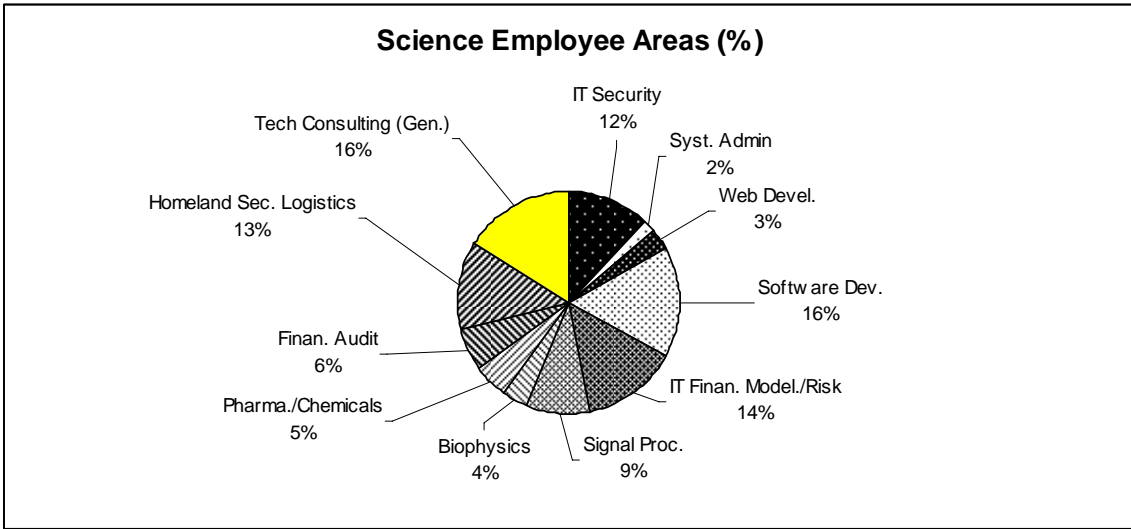

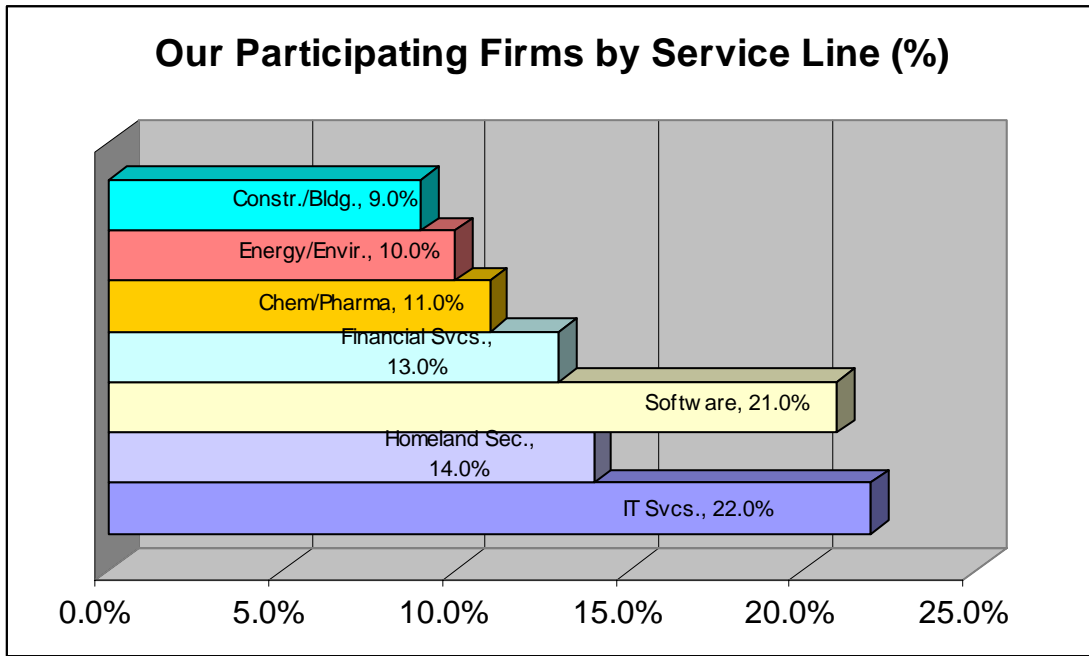
Aside from the index page, the Company section is the second most popular *drive by* based on reported hits.

working on signal processing solutions, operations strategy, and shaping business directions.



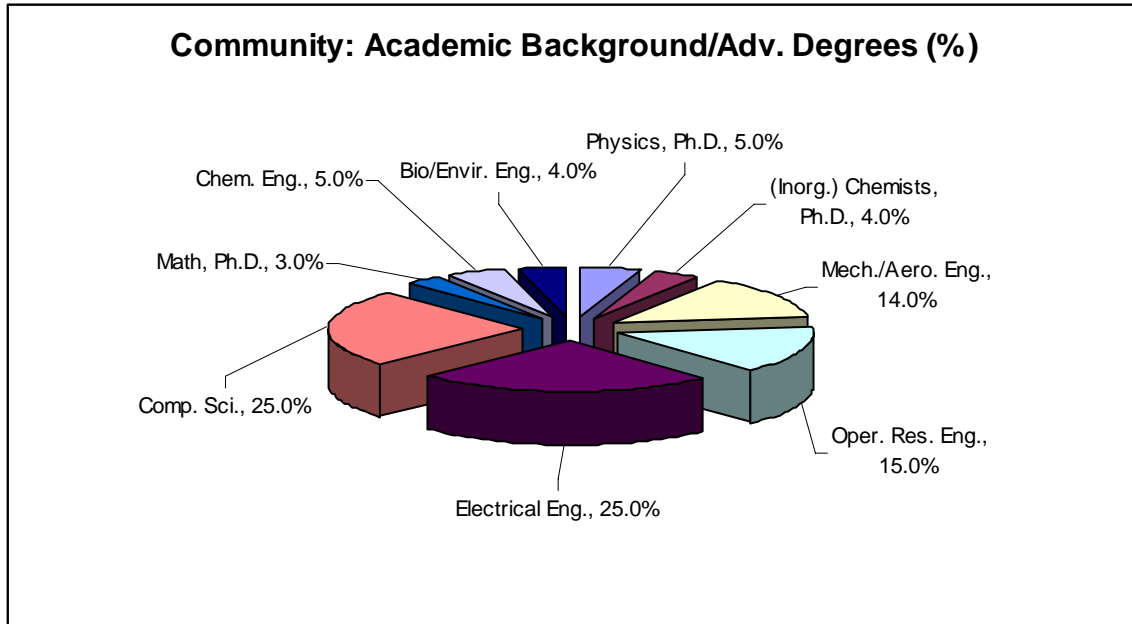
The product/service lines of these employee companies are:
