 6. To create literature, write books in such a way so as to take forward the ancient theories by means of modern technology.
 7. Use of Sanskrit language for progress of modern technology.

In future the number of trustees will be increased. At that time, there will be a Regulatory Body of 9 Trustees and this Regulatory Body will be having all powers to look after the affairs of the Trust. Selection of the Regulatory Body will be by voting amongst all Members of the Trust.

- 3.1.2. Conservative Body: - Honourable Members in the country and world over who have established mark of excellence in their respective walks of life whose word is honoured will be required for the further development of the Trust. Keeping this in view, persons will be selected as Conservator as desired by the Trustees and as per willingness of the concerned person. Conservative Body will be having 5 Members and they will not have voting right.
- 3.1.3. Academic Council: - 15 Members from the world will be selected as Members of this council. For chalking out programmes of the Trust their guidance will be sought from time to time. (VR-No.)
- 3.1.4. Donator (V.R.No.)
- 3.1.5. Friend Circle: (1) Members have to pay annual fee of Rs.100/-. (2) As a friend, to extend help in the work of the trust. (3) Amongst the friend circle, two Members will work as Honorary Trustee for the period of two years. During this period they will have voting rights.
