

# THE NEW FACE OF LIVINGSTON HIGH SCHOOL: Meeting the needs of our growing student body



There has been a 32% increase in student population at Livingston High School since the 1990-1991 school year.

By 2008-2009, this increase is estimated to be 44%.

By 2013-2014, it is estimated to be 67%.

1,586 students currently attend Livingston High School, which has a functional capacity—a State-derived measure of square feet per student—of 1,413 students.

- This project will resolve overcrowding and lack of adequate space while meeting our students' academic and co-curricular needs in the 21st century and addressing security, parking, and other space issues.
- The proposed construction project will add approximately 95,000 new square feet to Livingston High School and renovate about 68,000 square feet.
- It will provide a state of the art science wing, a robotics lab, additional classrooms in every department, a new gymnasium with physical education stations and team rooms, a second TV studio and an expanded student cafeteria.
- Estimated cost: \$51.5 million. Estimated time line: 24-30 months.
- The referendum could take place as soon as December.
