## Father-daughter duo to perform at Pyramid Hill

Pyramid Hill Sculpture Park has long provided a place to view visual art. At 2 p.m. today, the park will provide art for the ears.

Hamilton's own father-daughter duo, David and Rachel Sams, will perform a mix of European and American folk music next to Lake Nanci at Pyramid Hill. The Sams, also known as Luna Tanz (it means "moon dance" in German), have been performing their act together for seven years. Rachel plays the violin and fiddle; David plays guitar.

David said he has played music professionally for more than 30 years, touring the United States and abroad. He

currently performs with the band New Europa Troubadors.

Rachel also chose to make music a career. She teaches violin and piano, and recently earned a degree in music performance from Morehead State University. Rachel also performs in a band. She and the other members of Mama's Bad Boys often perform on Sunday nights at Habits in Cincinnati.

The Pyramid Hill concert is free with park admission. Adult admission to the park is \$4, children \$1.50. There will be no concession or seating at the performance but those attending are encouraged to bring snacks and lawn chairs or blankets.
