The House with a Heart

In the winter edition of the "House with a Heart" newsletter from the Ronald McDonald House, GWRRA was presented the Helping Hand Award for their invaluable support that they given to the Ronald McDonald house.

Some interesting information that was in the newsletter was:

They have collected over 550 million pop tabs, which is half of their goal of one billion pop tabs.

The pop tabs are taken to a local recycler where they are weighed and cashed in by the pound. The funds received from the recycled tabs are used to assist the House with operational expenses. All of the collections do add up to make a heartfelt impact in working together to provide shelter and comfort to families during their child's stay at one of the Indianapolis Hospitals.

It costs \$66 to provide a family a room each night at the Ronald McDonald House. On average, families are only able to pay \$5.20 per night. Our help allows them to continue to provide a caring and comfortable home-away-from-home to families regardless of their ability to pay.

I would like to say that it is so great to be associated with two great organizations such as GWRRA and the Ronald McDonald House and a great big **THANK YOU!** To everyone who has donated tabs and much needed items to the house. Our support does matter!

FOR RENT

Winter Riding

We're at that time of year when riding isn't much of an option. Ok, every once in a while the weather tends to get a little warmer and someone might call and say, "Let's get hold of everyone we can and meet at the bank parking lot to go for a ride?" It can happen!

Your motorcycle probably hasn't been ridden for a while. The temperature has been 32 degrees Fahrenheit, or below, and you know you'll have to put it on full choke just to get it started. Some of us don't store our bikes in heated garages. If I could, I'd park mine in the living room. Nobody uses that room, so why not? My wife disagrees with me, but since I'm the man of the house and whatever she says goes, I leave my bike in the garage, unheated. Here are a couple of tips you may want to know.

Regardless of whether or not you have an indicator that says your bike is in neutral, you should ALWAYS hold your clutch all the way in when starting your motorcycle. If your spouse won't let you park in the living room, what makes you think she will be okay with driving into the kitchen through the new access you made from the garage?

Next, and this one can save you pain and damage to the bike: ALWAYS hold your front brake (HARD) before dropping the bike into gear - even when your clutch is being held all the way in. Because you have a wet clutch, cold weather causes your oil to thicken and your clutch/flywheel tend to stick together after sitting for several hours with the engine off. Because of this, merely holding your clutch lever fully engaged is no assurance that when you drop into gear the bike will not jump forward unless you are firmly braked.

On our last ride (on New Year's Day), a comment was made about fingertips starting to get numb despite having heavy gloves, possibly even including extra liners. Open your first-aid kits. Pull out a set of latex gloves and put them on over the liners, then put your regular gloves on over the latex gloves. It's amazing how effective that simple idea can be.

(You do carry latex gloves in your first-aid kit, right?)

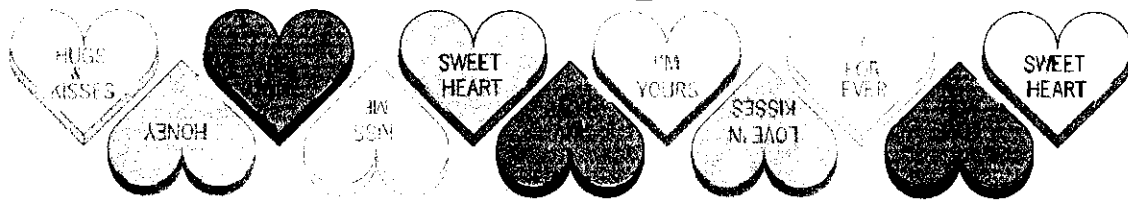
