NEW TECHNOLOGY COLLEGE LAUNCHED IN

LEEDS. Hundreds of pupils and staff attended a special ceremony to mark the official launch of Corpus Christi Catholic College at Halton as a new Technology College. The Launch Ceremony, held as part of the college's annual open evening on 16 October, included a presentation by pupils and speeches by representatives of the college's key business partners. Two Year 7 pupils, Emily Holmes and Jack Davies took centre stage to unveil a commemorative plaque. The college formally known as Corpus Christi RC High School was granted specialist status in September, following a campaign in 2000/1 which saw the school raise nearly £60,000 in local and national sponsorship.

WHAT IT MEANS FOR STUDENTS

The new status means the college is receiving extra funding for the four technology subjects of Maths, Design & Technology, Science and Information & Communication Technology (ICT). Capital investment plans include the creation of a £35,000 Open Learning Centre where students, parents and local community groups can use computers and learn a range

of subjects. Headteacher at the college, Mike Woods, hosted the college lunch event and welcomed prospective pupils and parents who packed the main hall along with governors, staff and current students. He said 'Corpus Christi has seen many changes over its 71 years of history and we are now entering a new era as we become a technology college.'

Technology co-ordinator at the college, Allan Pearson, aided by students, gave a PowerPoint presentation about recent achievements in Maths, Science, D&T and ICT. They were also aided by a former pupil, Phil Driscoll, who is helping to install the new hardware at the college. He said that when they are installed Corpus Christi '...will have possibly the best school computing facilities in the country.'

Mr Woods thanks everyone who helped raise sponsorship money for the college and continued to comment that the new status would benefit college students and the local community. The EMB and the rest of Halton Moor and Selby Road estate would like to say well done on your magnificent achievement.

CLAMPERS CLAMPDOWN!!!!

Over recent months we have been working closely with a number of agencies to try and improve the condition of the Halton Moor Estate. One initiative which has been undertaken has been to work with the clamping unit of the DVLA to remove untaxed and abandoned cars from the estate which have been a problem in the past.

The wheel clamping unit have visited the area twice and are planning to make this a regular monthly occurrence where vehicles not displaying a correct, valid licence will be clamped and removed. If you are aware of any such vehicle please report them to the Police or your local Housing Office and we will pass the information to the clamping unit.

LONDON'S CALLING

During the Autumn Simon Swift, Housing Manager, and David Haigh from the Estate Action Team attended a 'moving on' roadshow in London. There are a lot of people living in and around London area who are looking to move to other parts of the country where properties are more readily available.

A number of Councils from around the country were at the event and it was an opportunity to promote this area of Leeds and the positive aspects of Halton Moor. A number of people were interviewed at the roadshow who are wanting to move to Leeds and expressed a specific interest in Halton Moor. This could bring new families into the area and help to reduce the numbers of empty properties.

HALTON MOOR BENEFITS FROM NEIGHBOURHOOD WARDEN

In the New Year a Neighbourhood Warden will be appointed to work in the area covering the Halton Moor and Selby Road Estates. This is a partnership project along with our neighbours on the William Sutton Trust Estate.

The Warden will be a visible patrol in the area who will deal with aspects of antisocial behaviour. They will undertake regular patrols, identify and take action to resolve areas of concern such as rubbish dumping, vandalism etc.

The Warden will work closely with the Housing Office and Police to report and instigate action against individuals causing anti-social behaviour in the area. The warden is a welcome addition to the good work which is already going on in the area.

William Sutton Update

A Sutton Estate for the 21st Century

Residents on the Sutton Estate have agreed a three-part strategy to keep the estate a 'good place to live'. This includes

- Demolition of unpopular, 'hard-to-let' flats and bungalows
- Further improvements to remaining homes
- Improving the environment and community facilities
- Involving residents at all stages

Wherever we can this is being done in co-operation with the EMB and the residents of Halton Moor so we can contribute to, and benefit from, the improvement of the area as a whole.

Home Improvement

Work to improve security, increase insulation, modernise kitchens and upgrade electrics will make sure that all our homes meet or exceed the new 'decent' standard set by the government.

A better place to live

Work has now begun on a major programme of environmental improvements to streets on the estate. This follows the improvement to the central area, now complete and worth a visit.

Home Zones are where the Heart is

The work to the central area included a new community hall and multi-use games area. The next phase, affecting Carden and Kyffin Avenues will provide traffic calming, improved off-street parking and boundary wall improvements. For future phases residents will be considering whether they want to create "Home Zones" where streets are designed to be safer and more pleasant for residents, pedestrians, cyclists, children and pets. As with the Community Safety initiatives we will be developing this approach in partnership with Halton Moor EMB with a view to a joint bid for funding and an integrated scheme.

Stop Press.....

Selby Road Community Association have been successful in obtaining Housing

Corporation funding to employ Partners in Change to develop a project to encourage more tenants to have a say and get actively involved in what happens on their estate. A similar project is happening on Halton Moor and this will help to develop a joint approach to community investment and tenant involvement that will benefit both estates.



Combined Response Team

Crime - Come on Down

It is a fact that crime levels are falling. This is true on a national level, on a force wide level and more importantly to the community of Halton Moor, on a divisional level.

On Halton Moor the crime levels are 7% lower this year than at the same time last year. Significant reductions are apparent with regards to violent

crime and certain categories of burglary. However, it is clear that despite such reductions, the 'fear of crime' within the community is still high as the majority of residents on the estate are intimidated by the criminal activities of the few.

Information received either by telephone, letter or personal contact is strictly monitored and is available only to a key Police Officer working within the Intelligence Unit at the Police station. At no stage will an investigating Officer have access to the identity of the confidential source.

Claim a Reward!!

You may of heard of Crimestoppers. It is a national initiative using the media to attract information from members of the public which may lead to a reward in the process. You can telephone the number listed below and speak to an operator in complete confidence. The crimestoppers office is unable to use the 1471 facility and therefore calls cannot be traced. If an arrest has been made as a result of the information supplied, a reward is considered, the size of which is determined by the seriousness of the incident, property recovered or persons arrested. The whole matter including the payment of any subsequent reward is conducted in confidence. Help is needed to address the criminal activities of the few. To do this we need the help of the community at large. Please consider these initiatives. They are here to help you.

The Combined Response Team have recently obtained an Injunction with a Power of Arrest against a 17 year old male who was causing physical violence to a resident on Halton Moor. This is the first time in Leeds that an injunction with the Power of Arrest has been issued against an individual aged under 18 years. In addition to the above, further legal action in the form of Anti Social Behaviour Orders is presently being sought against named youths who are involved in burglaries and vehicle related crimes on Halton Moor.
