Advisor.

The Association has a yearly convention held in various host cities. The business of Desk & Derrick overall is conducted at Convention and again you make many new friends and discover both the differences and similarities of our industry on a much broader scope. Field trips, and seminars are offered, and often times, Continuing Education Certificates are available for certified seminars and field trips.

What area does each region of the Association of D&D cover?

Region I	The north eastern part of the United States and eastern Canada	
Region II	The north central/eastern states	
Region III	The south central/eastern states	
Region IV	The east half of Texas	
Region V	The southwestern states from the west half of Texas to California	
Region VI	Nebraska, Kansas, and Oklahoma	
Region VII	Edmonton, AB Foothills, Calgary, Southeast Saskatchewan	Denver, Grand Mesa (located in Grand Junction) in Colorado.

DESK & DERRICK CLUB OF ENID SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM RULES

OBJECTIVE

To promote educational assistance to a member, child or grandchild of a member, and thereby encourage him or her to continue education past the high school level.

ELIGIBILITY

Applicant must be an active member or a legal child or grandchild (natural, stepchild, adopted or dependent) of an Enid Desk and Derrick member. Awards will be made only to those entering college or vocational programs.

APPLICATIONS

Application forms are available from the Chairman of the Scholarship Committee, and must be completed and returned to the Scholarship Committee no later than August 1 of each year. A current copy of enrollment schedule must accompany this application.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES, RULES AND RESTRICTIONS

Applications must be received by August 1 of each year. Enrollment schedule must accompany application. Scholarships will be awarded only to those seeking degrees in an accredited college, university or trade program. Applicants must include the name of the college or trade school they plan to attend. Full time students will receive full amount scholarship monies, determined by our Board of Directors. Part time students will receive scholarship money proportionally pro-rated according to the credit hours carried. Failure to maintain full time enrollment status as indicated on application after receiving a full time scholarship will prevent applicant from receiving Desk & Derrick Club scholarship funds the following year, unless reimbursement is made to the club. Any change in class hours that may affect the status of enrollment must be reported to the scholarship committee. The scholarship committee reserves the right to inquire as to the status of enrollment.

REQUIREMENTS

Member must attend at least four meetings per year, and actively participate in one of our club's two major fundraisers, i.e., working at the Enid Oilmen's Golf Tournament, or serving on the donation committee and attending the Silent Auction. Member must also attend and participate in at least one of the following Desk & Derrick Club events: March Desk & Derrick Awareness Month meeting, Field Trip, or Industry Appreciation Night.

AWARD PROCEDURES

The scholarship committee must receive applications no later than August 1 of each year.

Board members and scholarship committee review all submitted applications.

Checks will be issued to the college or trade school shown on the application. This form acknowledges your understanding that the funds will be applied to tuition fees or any incidental educational expenses.

I understand that receiving this scholarship money is contingent throughout the year to maintaining enrollment in the institution indicated.
