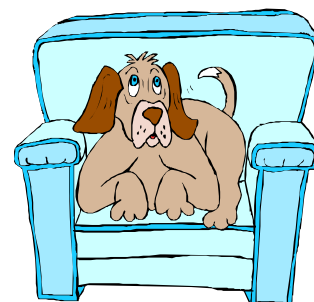

## SUMMER TIPS FOR YOUR PETS

As the weather heats up, so do our dogs. Here are a few tips to keep our dogs cool this Summer.

\* All dogs can get sunburnt but if your dog has short or white fur, or has pink/brown pigmentation, it is especially prone to sunburn. A sunscreen is a good idea for the warmer months.  
 Filtabac is a zinc-based sunscreen that has been developed especially for dogs, cats, goats & horses. It's available from vet clinics & pet shops.



\* Place your dog's kennel in a shady part of the yard. A kennel can heat up quickly if left in the sun. Shade cloths will provide extra shade for your dogs also.

\* A ceramic or pottery water bowl will keep water cooler, and a few added blocks of ice in the bowl will keep water cooler for much longer. Have more than 1 water bowl available, and make sure they can easily be reached by the dog if tied up.

\* Try not to take your dog out in the car if you really don't need to. A car can heat up rapidly in the sun and heat stroke or death can occur very quickly. If you really have to take your best friend with you make sure you have water & a bowl with you. Leave windows down enough for air to circulate. Look at fitting "Window Sox's" to the back windows - available at car accessory shops.

\* Keep an eye on your pet around the pool. Not all dogs are natural swimmers, or they may get caught up in pool covers left on top.

\* Walk your dog only at the coolest part of the day.

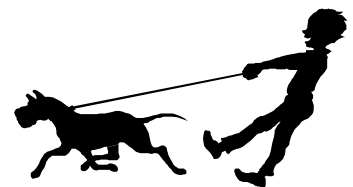

### Dog Owners 10 Commandments

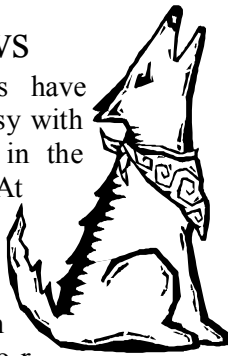
1. My life is likely to last 10 to 15 years. Remember that before you buy me.

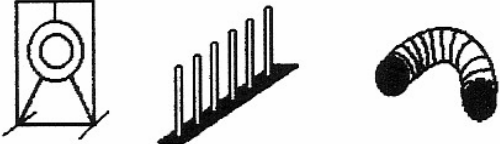
