BOONE FAMILY ¹

The Boone Family of Taunton, County Somerset, England in all probability was the progenitor family of the Boones of Calvert Co. MD. A John Boone was listed on the court rolls of County Somerset in 1591 as a land holder in the Hundred of Holleway. He was church warden in 1612 and was married to Alice Wheeler. They had three known sons:

Presumably he settled in what was then Calvert County (Later Prince Geor. Co., Md.), for in a deed dated Mar 15 1695, Chas. Beaven of Calvert County patents 600 acres of "Hickory Thickett", which lay on "The North Branch of the Patuxent River about two miles above the mouth of the Branch called 'Horsepar Branch' — this tract was originally granted to Col. Richard Marsham and by him conveyed to Charles Beaven. Charles Beaven had married Mary Marsham, d/o Col. Richard Marsham; the date of their marriage is not know definitely but was near 1683-85. (The records of this survey and patent is found in Liber IB #9, f. 360 and L. IB # 10 f. 527 of Charles Co. The land lay on "the Coach Road upon the levels."

Charles Beaven died at his Plantation in Prince George's county in 1699, leaving a widow, two sons and four daughters. By his Will, he left his Plantation "Hargrove" ("where I now live") and the land which adjoined it, to his wife Mary for her lifetime, then to his eldest son, Richard.

Charles Beaven, II, his second son, and daughters, Sarah (who married Thomas Blandford) and Margaret, who was unmarried, each received 200 acres of "Hickory Thickett" in Charles Co. His younger daughters, Eleanor and Katherine, received personalty.

Mary Marsham Beaven died in 1713. She named her brother, "My well-beloved Richard Marsham, executor of all my realle, and personal Estate." His will was witnessed by Thomas and Sarah Blandford, her son-in-law and daughter.

Note: Calvert County was erected in 1654; Charles County in 1658. Prince Georges County was formed out of Charles county in 1695. The Beavens did not move from County to County; they held the same lands but the County boundaries were changed. "Hickory Thickett" was first part of Clavert County; it lay on the west side of the Patuxent River, which became Charles County some years later. *It is doubtful IF the word "brother" is in this Will which was "on a piece of paper" but should have been her "father" instead.

Prince Georges Co. Warrants; Liber AA f. 222, dated 13 Feb 1713:

Whereas Charles Beavan and Mary, his wife, William Elder (Sr) and Elizabeth his wife, of PG Co., have set forth that they are seized in fee simple of and in a certain tract of land lying in the said County, called "Beale" Good Will ... originally ...granted on Thos. Laramore and by him sold to Guy Finch, late of sd County, dec'd, whose daughters and co-heiresses the said Mary and Elizabeth are ...

Prince George Co. Land Records: Book T, f. 560:

"Deed made Jan. 7, 1736 between 2m. Elder (Jr), PG Co., and Charles Beavin for 60 lbs. sterling and 20lbs Bills of Credit, land wherefo he is now possessed, called "Good Will, 100 A.; Ann, wife of 2m. Elder waived."

Note: Many researches claim that Chas. Beaven, II s/o Chas. I, died in 1718 and had a son who died in 1785; however, Richard's son, Charles, would have been too young to be married in 1713 and this Charles was still alive in 3/27/1764 when 2m. Elder sold another small portion of Good Will to him (Bk TT, f. 374). Chas. Beaven made a deposition in 1748 saying that he was born in 1683; he died in 1782 (or 1785) testate.
