Camp Instructor



This year's Camp Instructor is **Adrienne Delph**. Adrienne is the current Assistant Coach at Capital University and the former Head Volleyball Coach at Kenyon College in Gambier, Ohio. A graduate of and former volleyball player at Bowling Green State University, Delph also served as a volunteer assistant with the Ohio State Buckeyes volleyball program in 2005. She also spent parts of the last two years developing Junior Olympic club volleyball programs as a club director in both Madison, Wisconsin with Wisconsin Power Volleyball Club, and in the local Knox county area with the Matchpoint Volleyball Club.

Delph kick-started her collegiate coaching career at Heidelberg College in 1991. After three years, she moved on to Owens Community College in Toledo, Ohio, to reinstitute the junior college program in 1994. She won 19 matches in her first and only season at Owens, and then moved on to Capital

University in Columbus, where she was an assistant who helped the Lady Crusaders win their first Ohio Athletic Conference title.

In 1997 she entered the Division I level as an assistant at Samford University, in Birmingham, Alabama, where again she helped the team collect its first-ever conference title. In 2000, Delph remained in Alabama, and served as the associate head coach at Troy University for four years. During that time, the Trojans had two 20-win seasons and advanced to the Atlantic Sun Conference Tournament every year.

Delph also owns head coaching experience at the international level with the Athletes in Action program in India and Africa. Now a resident of nearby Mt. Vernon, Ohio, Delph earned a bachelor's degree in Fine Arts and Art Education from BGSU and a master's degree in Education from Heidelberg College.

Facilities

The camp will take place in the Gilead Christian School. The gym has a high quality wood floor and ample space around the courts. It is the competition site for the Lady Eagles Volleyball Team.
