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<sup>80</sup> There is a James Hagan named as "brother" by John Bowling of Calvert Co. in his will of 1711. Witnesses of the will include both James and Thomas Hagan. Land in the will is found both in St. Mary's and Charles Counties. *Maryland Calendar of Wills*, v. ?, p 201-2, 208. How is he "brother" to John Bowling?

<sup>81</sup> James Hagan made a deposition on "this last day of Nov. anno Dmi 1714" concerning a tract of 600 acres touching good Intent [a tract belong to James according to the deposition of Thomas Hagan made on the same day; cf. Thomas (AD). Page 99 [of what?]

James Hagan made a deposition on Mar 14, 1737, "aged sixty-six years or thereabouts who being sworn on the Holy Evangelists declares that Mr. Richard Edelen about forty years ago then Surveyor of Charles County told him that an old Chestnut Tree (now down) which this Deponent stands by was the Second bound tree of a tract of land called Wardle. [He also swears to the first boundary tree.] PG 428-429. A second deposition made on Nov 13, 1748 gives his age as seventy-four. Page 701 [of what?]

Deposition May 19, 1747 by James Hagan "Planter", age 76 saying he knew both Allen David and Charles Craycroft. Page 300 [of what?; the deposition continues to the next page which I did not see.]

Grandson Edward and wife Elizabeth, exec. Wit: Wm., Ign., James. Probated: Wm. Hagan, Jr. heir at law did not object.

Miss Martha Hagan, daughter of William Hagan and his wife, Mary Price, of Maryland, was clothed on September 14, 1763 and professed September 29, 1764. Her Name in religion was Mother Mary Joanna Regis. She died December 31, 1791, aged fifty-eight. Her dowry was £150 sterling.

Durkin, SJ, "Catholic Training for Maryland Catholics 1773-1786 in *Historical Records and Studies*, vol. 32 (1941) 70-82 on p 70: A certain Martha Hagan travelled with Marianne Hagan according to the Letter Book of Father John Hunter, Jesuit superior of MD; cf. "Educational Convoys to Europe in the Olden Times," by Thomas Hughes, SJ, *American Ecclesiastical Review* 29 (1903) 24-39, esp 27, 30. Martha's dowry was £150. According to Br. Thomas Spalding, CFX, this Martha may have first entered the Carmelites before joining the Sepulchreines at Liege; "Natives of Maryland in Religious Houses and Seminaries Abroad from 1684-1788," compiled by Br. Thomas W. Spalding, CFX, Appendix A in *The Jesuit Missions of St. Mary's County, MD*, by Edwin W. Beitzell (2nd edition: 1976).

Miss Elizabeth Hagan, sister to Martha Hagan [daughters of William Hagan and Mary Price; cf note above], was clothed June 7 1769, and professed June 8, 1770. Her name in religion was Mother Mary Longina. She died January 26, 1778, aged thirty-seven. She had for dowry £300 sterling.
