My son John Hagan 200 acres to be laid of adjoining Joseph Watters and to include the plantation he now lives on.

My son William Hagan the Plantation that Wm Tench Jr., now lives on 100 acres.

My daughter Martha Hagan, daughter Aloysia Hagan, 2 rooms in my house during their single life, also some land I bought of Wm. Boarman, which the Chapple now stands on, which being by deed, 60 acres, and after their death or marriage to my son Joseph Hagan, he to also have the plantation I now live on.

To my son Wm Hagan, 2 slaves.

To my daughter Elizabeth Hagan, and daughter Monica Hagan who is gone beyond the sea, £25 sterling money. 50 shilings currency or the value of that money to the poor.

My son in law Joshua Mills Executor, and if he is deceased at that time, I appoint friend Joshua Sanders.

I give to my children hereafter named; viz.; John, Wm., Martha Joseph, Aloysia and 3 grand children that my daughter Mary Ann Mills deceased left the 3 grand children to have one part which being sixth part all remaining part of my personal estate. Nov 19- 1771

Wit: TS Bowling, John Bowling, Joseph Lancaster

Codicil: Since the above will my daughter Aloysia Hagan is married. I do ordain that whatever I have let to my above mentioned daughter Martha Hagan be put in care of my son in law William and my daughter Aloysia Coomes in order to provide for my daughter Martha Hagan. June 6- 1772.

Wit: Joseph Lancaster, & Thomas and Francis Bowling

[The following was written on the back of the foregoing codicil:] 3rd of Aug 1772 came William Bowling - Joseph Bowling and Joseph Lancaster the witnesses, and said they saw Wm Hagan sign the will and codicil.

¹⁵The Hansons were a prominent Protestant family in Charles Co. John Hanson, progenitor in America was perhaps the son of Sir Robert Hanson of London, born sometime before 1754. He and his wife Mary had seven children: Robert, Benjamin, Mary, Anne, Sarah, John, and Samuel. John, Jr. married a Catholic, Elizabeth Hussey, d/o Judge Thomas Hussey and his second wife Joan, and from them the Catholic branch of the family descends; Thomas Hussey was s/o John Hussey of Harby in County Lincoln, England.

John and Elizabeth (Hussey) Hanson had four children: John (m Elizabeth Massey), Elizabeth (m Leonard Wheeler), Mary (m Wm Clements) and Eleanor who married William Hagan.

The most famous of the family was the John Hanson son of Samuel and Elizabeth (Story) Hanson: b 13 Apr 1721, d 22 Nov 1783. He served as president of the Continental Congress at the end of the Revolutionary war and received Washington after the surrender of Cornwallis. His state is in statuary hall in the US Capitol. This John Hanson married Jane Contee of Prince George Co. Their son and grandson, both called Alexander Contee Hanson, are famous in their own right.

"Catholic Training for Maryland Catholics 1773-1786 by Rev Joseph T Durkin, SJ in *Historical Records and Studies*, vol. 32 (1941) 70-82. The article contains five letters are from the Archives of Maryland-NewYork Province S.J., Nos 202 C i, ii, iii, iv, v which were sent to Fr. John Bolton, SJ, the Maryland superior.

The first letter of 27 Jun 1773 was posted from Liege by Elizabeth Clare and Monica Clare and thanks Fr. John Bolton, SJ, for news of their father's death. They also say: "Please to tell all friends that our Sr. Therese at paris is well and desire[s] to be kindly remembered to them all in particular. She says she does not think of writing this year. For our Sr. [Marianne] at Cambray we have not heard from her of some time, but hope she is well.

The second letter, dated 11 Feb 1783, is also written by Elizabeth Clare and Monica Clare but this time "from Rouen." It mentions the death of their brother who would be John. Mostly the letter deals with their niece Monica and the possibility of her religious vocation. They also mention other Maryland women, seemingly, who are members of their community: Sister Edelin, "our Dispensere," and Sister Spalding who "is now Rev. Mother Vicaris." mentions the death of their brother [i.e. John].

The third letter signed only by Monica 10 June 1785 with no place name given. She speaks of her nephew Joseph who is thinking of a religious vocation. Niece Monica has decided against a religious vocation by this time.

For letters four and five, see below under "Henny," Mother Theresa, who wrote letters four and five.

In the letters she mentions her "Bro. Mills" her neice and godchild Mary Ann Teresa Mills, "Bro. William," neices "[S?]ally Garner & her Str. M. Ann T. Mills," her "Str. patty," Str. Ally and Brother Coomes, "Prioress Mo. Mary Mag Johnson," Bro. Joseph, Str Eliz. Clare, Str. Monica, Str. Marianne at Cambray.

At one point, she talks about here monastery: "I must tell you Sir that I think if I had been to chouse of all the convents in France I could not have found any one so much to my great satisfaction as this wch I am in. The great union & charity which [are] found in the community I bless almighty God still reigns more & more in our house. We can take no one to pension with us whoever, very little going to ye grates & many other things wch I omitt mentioning not knowing what hands my letter may fall into before it arrives to yours." Anno Domini 1816 October 28th Departed this life our dear religious sister. Rev^d Mother Teresa Hagan of the sacred hearts of Jesus & Mary--Subprioress and Jubilarian. This dear mother was a Native of Maryland.

"She exercised the office of Subprioress during twenty or thirty years, and with great zeal in every way that her weak health enabled her to do. She was a most venerable saintly Religious, exact to the very moment in all her duties; her spirit of Prayer, and constant union of her soul with God, was the divine source from which she drew all her strength, hence she was always serene, and the bright example of every virtue. She exercised the Office of Mistress of Juniors for many years until her happy death which took place in the 80th year of her Age. Requiescat in Pace."

The 1820 Census of Nelson Co. shows two Robert Hagans; because of damage to the rolls, the first shows only 1 female 16-18 yrs old, and one slave; presumably there must have been a man about the same age as the woman. In the record for second Robert, the list of females is also damaged; still it shows: males: 1 26-45, 2 16-26, 1 16-18, 1 10-16, 5 less than 10; females: 1 26-45, ? 16-26, ? 10-16, 1 less than 10, and 14 slaves. The record for the 1830 census continues to show only two Roberts, seemingly the same two. The second shows: 1 male 50-60, 1 male 15-20, 2m 10-15, 2 m 5-10, 1 m less than five; in the second row which records females and free blacks, it shows 1 person 50-60, 2 people 15-20. The Tax Lists of 1820 and 1825 list two Roberts. One is listed with Bazell and Walter, both of whom are located on Fromans Creek. The second Robert has two plots, 241 A. (2nd rate) and 230 A. (3rd rate) located on the Beech Fork and another plot of 1000 A. (3rd rate) in Pendleton Co. on Lick Creek.
