Logan scores 49 in first half, routs JFK

UNION CITY — Ask just about any coach in the Mission Valley Athletic League about the James Logan High football, and the first thing they'll mention is what a great player Rashad Evans is.

Deservingly so, Evans is the No. 1-ranked senior in the Bay Area by Rivals.com. The can-do quarterback has scored several defenses this year.

Then the question comes up, "What if he weren't there?"

That was answered Friday

night as Logan hosted John F. Kennedy on homecoming. Evans, nursing a sore hamstring, had just one carry for 13 yards. As for the rest of the team, well, it wasn't too shabby, striking for 49 points in the first half of a 49-28 win.

"It's not just one person that has to step it up," Logan running back Danny Godfrey said. "We all have to do our part."

Godfrey did his part with 149 yards rushing on seven carries and a 62-yard touchdown run — all in the first half.

The Colts improve to 8-0 overall and 4-0 in MVAL action, and have won 13 straight league games. Previously, the Colts had won 40 straight league games — a streak that was snapped two years ago in a 49-28 loss to Irvington.

"Being 8-0 makes us work that much harder," Godfrey said. "We know the teams are coming for us. We don't take any team for granted."

That's a good thing because Kennedy (3-5, 2-3 MVAL) came ready to play. The Titans had the game's first score when

running back Jerrell Walker scored on a 19-yard touchdown run for a 6-0 Kennedy lead.

Walker rushed for 38 yards on seven carries, but he didn't play in the second half because of an ankle injury. Picking up the pieces was Trevor Bauchou, who gained 82 yards on 18 carries.

Logan would score 49 straight points before Kennedy scored another touchdown in the third quarter.

Kennedy tight end Steven Gordon had seven receptions

for 112 yards and a touchdown.

"We wanted to set the tone and come out and score," Gordon said.

Logan got two touchdowns each from Joe Bailey (three rushes for 74 yards) and Justin Brooks (two carries for 48 yards).

Logan host Irvington next week. The Titans wrap up MVAL play next week at Newark Memorial, and then complete the regular season with a non-league game at California.

Dream start for Gates as NM rolls

FREMONT — If Newark Memorial High senior Myles Gates were to script how he wanted to start a football game, it probably would have gone something along the lines of what actually happened in Friday's 49-0 win against Mission San Jose.

Newark kicked off to open the game, and Gates stripped Mission returner Hughes Chiang of the ball and returned it 10 yards for a touchdown. 10 seconds into the game.

As if that wasn't a good enough start, the Cougars forced Mission to go three-and-out when they got the ball back, and Gates returned the punt 65 yards for another touchdown.

"I was lucky because all my team-

mates did a good job blocking," Gates said modestly. "We wanted to come out and get off to a good start and, we did that."

The win moves Newark to 8-0 for the first time since it opened the 1985 season 9-0.

"We're proud to be 8-0," said Newark coach Rich Swift. "We're happy to get through this one without any injuries, and we got everyone in the game which is always nice."

After Newark took the 14-0 lead, it forced Mission to punt on its next possession, and Gates returned another punt to the house, but this time the 70-yard return was negated due to a block in the back, and the Newark offense took the field for the first time.

"When you jump up 14-0 on two

special-teams plays, it pretty much changes anything that you have planned," Swift said.

But since Newark runs the ball nearly every play to begin with, all that meant was that some of the lesser-used players were rotated into the game much sooner than usual. By the time it was over, 10 players carried the ball as Newark chalked up 389 yards rushing.

Quarterback Michael Gates was 3-for-3 through the air for 46 yards to help get the Cougars past the 400-yard mark of total offense. With less than three minutes to play — and a running clock in effect — Newark probably could have punched in another score, but took a delay of game penalty to back away from the end zone.

As good as the Newark offense was,

its defense was even better. The Cougars allowed minus-1 rushing yard and just 28 through the air.

Mission was coming off its first win of the season, a 10-6 triumph over Wilson Prep, but simply was out-matched against Newark. Next week, the Warriors play American before finishing the season with Irvington on Nov. 10.

As the season winds to a close for Mission, things may just be heating up for Newark. It takes on John F. Kennedy next week, before finishing the regular season with fellow undefeated James Logan.

"It's hard not to look ahead to that game (against Logan)," Myles Gates said. "But we know we have to get through Kennedy first."
