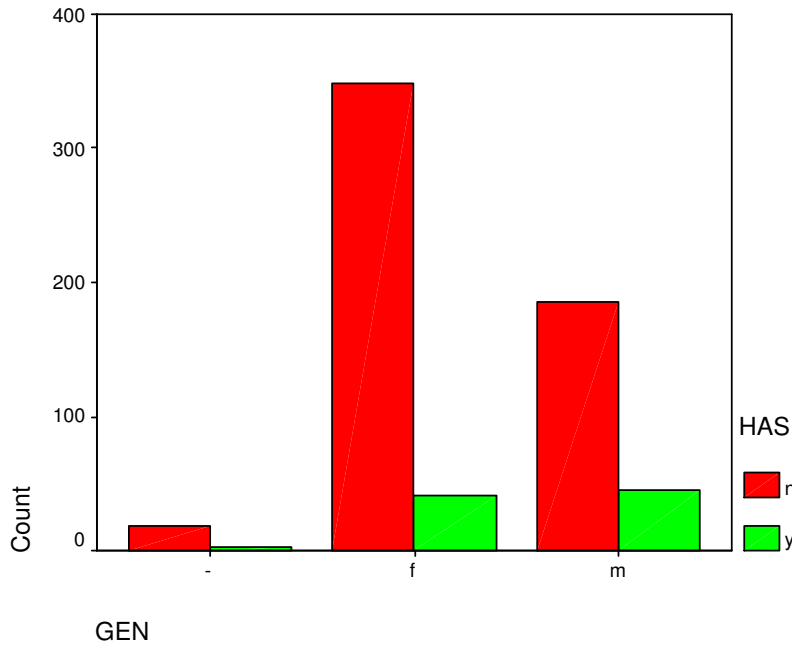


Appendix B

Question 1, Homeland Security Agent: Gender vs. Selection of Suspected Terrorist, Portrait A*

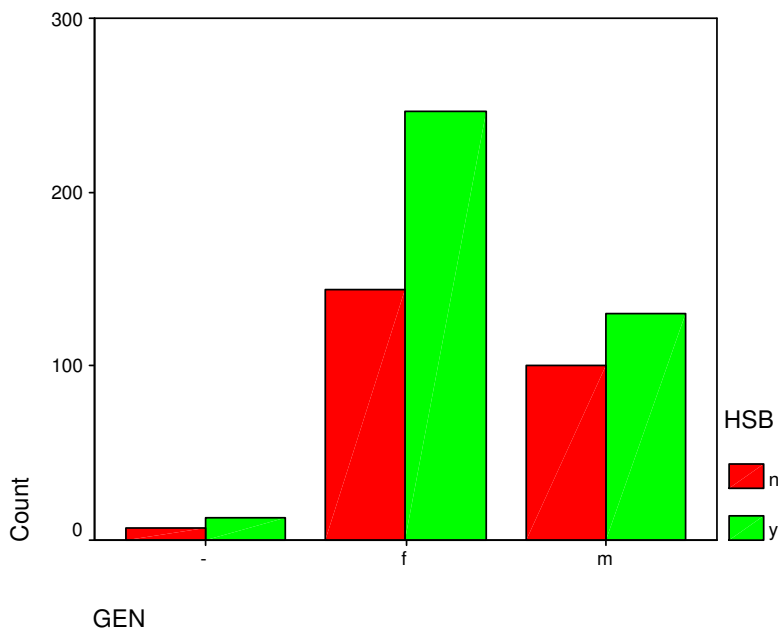


Please Note: Red means “No” (they did not select this portrait as a suspected terrorist), green means “Yes” (they did select this portrait as a suspected terrorist.) HAS stands for Homeland Security, the other letter stands for the specified Portrait, as in this case, Portrait A. “F” stands for female, “M” stands for male.

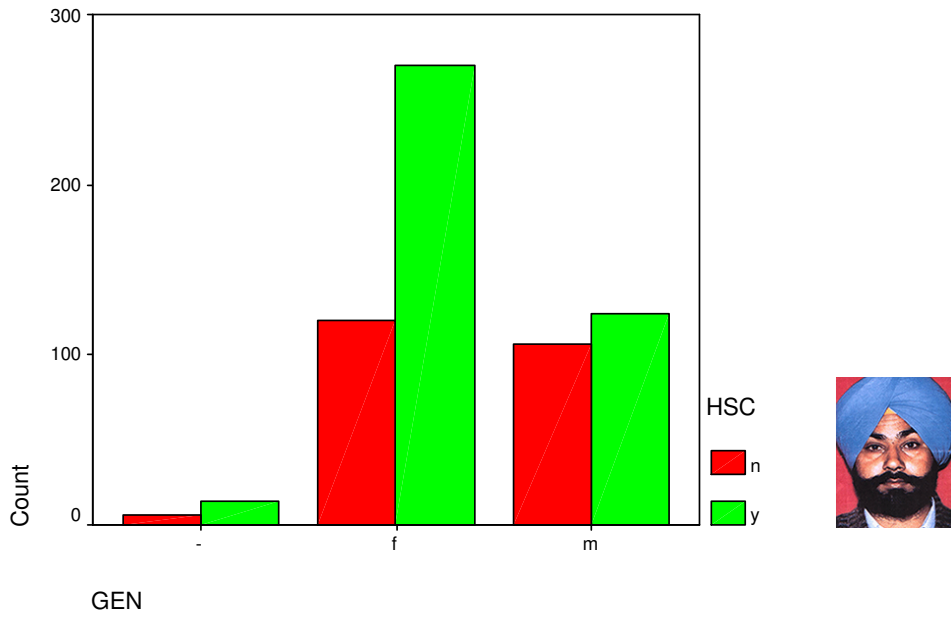


*The dash means for these surveys students did not indicate a gender.

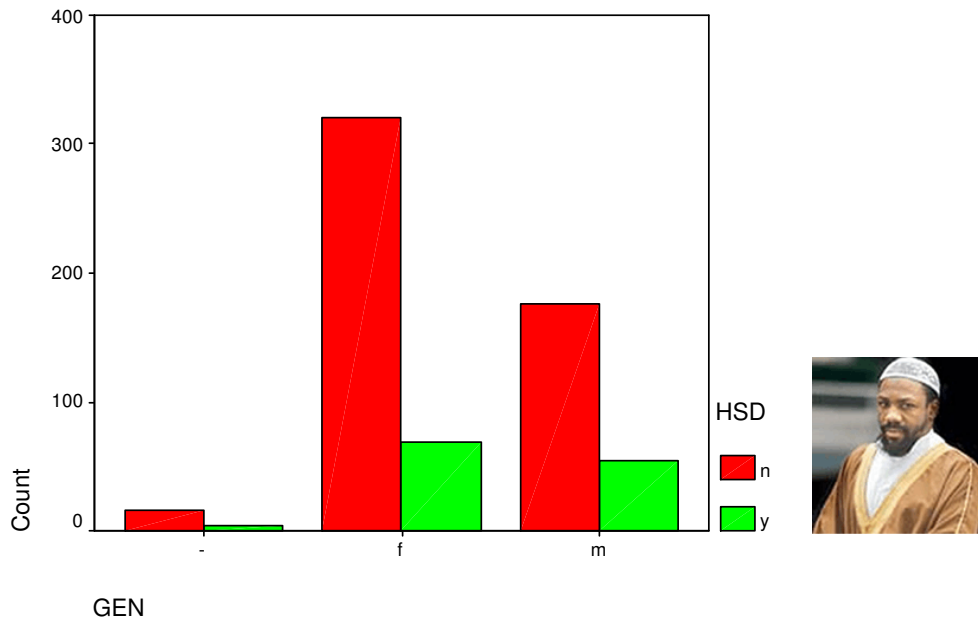
Question 1, Homeland Security Agent Gender vs. Selection of Suspected Terrorist, Portrait B



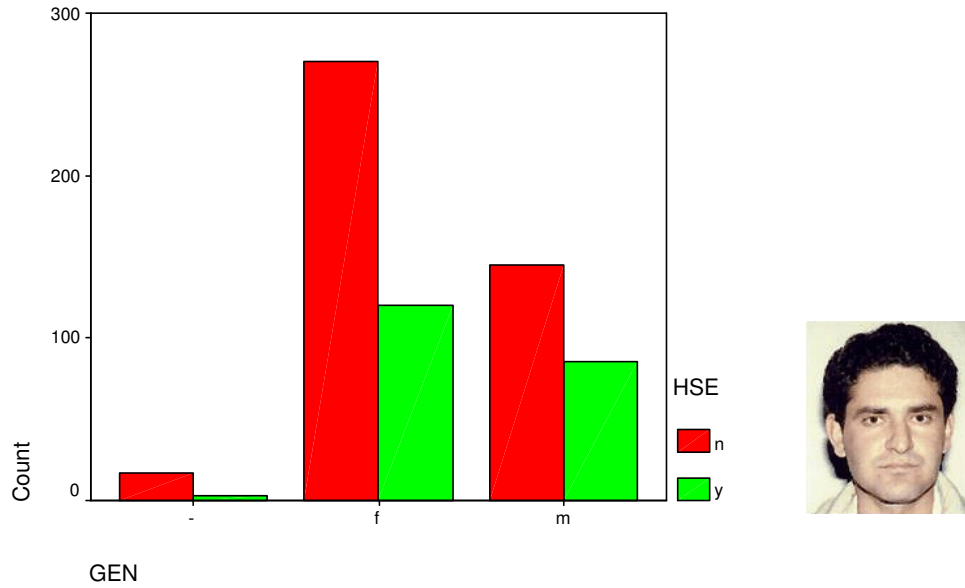
Question 1, Homeland Security Agent Gender vs. Selection of Terrorist, Portrait C



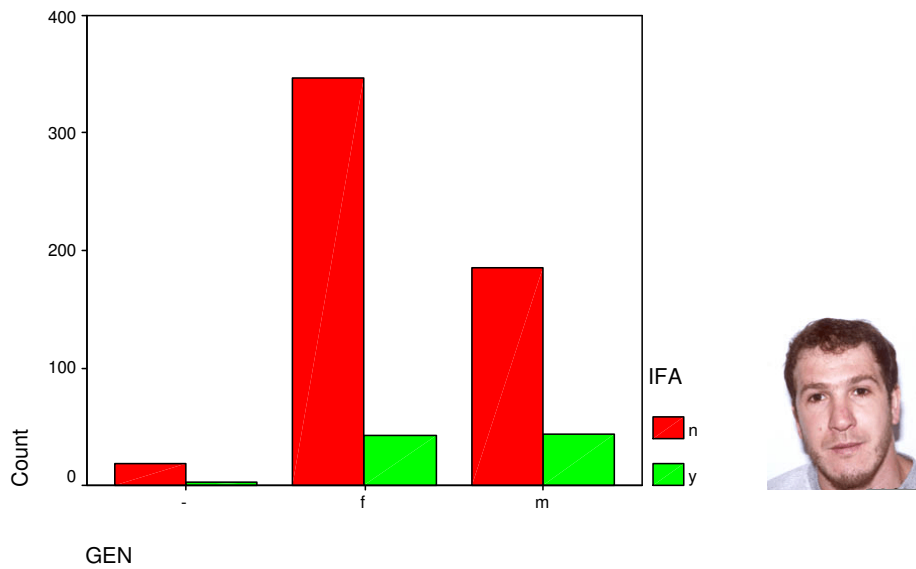
Question 1, Homeland Security Agent Gender vs. Selection of Terrorist, Portrait D

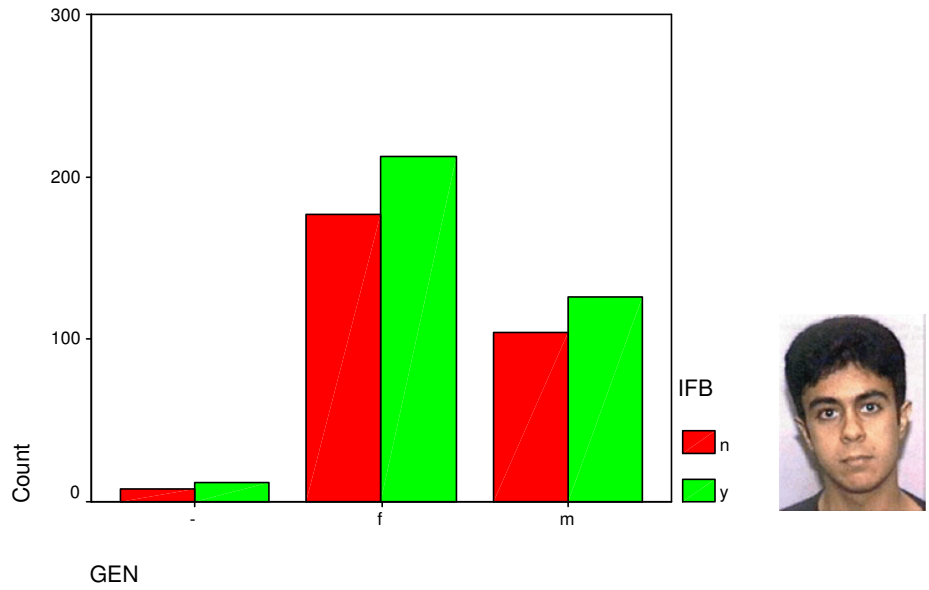


Question 2, Passenger Aboard an International Flight: Gender vs. Selection of Terrorist, Portrait A*

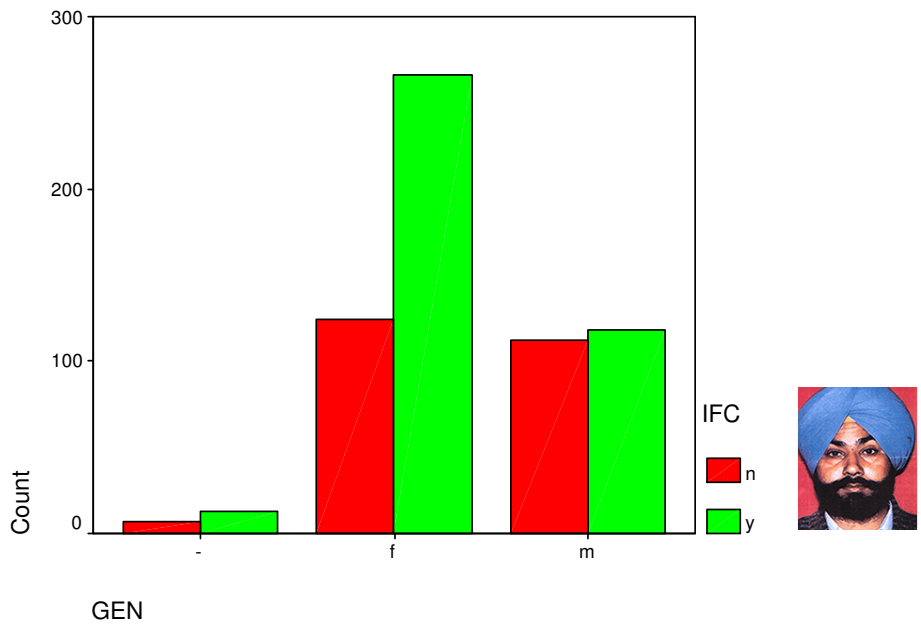


*IFA stands for International Flight, the other letter stands for the specified portrait. (In this case, Portrait A)

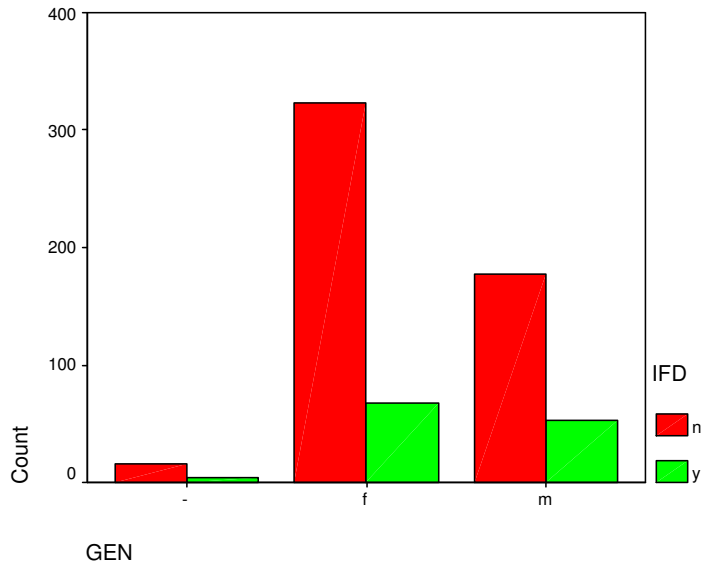

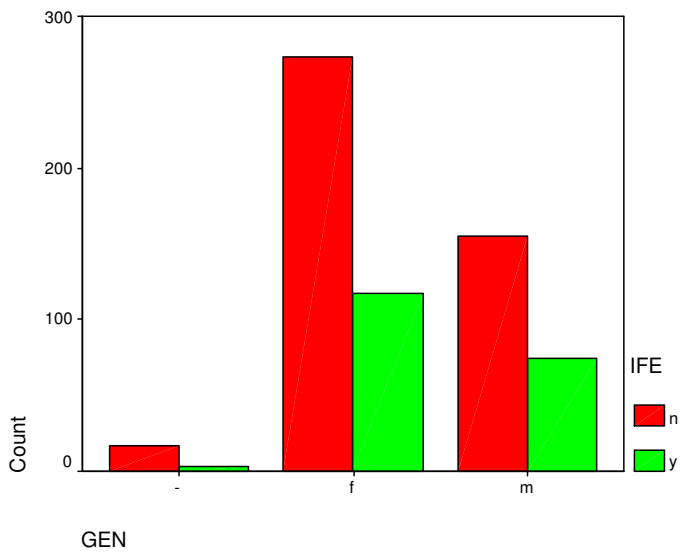
Question 2, Passenger Aboard an International Flight: Gender vs. Selection of Terrorist, Portrait C

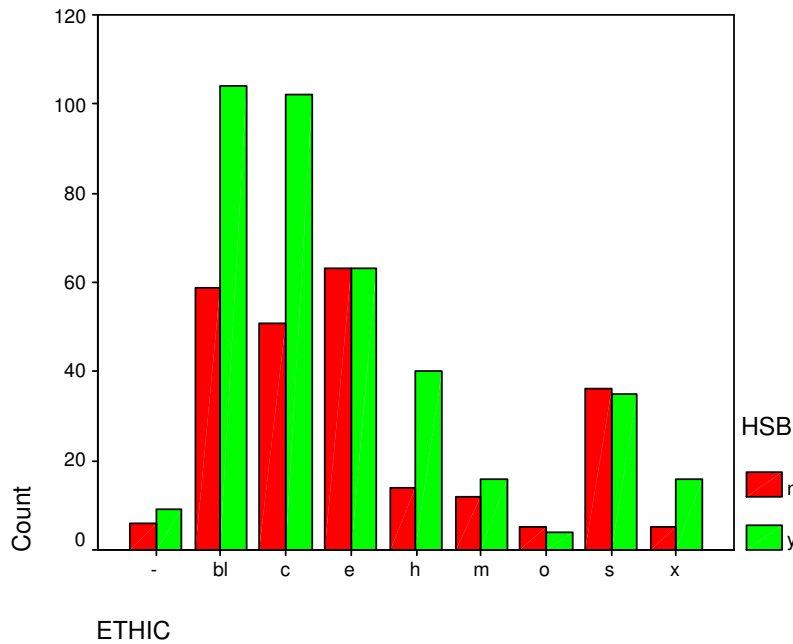

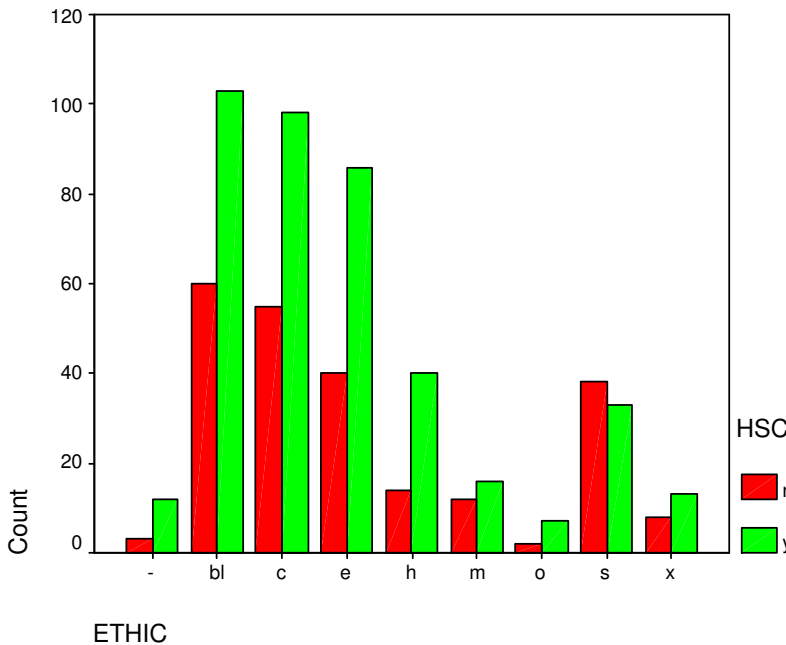
Question 1, Homeland Security: Ethnicity vs. Selection of Terrorist, Portrait B*

Please Note: “-“ means no identified ethnicity, “bl” means black/African American, “c” means Caucasian, “e” means East Asian, “h” means Hispanic, “s” means South Asian. Of the remaining ethnicities: “x” means mixed, “o” means other, and “m” means Middle Eastern.



**South Asian is the only major ethnicity to have more “no” selections for Portrait B, suggesting awareness of discrimination..*

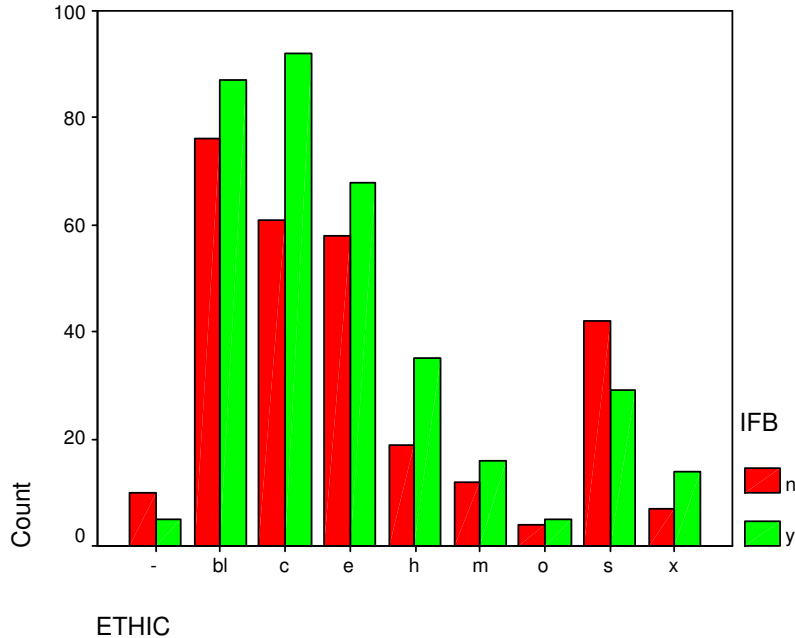
Question 1, Homeland Security: Ethnicity vs. Selection of Terrorist, Portrait C*



**South Asian is the only major ethnicity to have more “no” selections for Portrait C, suggesting the same awareness as in Portrait B, but also suggesting an understanding of the stereotype other ethnic groups may not have. Note in the next graphs that for question 2, which puts them in no role (question one asks them to imagine being a Homeland Security agent) the number of “no” responses increases even more for South Asians.*



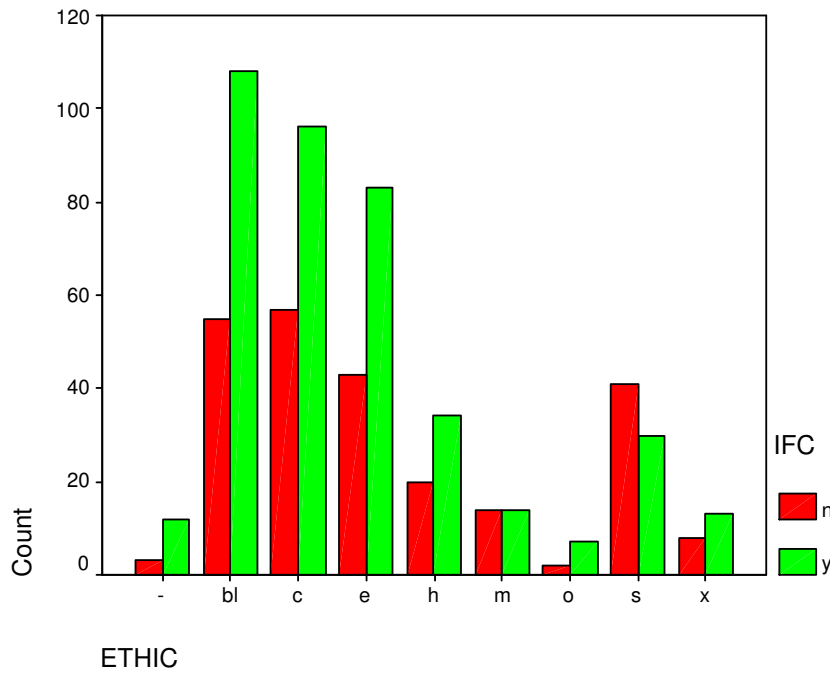
Question 2, International Flight: Ethnicity vs. Selection of Terrorist, Portrait B*



**When students were told they were Homeland Security agents looking for terrorists, Portrait B had more “Yes” selections. But in this question, when students were acting like themselves, “No” selections of Portrait B increase. This suggests that students may think the Homeland Security agent may stereotype Portrait B as a terrorist, but the students themselves would not.*



Question 2, International Flight: Ethnicity vs. Selection of Terrorist, Portrait C*



**In the question above, when a student is acting like his/herself, “Yes” selections decrease and “No” selections increase, suggesting that a student may not personally believe Portrait B is a suspect. However, for Portrait C, “Yes” selections actually increase, suggesting that students themselves would suspect Portrait C as a terrorist. However, “No” selections for the South Asian ethnic group increase, suggesting that South Asians generally do not believe Sikhs are terrorists.*
