- (5) The pressure exerted by the blood against the walls of the blood vessels, especially the arteries. It varies with the strength of the heartbeat, the elasticity of the arterial walls, the volume and viscosity of the blood, and a person's health, age, and physical condition.
- (21) The overall condition of an organism at a given time.
- (9) An obstruction or hindrance.
- (13) A pathological condition of a part, an organ, or a system of an organism resulting from various causes, such as infection, genetic defect, or environmental stress, and characterized by an identifiable group of signs or symptoms.
- (2) **1.** (v) To devote or give (oneself) habitually or compulsively: *She was addicted to rock music.* (n) **1.** One who is addicted, as to narcotics.
- (15) Pain in the ear; otalgia.
- (26) An unpleasant sensation occurring in varying degrees of severity as a consequence of injury, disease, or emotional disorder.
- (4) To emit or lose blood.
- (37) A hypodermic injection.
- (3) Discomfort or a pain in the region of the back or spine.
- (6) Breathing with difficulty; gasping: *was breathless from running.*
- (11) A sudden, involuntary, spasmodic muscular contraction causing severe pain, often occurring in the leg or shoulder as the result of strain or chill.
- (17) Lacking strength; weak.
- (1) A dull, steady pain
- (20) To restore to health or soundness; cure.
- (32) A written order, especially by a physician, for the preparation and administration of a medicine or other treatment.
- (30) An instance or occurrence of menstruation.
- (7) An injury to underlying tissues or bone in which the skin is not broken, often characterized by ruptured blood vessels and discolorations.
- (10) A thick, viscous, or coagulated mass or lump, as of blood.
- (39) A peripheral or secondary effect, especially an undesirable secondary effect of a drug or therapy.
- (8) A moderate but penetrating coldness.

- (14) Having a whirling sensation and a tendency to fall.
- (23) A swelling or small palpable mass.
- (27) **1.** Causing pain. **2.** Full of pain.
- (31) **3.** A pastelike mixture applied to a part of the body for healing or cosmetic purposes. Also called sticking plaster. **4.** *Chiefly British.* An adhesive bandage. --*attributive*.
- (36) **1.** Nearsighted; myopic.
- (43) A single complete movement of a threaded needle in sewing or surgical suturing.
- (16) An abrupt, usually brief loss of consciousness, generally associated with failure of normal blood circulation.
- (25) A sudden increase: *an outbreak of influenza*.
- (28) An agent, such as an analgesic drug, that relieves pain.
- (33) The easing of a burden or distress, such as pain, anxiety, or oppression.
- (40) Any of various inflammations of the tonsils, pharynx, or larynx characterized by pain in swallowing.
- (44) Evacuated fecal matter.
- (22) To cause physical harm to; hurt.
- (12) The act of giving birth; parturition.
- (24) A vague feeling of bodily discomfort, as at the beginning of an illness.
- (34) A mark left on the skin after a surface injury or wound has healed.
- (42) **1.** To pierce or wound painfully with or as if with a sharp-pointed structure or organ, as that of certain insects. **2.** To spur on by or as if by sharp irritation.
- (46) The state of being swollen.
- (47) To have a prickling, stinging sensation, as from cold, a sharp slap, or excitement: *tingled all over with joy*.
- (38) **1.a.** Suffering from or affected with a physical illness; ailing. **b.** Nauseated.
2. Mentally ill or disturbed.
- (41) A mark on a surface differing sharply in color from its surroundings.
- (48) **1.** The condition or quality of being weak. **2.** A personal defect or failing.
- (29) Free from complication or pain:
- (49) An acute contagious disease, primarily of children, that is caused by the varicella-zoster virus and characterized by skin eruptions, slight fever, and malaise. Also called varicella.
- (52) A burning sensation, usually centered in the middle of the chest near the sternum, caused by the reflux of acidic stomach fluids that enter the lower end of the esophagus. Also called cardialgia, pyrosis.
- (50) A viral infection characterized by inflammation of the mucous membranes lining the upper respiratory passages and usually accompanied by malaise, fever, chills, coughing, and sneezing. In this sense, also called common cold, coryza.
- (45) To excrete perspiration through the pores in the skin; perspire.
- (35) To shake with or as if with cold; tremble.
- (18) Abnormally high body temperature.
- (51) Acute myocardial infarction typically resulting from an occlusion or obstruction of a coronary artery and characterized by sudden, severe pain in the chest that often radiates to the shoulder, arm, or jaw
- (19) A pain in the head.
