### PART I: PEOPLE NAMED HAGAN IN MARYLAND

From PW Coldham's *The Complete Book of Emigrants*, p 335: Administration granted in the Perogative Court of Canterbury England in 1656 for Briant Hagan, bachelor who died at Jamaica.

The second parcel of 40 acres had been purchased of Thomas Simpson on March 9, 1695/6 and was bounded on a oak of Andrew Simpson which stood between the land of the said Andrew Simpson and Mr. Thomas Clark, and the third portion of 50 acres adjoined the dwelling plantation of Robert Hagan, Sr., which was a moiety of the 100 acres of "St. George's" which had been given by Thomas Simpson to his son Andrew Simpson by deed of January 10 1699/1700. Both Robert, Sr., and Robert, Jr., signed the deed of conveyance to Richard Edelen, but Elizabeth Hagan made her mark. *Maryland Semmes and Kindred Families*, 169.

According to Martha S. Pikell's manuscript, this Robert Hagan "became the progenitor of the St. Mary's County Hagers." It has been suggested that he is the son of Thomas Sr., but he is not named in the will of Thomas, Sr.

PART II: BENNET HAGAN LINE

II. Magdalen Hagon      Some argue that she was the second wife of Ignatius (AC), but none of the children mentioned in her will are mentioned in the will of Ignatius. Furthermore the land which that Magdalen receives from Ignatius is designated for other children named in the will after her death and not to the children named in this will.

Was she perhaps married to William s/o Ignatius (ACA) or James Hagan (ABAA) since no wife has been located for either? There is also a Nathaniel Hagan who takes the oath of fidelity in 1778 in Charles Co. MD; the name Nathaniel appears later in this line.

In her will of 23 Feb 1776, probated 23 Feb 1776 in Charles Co., Magdalen Hagon names as her sons Bennet and Leonard, and daughters Charity Beavan and Rebecca Montgomery. She gives her children slaves and household furnishings but makes no mention of land unless it is part of her "estate" which is to be divided equally. Exec: Leonard and Bennet Hagan. Wit: Clement Mudd and Clement Gardiner<sup>266</sup>

No Robert Hagan is listed in the 1810 census of Nelson Co. The Census of 1820 lists two Robert Hagan, the other being the husband of Christine Dyer (cf., above under AA. William). The census is damaged and lists only one female 16-26; the damaged section must have listed a man, i.e. Robert. The census clearly shows no children up to the age of 16. The 1830 census again lists but two Roberts, seemingly the same two. The household of the younger Robert lists: males, 1 30-40, 1 5-10; females/free blacks: 1 60-70, 1 30-40, 1 5-10, 2 0-5.
