

“WHO AM I” POWERPOINT ASSIGNMENT

This is your major assignment in PowerPoint. You will show your presentation to a group of your classmates (randomly selected) and they will peer evaluate your work using the Electronic Presentation Rubric on the attached sheet. Your teacher will also mark your assignment.

Assignment Requirements:

- ⇒ create an 8 to 10 (**minimum**) slide PowerPoint presentation about yourself. The first slide should be a title slide, “Who Am I”, with your name beneath the title
- ⇒ use a different slide for each component of your life, e.g., Personal Information, Family, Personal Interests, Favourite CDs, School Life, etc.
- ⇒ use a template for all slides
- ⇒ include transitions and animations
- ⇒ include **at least two** pictures,
 - ⇒ one must be a self portrait drawn in Paint (16 colour maximum and **Copy & Paste** to save space on G:\BTT\PPT)
 - ⇒ one must be a photograph taken with the digital camera
- ⇒ include appropriate clipart
- ⇒ incorporate a table or family tree or a graph (do not use the organization chart)
- ⇒ perhaps incorporate songs from a favourite CD
- ⇒ **Be creative! Be professional! Be appropriate!**
- ⇒ Print the final version, 6 slides per page (handouts), pure black and white.
- ⇒ Save this assignment in G:\BTT\PPT as Who Am I.
