

Grammar Assignment: Week 2 (Assignment 1)

- Verb:** a word that tells what action someone or something is performing (Ex: run, jump, sleep)
- Transitive Verb:** an action verb that directs action toward someone or something named in the sentence (Ex: Pat **carried** her books to the lecture.)
- Intransitive Verb:** an action verb that **does not** direct action toward someone or something named in the sentence (Ex: The temperature **fell** quickly.)
