Please book early for the Christmas 'do' as Reg has gone to a lot of trouble to make this a great occasion.

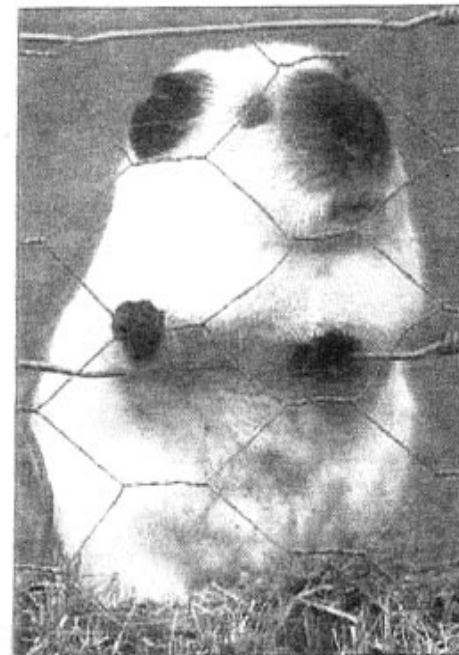
The run to Oamaru sounds like it will be a scenic trip on November the 28th

Guinea pig harem says 'hello Sooty'

A GUINEA pig called Sooty had a night to remember after escaping from his pen and tunnelling into a cage of 24 females.

He romanced each of them in turn and was yesterday the proud father of 43 offspring.

Staff at Little Friend's Farm in Pontypridd, South Wales, have now secured Sooty's pen — and begun looking for homes for the guinea pigs.

His owner, Carol Feehan, 42, said: "I'm sure a lot of men will be looking at Sooty with envy."

"We knew that he had gone missing after wriggling through the bars of his cage.

"We looked for him everywhere but never thought of checking the pen where we keep 24 females. We did a head count and found 25 guinea pigs — Sooty was fast asleep in the corner.

"He was absolutely shattered. We put him back in his cage and he slept for two days."

ASBESTOS!!

Possible exposure to asbestos is a hazard and covered by **The Health and Safety in Employment Act**. It's found in certain building products that used to be available in New Zealand, and in some automotive friction materials.

Asbestos can cause asbestosis (*scarring of lung tissue causing shortness of breath and coughing*), lung cancer (*caused from inhaling asbestos fibre, the risk being greatly increased in people who smoke*) and mesothelioma (*a rare cancer involving the lining of the chest cavity or the lining of the abdominal cavity*).

It's known as 'the silent killer' because symptoms can take from 15 to 50 years to develop. For this reason we don't know how many people in New Zealand have already been harmed but the acceleration of cases exposed is worrying and the number of fatalities and people living with asbestos related disease is not expected to peak until around 2020.

These days most new car brake linings are asbestos free, however some replacement brake linings, clutch plates and gaskets continue to contain asbestos - and asbestos replacement products may also be hazardous to health. So it's essential to use safe work methods whenever working with or near brake linings or pads, clutch plates or gaskets etc.



There may be asbestos in those brakes: safe work methods to remember

- Wherever possible use friction materials that don't contain asbestos.
- Where materials containing asbestos are being handled, keep the number of people in that area to an absolute minimum. Workshops should be isolated from other occupied parts of the building or areas that the public have access to.
- Work in a well-ventilated area (doors open/exhaust fans on etc.).
- Keep the work area clean to minimise dust exposure.
- Wear plastic coated gloves whenever possible.
- Wear an approved dust mask/respirator.
- Always remove any dust before parts are handled as asbestos dust accumulates during usage and can become airborne when cutting, machining, handling or cleaning brake or clutch parts.

Do this by:

- ⇒ Wiping down the area with a damp cloth prior to work (*keep the damp cloth in a container of water*); or
- ⇒ Using a specially designed vacuum cleaner and filter; or
- ⇒ Spraying the parts with a fine mist water spray before removing or replacing them.

NEVER use compressed air or dry brushing for cleaning purposes.

- Use hand tools rather than power tools, air tools or rattle guns where possible to minimise dust.
- Store removed parts in a plastic bag and wash hands after the job.
- Wear a dust mask when sweeping the workshop.
