

Naturalists in Training

The fall program includes 8 sessions: 1 Friday evening & 6 Saturday mornings at the Guelph Lake Nature Centre, plus 1 Saturday morning off-site. Nature educators will engage the young people in “hands-on”



activities involving insects, wild plants, invertebrates, birds, and mammals, and will guide them in exploring the natural environment. **Fall Program**

begins on Saturday, September 15, 2007, from 10:00 a.m. to noon, and continues on alternate Saturday mornings through December 8th. The last session meets on Friday evening, December 21st, from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m., for a campfire cookout and star gazing.

The cost is \$35.00 per youth for the Fall program, to a maximum of \$70.00 per family, if more than 2 teens are enrolled in the same program. The cost for the longer Winter program is \$45.00 per youth, to a maximum of \$90.00 per family. Each program is limited to 8 participants.

The winter program includes 11 sessions: 2 Friday evenings & 8 Saturday mornings at the Guelph Lake Nature Centre, plus 1 Saturday morning off-site. **Winter program** begins on January 12, 2008, from 10:00 a.m. to noon, and continues on alternate Saturday mornings through June 7th. Two exceptions are the Friday evening sessions on February 15th and May 23rd, from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.
