Someday a petty official will appear with a piece of paper, called a land title, which states that the University of California owns the land of the People's Park. Where did that piece of paper come from? What is it worth?

A long time ago the Costanoan Indians lived in the area now called Berkeley. They had no concept of land ownership. They believed that the land was under the care and guardianship of the people who used it and lived on it.

Catholic missionaries took the land away from the Indians. No agreements were made. No papers were signed. They ripped it off in the name of God.

The Mexican Government took the land away from the Church. The Mexican Government had guns and an army. God's word was not as strong.

KKK Linked to Atlanta Child Murders



On October 8 and 9, hearings were held in Butts County, Georgia to take up a request for a retrial for Wayne Williams, the man accused and convicted of the Atlanta child murders. The lawyers for Williams say that his 1982 conviction should be overturned because crucial evidence was kept from the defense at that time. The evidence includes information linking the KKK to the child murders—information which the government, intelligence and police agencies know about at the time. The hearings for retrial is bringing new focus on this KKK connection.

The Railroad of Wayne Williams

From 1979 there was a string of disappearances and murders of Black children and youth in Atlanta. The police at first even refused to recognize that the string of murders was connected. But the killings continued—and outrage mounted among

the cause of death was "homicide."

But there was no even bigger outrage in the trial. Between February to April of 1981 the Georgia Bureau of Investigation (GBI) had conducted a secret investigation which came up with concrete evidence of KKK involvement in the Atlanta murders. None of this evidence was allowed to come out publicly. Wayne Williams was convicted on less evidence than the government had on the KKK. If the powers had brought out any of the facts about the Klan involvement, Williams would never have been convicted.

After Williams was convicted, 23 of the 28 officially recognized Atlanta child murder cases were declared closed. (Some independent investigators place the number of murdered youth at more than 50). No actual evidence showing that Williams had contact with, let alone killed, any of the victims was ever presented.

Squatters move to empty lot across the street, protest towers

Displaced squatters from People's Park have colonized an empty lot across the street and apparently neither the city of Berkeley nor the University of California has the authority to take action against them.

"We felt like taking another piece of land," said Yukon Hannibal, a leader of the "People's Park Annex" project on the former site of the Berkeley Inn, which was razed after fire destroyed it last October.

Berkeley officials say neither the city nor the university have jurisdiction over the lot, located at the corner of Haste Street and Telegraph Avenue and owned by businessman Edgar Daine.

On Saturday, about 50 people moved in and began breaking up the lot's concrete foundation. Since then, they also have begun to adorn the dusty parcel with flowering plants and graffiti.

"We're making something green and growing and cool in the midst of an eyecore," said Jim

Beatty, who transplanted a young plum tree from People's Park to the annex.

Using bricks left from the Inn and ash and dirt mixed with water as mortar, they built small islands in the dirt and planted them with marigolds and snapdragons.

Some people were constructing a barbecue pit. Elsewhere, bricks line a small, curved patch of freshly planted grass and a hand-painted sign propped against a tree in the middle of the lot reads, "Keep Off the Grass."

Hannibal said he hopes a new People's Park will grow on the large empty lot, which faces a brew pub, a popular sandwich and salad shop and a fancy lingerie store.

"This will be a place where people can go and enjoy fellowship among each other," he said.

Yesterday afternoon, about 30 people gathered in the lot, some tending small flower beds, others sitting in chairs chatting and listening to a man strumming a guitar. Hannibal said that some peo-

ple sleep in the lot at night.

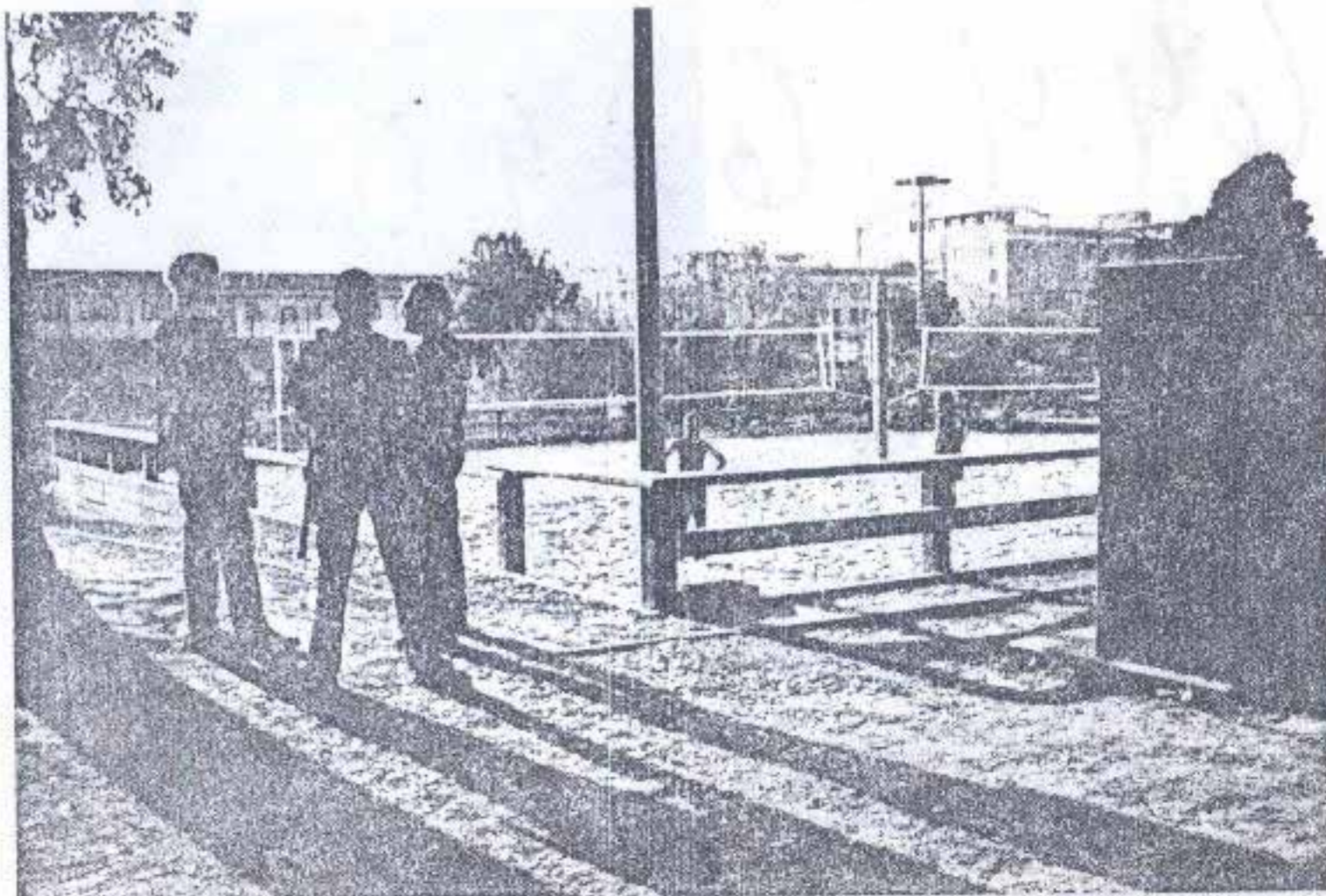
Atop a tall pile of rubble in a corner of the lot stands a wooden cross. Someone has lashed a rubber baby doll's arm to the cross and written the words "Chancellor Ten" on the wood, a reference to UC Berkeley Chancellor Chang-Lin Tien.

"It's private property," said city manager Michael Brown. "It's between the owner and the individual using it. Edgar Daine, to the best of my knowledge, has not complained."

Daine could not be reached for comment.

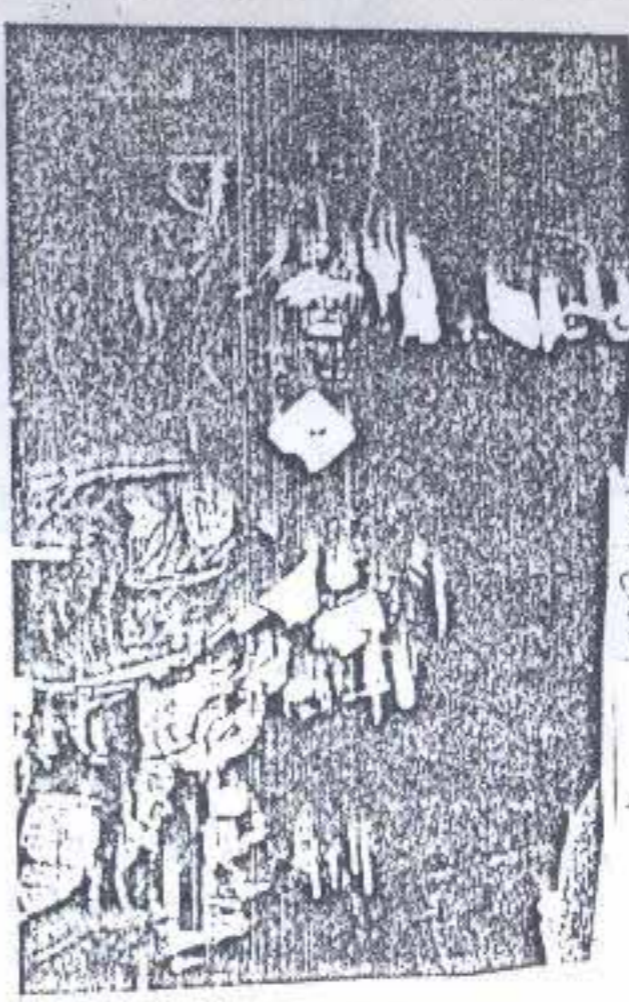
"We have had no complaints from any significant parties," said Berkeley police officer Michel de LaTouche.

The city razed the Inn last October when a fire gutted it. Earlier, an unknown actor mounted an installation of fluorescent painted television sets in the lot. Protesters tore down a fence around the lot during this summer's riots over the People's Park volleyball courts.

Berkeley Rents Could Rise by 28 Percent

By Debra Leif Holtz Chronicle Correspondent rents in Berkeley, which have kept the lowest in the Area, could climb an average 28 percent under a rate-of-increase plan filed yesterday in Alameda County Superior Court.

The Berkeley Rent Stabilization Board approved the rent increase plan Monday night to rein in landlords who, the state of Appeal ruled, have been overly denied cost-of-living increases for the past 11 years. The plan is approved by the court, the increase will be the largest since Berkeley's rent control law was enacted in 1980.

War against drugs called war against African Americans

Mothers in L.A. stand up to police terror

The U.S. government's "War on Drugs" is in reality a war against the African American community, speakers at a rally at Berkeley's Martin Luther King Jr. Park said yesterday.

The rally was the culmination of the 14th annual "Walk against Genocide" through the streets of Berkeley, a protest against what organizers call the "genocide" being waged against African Americans.

"We know that the 'war on drugs' is a disguise for a counterinsurgency against African people, designed to keep us demoralized, powerless and exploited," said Akua Njeri, a former Black Panther and President of the National People's Democratic Uluru Movement.

About 80 people, predominantly white, listened to Njeri and five other speakers call on them to "take a stand against African genocide."

The event was sponsored by the African People's Solidarity Committee, an all-white group of black power supporters founded and led by the African People's Socialist Party.

Peggy Hess, national chair of the committee, told the crowd that whites have a responsibility to fight for African American rights. The wealth and rights whites take for granted, Hess said, are based on the poverty and exploitation of African people.

said. "We've got to talk about the situation and take a stand against it." Under the United Nations definition of genocide, Hess said, the U.S. government is guilty of this crime against African Americans. This is a country, Hess said, "where black youths grow up in total poverty, where black schools don't teach, where blacks can't expect jobs, where the government puts crack cocaine in the black communities." Hess cited the country's infant mor-

tality rate as evidence, which she said is at least two times greater for blacks than whites. "That is genocide," she said. Omali Yeshitela, a leader of the black power movement since the 1960's and founder of "The Burning Spear," a national black power newspaper, told the crowd that the war on drugs is confined to poor African American communities. "There's more drugs at UC Berkeley

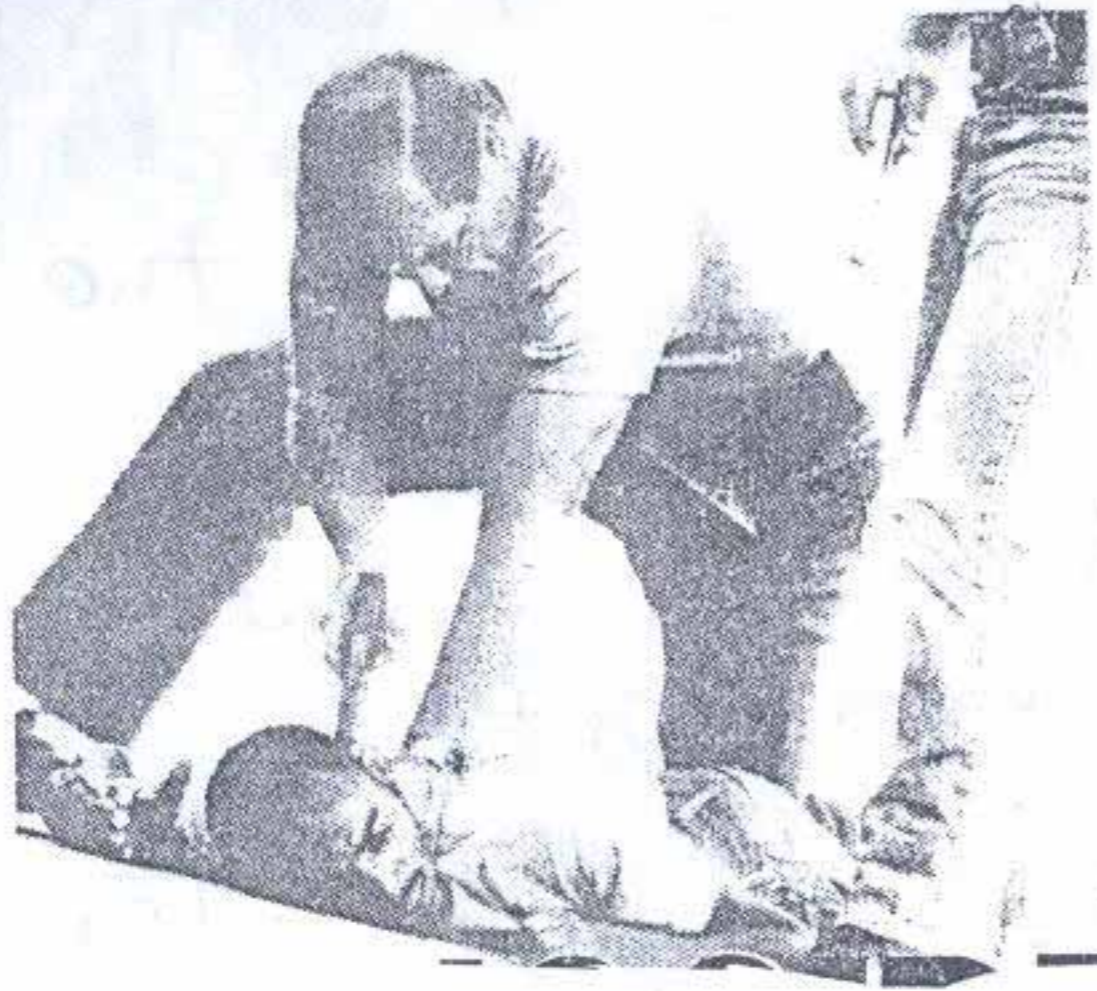

City to sue its own rent board

Council opposes hikes

The city of Berkeley will sue the rent board in an attempt to save tenants from the impending 28 percent rent increase, the city council announced Tuesday night. The Alameda County Superior Court ruled last month that the council could not intervene in the 1990 court case that precipitated the largest rent hikes in 11 years. The court ruled that since the case was closed a year ago, the council must open an entirely new suit. Later this month, a judge from the same court will hear the council's attorney argue that allowing landlords to charge their tenants 100 percent of inflation on profits for every year since 1980 flouts city and state laws. Rent board members say the city's attorney has requested a merger with an existing suit against the board's ruling in June to raise 5,000 "historically low" rents. Rent board Chair David Bryden said he welcomes this prospective "megasuit" to minimize the legal cost of multiple actions. The new lawsuit will ask the judge to consider inconsistencies between the "spirit" of the 1980 rent control ordinance and this year's 28 percent increases. Approved 6-3 by the council Oct. 8 but announced this week, the suit also charges that previous rent boards let landlords collect too much rent retroactively through the annual gross adjustment process. City Manager Michael Brown said at Tuesday's council meeting that council members forgot to announce the new suit last week because People's Park activists had taken center stage. A major impetus behind the existing suit is the rent board's failure to conduct an environmental impact review on the possibility of large-scale homelessness incited by higher rents. The rent board decided last month on the 100 percent formula, effecting an average \$90 increase for every rent controlled unit in Berkeley, as a response to a 1990 court

Bombing suspects caught again

Pair charged with breaking pub window

Two Berkeley homeless people already awaiting trial on charges of building bombs were arrested again yesterday morning in an incident involving the breaking of a window in a Telegraph Avenue pub. Andrew Barnum, 30, was arraigned yesterday afternoon in Berkeley/Albany Municipal Court on a misdemeanor charge of malicious mischief for allegedly damaging the front window of Raleighs, a restaurant and drinking establishment located at 2438 Telegraph Ave. Rosebud Denovo, 18, was arraigned on a felony charge of possessing a concealed dagger, two felony charges of assaulting a police officer and a misdemeanor charge of resisting arrest. Both pleaded innocent to the charges, although Barnum was

unable to contact his attorney. If convicted, Denovo faces a maximum penalty of \$4,000 in fines and two years in county jail. In an unrelated case, Denovo and Barnum are being prosecuted on three felony counts of possessing explosives and intending to build bombs. They are scheduled for a jury trial Oct. 23 in Alameda County Superior Court. The charges stem from the Aug. 8 discovery of a cache of explosive and incendiary materials in an illegal campsite on a hillside above UC Berkeley's Clark Kerr Campus. Along with gasoline, firecrackers, matches and glassware, university police discovered fingerprints and five notebooks which they say link the suspects to the site. The writer of the notebooks — reportedly Denovo — claims to be an anarchist and a member of the Revolutionary Communist Party, and describes the overthrow of the government through violent means.

Barnum gave his address as the "People's Park annex," a small park on the corner of Telegraph and Haste Street directly across from Raleighs. The annex was created several weeks ago when People's Park activists brought sod, flowers and benches to decorate the empty concrete lot. Increasing numbers of homeless and itinerant followers of the Grateful Dead are making the annex their home, despite complaints from the lot's owner, Didar Bains, who has asked the squatters to leave. Denovo and Barnum have often been seen in each others' company, despite advice from their lawyers that they should stay apart until the explosives charges are resolved. Judge Julie Conger set Barnum's bail at \$500. She declined to release him on his own recognizance, noting that only a week had passed since she reduced his bail on the explosive charges, facilitating his release from Santa Rita County Jail after two months of incarceration. The two are scheduled for separate pretrial hearings on Oct. 18 at 9 a.m.
