December 1 and May 1.**





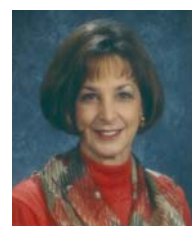

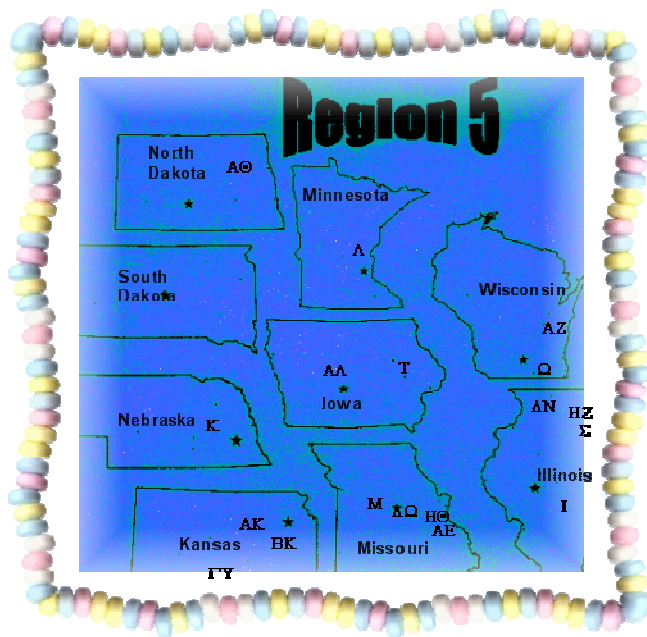
*Regional Housing Director
